

SANDRA L. ALBRECHT is an Assistant Professor of Sociology at the University of Kansas. Her major area of interest is the sociology of work. His primary areas of interest include sociology of work, complex organization, social stratification, sociology of labor markets, and sociology of education.

ERNEST MANDEL, born in 1923, received his Ph.D. at the Free University of Berlin. He has been a lecturer at the Vrije Universiteit Brussel since 1971 and professor since 1982. He was a member of the Economic Studies Commission of the Belgian Trade-Union Federation (FGTB) from 1954-1962 and has been a member of the Fourth International for 40 years, since 1946 as a member of its central leadership. He is the author of a number of books including Marxist Economic Theory (1962); The Formation of the Economic Thought of Karl Marx (1967); Late Capitalism (1972); Trotsky: A Study of the Dynamic of His Thought (1979); The Long Waves in the Development of Capitalism (1980); and a forthcoming work entitled A Social History of the Crime Novel.

MIKE MEACHAM received his M.A. from Central Missouri State University and is presently working on a Ph.D. in sociology at the University of Kansas. His research interests are in family sociology, with special emphasis on the ethnic family, and the sociology of religion.

T.R. YOUNG is Professor of Sociology at Colorado State University, and director of The Red Feather Institute of Advanced Studies in Sociology. His current work centers around the knowledge process and the role of social science in that process.
