

Seventy-Seventh Annual Commencement T O GRADUATES of 1949: This is your Commencement. Your enthusiastic cooperation will help to make it more significant.

Seniors not receiving degrees at this Commencement, but who can complete the requirements for their degrees without re-enrolling at the University in the Fall semester of 1949 or a later term, may participate, provided they pay the Commencement fee and senior class dues.

All candidates for degrees in June who are doing work in residence in the Spring of 1949 are required to attend Commencement unless excused by the Chancellor.

IN PREPARATION FOR COMMENCEMENT

1. Obtain your cap and gown Saturday, June 4, 10:00 a.m. to 5 p.m., or Sunday, June 5, 3:00 to 5:00 p.m., at Strong Hall Annex A (quonset hut) west door by presentation of receipt for senior dues, which are paid at Business Office. This is important.

2. At time of obtaining cap and gown be sure to ask for family tickets for Commencement exercises (no charge). These will not be needed if good weather prevails so that exercises may be held in the Stadium. However, if it becomes necessary to hold Commencement exercises in Hoch Auditorium, these family tickets will be absolutely the only means of admission for parents or other family members. Each senior is limited to two. Space will be reserved for holders of these tickets until 7:50 p.m.

3. Tickets to the senior luncheon to be held Monday noon, June 6, 12:30 p.m. at Hoch Auditorium, will be issued to class members without charge at the place where caps and gowns are issued in Strong Hall Annex A on Saturday, June 4, 10:00 a.m.-5:00 p.m., and Sunday, June 5, 3:00 p.m.-5:00 p.m. Each graduating senior is entitled to one ticket, for his own use, on presentation of his senior dues receipt. Each class member may buy as many tickets for family members and friends as desired. Charge: 75 cents each. To help the Commencement committee in planning attendance it will be appreciated if class members will purchase extra tickets for family members in advance, at alumni office, 226 Strong Hall, or Dean of Men's Office, 228 Strong Hall, during week of May 30 to June 3, inclusive. When cap and gown headquarters opens at 10:00 a.m., June 4, in Strong Hall Annex A, purchase all tickets there.

4. Payment of senior dues and diploma fee both can be made at the same time at the University business office. The diploma fee should be paid by May 15.

5. For direction in obtaining lodging for family members during Commencement, see Mrs. Bert Nash, Room 220, Strong Hall.

COMMENCEMENT DAY

1. Wear your cap and gown to the Class Luncheon, and the Baccalaureate as well as to the Commencement exercises.

2. For the procession for both the Baccalaureate and Commencement exercises, be on hand in the east corridor of Strong Hall at 7:00 p.m., Sunday and Monday evenings, regardless of the weather. Wraps may be left in class room near the east entrance (first floor) where they will be guarded until after program.

3. In case of stormy weather on either occasion, the marshals will give instructions for proceeding immediately to Hoch Auditorium, where wraps may be checked with attendants in the anterooms at the rear of the building. In this case, do not don cap and gown until you have reached the Auditorium; protect these garments from moisture.

4. Check in your cap and gown at Strong Hall Annex A (quonset hut), entrance at west door, immediately after the exercises, and get your receipt. Then go immediately to the rotunda of Strong Hall for your diploma, presenting in exchange for it your signed diploma ticket, which you received with your dummy diploma) and your cap and gown receipt. You will save time and effort by picking up your diploma on Monday night, immediately after Commencement.

A penalty of 50 cents a day up to a maximum of \$2.50 will be assessed if cap and gown are not returned by Tuesday noon, June 7.

5. You are especially cautioned by the manufacturers not to store diplomas in cedar chests. There is enough of the moth-killing aromatic oil in the average cedar chest to soften inks of any kind, resulting in serious damage to a diploma stored in it.

ABOUT THE PROCESSION

- (a) The marshals know the marching order. Comply with their requests promptly. They will appreciate your cooperation.
- (b) If you have a friend with whom you would sit, that friend should be in the same line with you—before or behind you—not beside you in the procession.
- (c) Wear the caps into the Stadium or Auditorium. The men remove their caps when the signal is given to be seated.
- (d) Until the time of the conferring of your degree, wear the tassel on your cap to the front, right.

Tickets for graduating seniors will be issued (no charge) in Strong Hall Annex A, Saturday, June 4, 10:00 a.m.-5:00 p.m., and Sunday, June 5, 3:00 p.m.-5:00 p.m. Extra tickets for family members should be purchased previous week if possible at Alumni Office at 75 cents each.

- (e) Upon the conferring of the degree, you will please rise when the dean of your schools presents your name to the Chancellor (men replacing their caps), and as you leave the platform transfer the tassel to the front, left. Do not bring parcels, hand bags, etc., to the Commencement exercises. You cannot carry them across the stage, and you will not return to the same seat.
- (f) As you return to your seat after the conferring of the degree, you will be handed a diploma ticket, to be used later. (The diploma given to you on the platform will of course be a dummy.) Keep this ticket.
- (g) Do not chew gum during the procession or program.
- (h) Do's and Don'ts about your clothes: Do not wear white shoes; persons receiving Master's degrees will have short sleeved gowns and, therefore, should not wear white coat or shirt sleeves; women check out white collars for their gowns.



A Growing Campus Serves A Growing Community



The post-war building program of the University of Kansas, nearing completion or authorized, involves more than \$10 million of construction on the Mount Oread and Medical Center campuses.

At Lawrence the New Fowler Shops (at west end of campus, for engineering shop practice), two additions to Watson Library and major improvements in the power plant are nearing completion at a cost of almost \$1 million.

Legislative appropriations of \$3.6 million

have been made for remodeling Old Fowler Shops for the William Allen White School of Journalism, a large physical sciences building, a women's dormitory (construction started north of Corbin Hall), and a "starter" for a fieldhouse. The K.U. World War II Memorial Association will spend approximately \$350,000 for a campanile and campus parkway. The K.U. Endowment Association has on hand approximately \$400,000 to build scholarship residence halls.

For the Medical Center in Kansas City the

legislature authorized an expansion program totaling \$3,862,000. Now being completed is an enlarged surgical section at a cost of more than \$900,000. Additional aid from the federal government for hospital facilities will bring the building program at Kansas City to more than \$5 million.

On the above map permanent university buildings and a portion of the dormitory system are shown in black. Fifteen surplus army buildings and quonsets are in outline, as are many of the organized houses for students.
