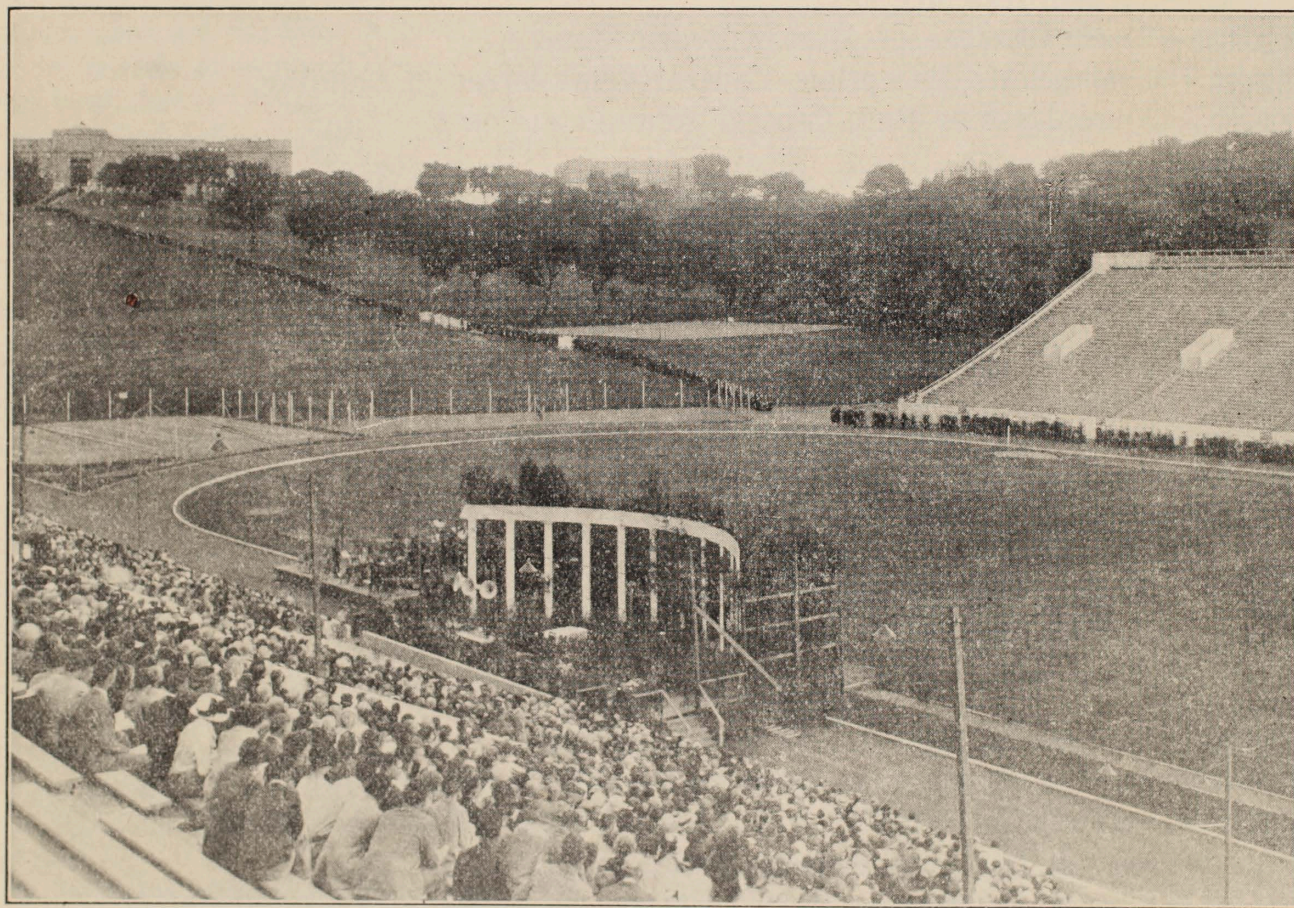

Spooner-Thayer Art Museum

THE larger part of the Thayer Art Collection, given to the University by the late Mrs. W. B. Thayer, of Kansas City, Missouri, has been installed in the building formerly called Spooner Library. In the main room on the first floor will be found collections of oriental objects; also pewter, brass, silver, textiles, old Delft, Malolica and some finely modeled figures. In the east room are cases of glass and china. The small room on the north contains a choice library of books on art, history and travel. In the room on the south are pieces of Colonial furniture.

Upstairs are the picture galleries. In the small room on the north side of the hall is a collection of old musical instruments, including a Broadwood piano of about 1790. The small room on the south contains several pieces of Puritan furniture, spinning wheels and some hand woven fabrics.

The basement room, in which the American Indian collection will be permanently installed next fall, contains a very interesting collection of India and Paisley shawls.

Dyche Museum

Dyche Museum houses one of the most complete and elaborate museums of mammals and birds of its kind in any college museum in America, and consists of forty-five family groups of North American mammals in their natural surroundings in panorama form. The twenty-five hundred mounted birds form a small part of the bird collection. In fact, the bulk of all the museum material, including reptiles, fishes, skulls, skeletons, and skins, is not on exhibit, but is available for study and will be shown upon request.

