ATTENTION GRADUATE STUDENTS IN THE BEHAVIORAL SCIENCES:

The Cornell Journal of Social Relations has been established to provide a publication outlet for works by young scholars in the various subject matter fields of social relations and general behavioral science. The Journal began publication in March 1966 and is published bi-annually at Ithaca, New York. The editors of the Journal would like to call this publication outlet to your attention and would like to urge you to submit your manuscripts to us.

The Journal can offer:

- (1) early publication and no substantial publication lag; therefore, we would be a desirable outlet for the publication of early research results;
- (2) no already established prejudices regarding what kind of material is suitable; hence, we can provide an outlet for articles which do not fit the subject preferences of already established journals in individual fields The <u>Journal</u> prefers theoretical articles or articles which report research results (even if based only on pilot research) rather than articles which have an applied focus. The <u>Journal</u> gives preference in publication to articles submitted by graduate students (or jointly by graduate students and faculty) at any university. The <u>Cornell Journal of Social Relations</u> is abstracted in <u>Psychological Abstracts</u> and Sociological Abstracts.

The editorial board of the <u>Journal</u> is composed of graduate student editors in each of the sponsoring units and departments at Cornell University, each departmental editorial staff under the direction of a Cornell faculty advisor. Sponsoring units within Cornell University and faculty advisers are: the Departments of Anthropology (Prof. Robert J. Smith); Psychology (Prof. William W. Lambert); Sociology (Prof. Leo Meltzer); Rural Sociology (Prof. Philip Taietz); the School of Child Development and Family Relationships (Prof. Edward C. Devereaux) and the School of Industrial and Labor Relations (Prof. Jay Schulman).

In general, manuscripts should be under 25 pages (double spaced) in length and should follow the format of the American Psychological Association's <u>Publication Manual</u>. Manuscripts should be submitted to the address given above. The deadline for submission for the March issue is January 31, and the deadline for the October issue is August 31.

We would also like to note that subscriptions to the <u>Cornell Journal of Social Relations</u> are available to students at the reduced rate of \$2 yearly. (If your University library has not already subscribed, may we suggest that you ask them to consider subscribing at our regular price of \$3 for the yearly volume?)
