a. Manuscript Processing Fee: Beginning January 1, 1983, a processing fee of \$5.00 in check or money order payable to the *Mid American Review of Sociology* must accompany each article submitted. Manuscripts will not be reviewed until the fee has been paid. This fee is waived for all submissions from authors at sponsoring institutions.

b. Authors must submit 5 copies of each manuscript, along with an abstract of 100 words. Authors must also include a self-addressed stamped postcard for notification of receipt of the manuscript. Manuscripts and editorial correspondence from sponsoring institutions should be addressed to the respective Associate Editor. All other manuscripts and editorial correspondence should be addressed to the Article Review Editor, *Mid American Review of Sociology*, University of Kansas, Lawrence, Kansas 66045. Articles should follow citation system used in American Sociological Association publications.

c. *Mid American Review of Sociology* is published semiannually, Spring (May) and Winter (December), by the sponsoring institutions. Claims for undelivered copies must be made within six months following the publication date. The publishers will supply missing copies when losses have been sustained in transit and when their stock will permit.

d. Subscriptions are entered on a calendar year basis. Subscription rates are: Students \$6/yr., Individual \$8/yr., and Institutions \$19/yr. Single copies of the *Review* are \$7.00. Two year rates are: Students \$10, Individual \$15, and Institutions \$40. Canadian subscriptions add \$2.50 per year for postage and handling to all rates. Overseas subscriptions add \$4.00 per year.

e. Advertising rates are: Full page, \$50; Half page, \$25. A 20 percent discount will be allowed advertisers inserting ads in two or more consecutive issues.

f. Business matters, permission to quote subscriptions, and changes of address may be sent to the Managing Editor, *Mid American Review of Sociology*, Department of Sociology, University of Kansas, Lawrence, Kansas 66045.

g. Institutions interested in becoming affiliated with MARS should contact the Editor-in-Chief.
