

New work to detect semiconductor MoS2

A researcher in the Department of Physics and Astronomy and colleagues have developed a new technique to noninvasively detect the orientation of MoS2 crystals. MoS2, a layered, black crystalline material with many similarities to graphene, also possesses a band gap that qualifies it for applications as a semiconductor and as a material for a new generation of flexible electronics.