The Paleontological Museum on the third floor contains one of the finest collections of vertebrate fossils west of the Mississippi, and the best aggregation of Kansas fossils in the world. The fossil fishes and huge reptiles from the chalk beds of western Kansas are exceptionally good. A collection of bat-like reptiles, with a wing stretch of twenty feet or more is very complete, and the second finest in the world. The collection of mammals is a representative collection from the principal bone beds of the United States, supplemented with a very valuable addition from the Santa Cruz beds of Patagonia, South America. Many of the most interesting specimens including bugs, fossil reptiles, great flying lizards, toothed birds, and large extinct fishes, come from Kansas. In the north room is shown a large case of war implements and utensils of great interest from the Belgian-Congo of South Africa.

Two of the finest collections of Kansas Indian material are shown in the north room, third floor. These are the Dr. R. S. Dinsmore collection from Troy, Kansas, and the G. U. S. Hovey collection from Whitechurch, Kansas. A large map of the Arctic Regions, tracing in colored lines the routes taken by every explorer from the first down to Peary, a gift to the University from Mr. W. H. Sears, is on display on the Bird floor of the Museum.

Watson Library

The library building, now fully equipped and in use, will be open for inspection on Sunday afternoon, 2-5. Exhibits will include: rare books (including presentation copies, autographs and book plates); early University publications and items of historical interest; the clock presented to the University by the class of 1922; art books presented to the University by the Class of 1890. You are invited to visit the browsing room in the east end of the main reading room.

Classical Museum, Fraser Hall

The Classical Museum in the south corridor of the second floor of Fraser will be open throughout the Commencement season. It contains a number of full size casts of sculpture and some 300 framed photographs of Greek and Roman sculpture, architecture and painting.

The aim of the museum is to make more vivid the life of ancient times by showing in form and picture the objects which surrounded the ancient peoples, and to cultivate the taste of the students by bringing before them some admirable objects of ancient art.

Chemistry and Pharmacy Building

The members of the Faculties of the Departments of Chemistry and Pharmacy will be at home to all students of the departments, past and present, and their friends at the Chemistry Laboratory on Sunday afternoon, 2-5. Typical apparatus will be on exhibition, and the new liquid air machine which has recently been installed, replacing the historic first machine in use for over 21 years, will be in operation. An exhibit of student work in the School of Pharmacy will be on display in Room 111. Open Sunday *only*, 2-5 p. m.

Fine Arts, Administration Building

Department of Painting, East Administration

The annual exhibition of student work done in the Department of Painting will be hung in the galleries of the third floor of the Administration Building, and 301 and 303 North Corridor. The exhibition is composed of charcoal drawings from the antique, still life arrangements, portraits in oil, life drawings, and compositions and sketches in various mediums.

The Brynwood Loan Collection of paintings, numbering some fifty valuable canvases owned by Brynton and Chester Woodward, including examples of George Innes, Bruce Crane, Charles Davis, Charles Partridge Adams, H. W. Mesdag, and others, will be open to visitors in room 305, North Corridor, daily (except Sunday) from 9 to 5.

Department of Design, West Administration

The exhibition of the Department of Design, in rooms 300 to 307, West Administration, third floor, includes designs for textile fabrics, rugs, original drawing of campus map, nature drawings, black and white work for purposes of illustration, plates on colour theory, posters and greeting cards. There are also shown the first three of a series of twelve mural decorations to be used in the children's ward of Bell Memorial Hospital in Kansas City, Kansas.

The craft work shown includes bookbindings in cloth and leather, gesso, beaten metal work, jewelry, leather tooling, and hand decorated fabrics in batik. Clay modeling includes vases, candlesticks, and various other pottery forms.

Engineering, Marvin Hall

The various engineering laboratories will be open to visitors on Sunday afternoon, 2-5. The visitor should probably first reach Haworth Hall, where the mining laboratory may be seen. Further west, and just beyond the new auditorium, is Marvin Hall, which is the main engineering building. Architectural exhibits may be seen on the third floor of this building. On the first floor, an industrial exhibit will be on display. In the basement are the civil, applied mechanics, and state water laboratories. Behind Marvin Hall, in a separate building, are the electrical, mechanical, hydraulic, and automotive laboratories.

The University's broadcasting station, KFKU, is usually of much interest to visitors of the engineering laboratories. This may be seen in room 12, electrical laboratory.

The industrial exhibit, on the first floor of Marvin Hall, consists of contributions from about one hundred of the leading manufacturers of the state. It is a notable showing which will surprise many who have not realized to what extent Kansas is producing manufactured goods.

Geological and Invertebrate Paleontological Collection, Haworth Hall

The seismograph, an instrument for recording earthquakes, is in a glass case beneath the stairway to the first floor.

An unusually fine collection of rocks, minerals and invertebrate fossils is on display in the Haworth Hall Museum, first floor. The rocks and minerals show not only the important ores but a large number of scientifically classified varieties from all parts of the world. The mineral resources of Kansas are indicated by special exhibits. Models of oil fields show the structure and conditions underground. Various geologic and topographic relief models, and large diagrams showing the surface and underground formations in Kansas and in the United States are in the hall on the second floor.

Union Building and Auditorium

The Kansas Union Building and the new Auditorium, now under construction, will be open for inspection Sunday.
