

The University of Kansas has 10 Schools, 69 Departments and 14 Divisions. • 650 full-time faculty teach 1.743 courses in 100 major areas of study, leading to many bachelor's degrees, 10 master's degrees, and the Ph.D., Doctor of Education, and Doctor of Medicine. • The library has 1 million volumes with 50,000 added annually. • K.U. is one of 39 members of the Association of American Universities whose members award 80% of the nation's doctoral degrees. It is among the top dozen universities in undergraduate education, based on the records of seniors in winning fellowships and other alumni achievements. • 58,927 degrees have been awarded since founding in 1866. • The 18,500 paid members of the Alumni Association make it one of the largest. • The K.U. Endowment Association has a book value of \$12 million. The Greater University Fund (annual giving) received \$365,-000 last year. • Museum of Natural History has the nation's longest continuous panorama of North American life zones. • Museum of Art has 6,000 objects valued at \$1,300,000. • Lawrence campus has 850 acres, nearly all from gifts; 75 buildings, more than half provided by private support. Replacement value is \$75 million. • No state tax funds are in Scholarship and Loan programs affecting one of every three students, with 1,500 scholarships worth \$750,000 and 4,500 loans totaling \$1 million annually. • Operating budget of \$34.3 million is financed 8.7% by student fees, 45.9% state appropriations, and 19.2% grants and sponsored research. • Four auditoriums and theaters: Hoch Auditorium (3,800), University Theater (1,200), Swarthout Recital Hall (400), Experimental Theater (88). • Athletic facilities: Memorial Stadium (44,800), Allen Field House (17,000). Athletic teams are the Jayhawkers; colors are crimson and blue. • Housing: 27 Fraternities (1,500), 13 Sororities (700), 9 Residence Halls (3,450), 9 Scholarship Halls (250 men, 200 women). 300 apartments for married students. • Fees are \$122 a semester for Kansans. \$287 for nonresidents. • Board of Regents of nine members governs six state institutions of higher education. Dr. W. Clarke Wescoe is Chancellor (president) of the University of Kansas. • Student body of 12,486 includes 8,068 men, 4,418 women; 11,441 on the Lawrence campus, 1,045 at K.U. Medical Center in Kansas City; 8,964 undergraduates, 3,522 above the bachelor's degree. Sponsored research at K.U. is \$71/2 million annually. International programs include Junior Year in Costa Rica and summer language institutes in Spain, France, Germany, and Finland.
