Gettysburg 150 at the Dole Institute

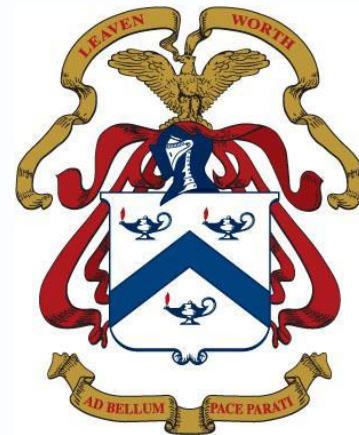


Ft. Leavenworth Series
