THE STAR SPANGLED BANNER

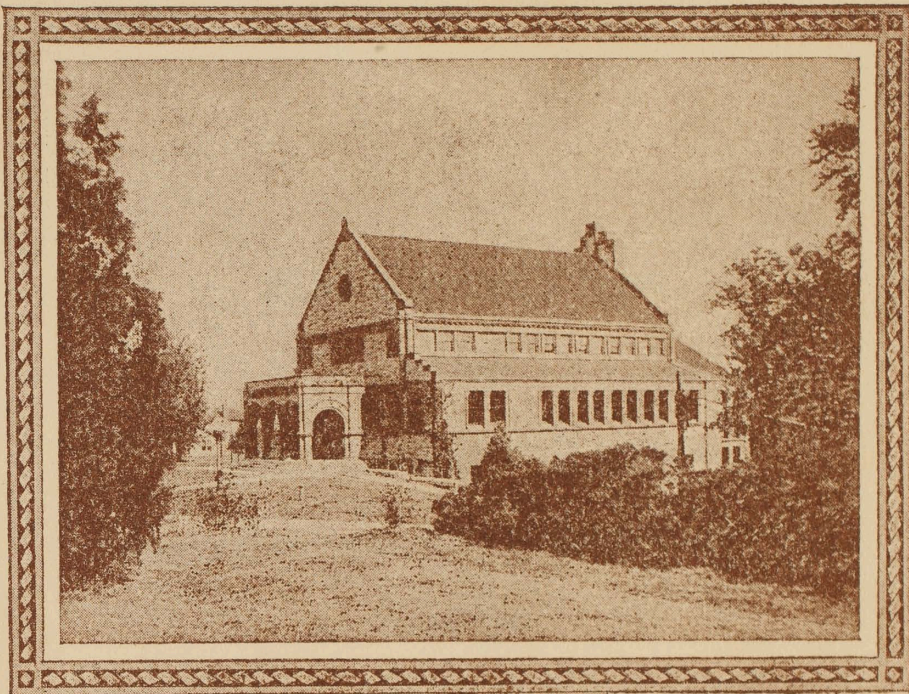
O say can you see, by the dawn's early light,

GENERAL INFORMATION.

Tickets for the Commencement Exercises.

GRADUATING STUDENTS.—Each graduating student is entitled to two tickets to the Commencement exercises. These will be given out Friday, May 31, and Saturday, June 1, at the Registrar's office.

ALUMNI.—Alumni may obtain tickets for themselves and friends to the Commencement exercises upon registration at Alumni headquarters, in room 110, Fraser Hall, after 9 o'clock on Saturday. These tickets will secure admission to the first floor of the auditorium, where seats will be reserved until 10 o'clock. Children under twelve years of age will not be admitted to the main auditorium.

FACULTY.—Faculty members are entitled to two tickets each to the Commencement exercises. They may obtain their tickets at the Registrar's office, Friday, May 31, or Saturday, June 1.

FORMER STUDENTS.—Former students who are not graduates may obtain tickets to the Commencement exercises upon application at Alumni headquarters.

Others than those mentioned above will be admitted to the Commencement exercises so long as any unreserved seats remain.

Tickets for the University Dinner.

NOTE.—If the Government requires Robinson Gymnasium for accommodation of army men here for instruction, the dinner will not be given.

GRADUATING STUDENTS.—Each graduating student is entitled to one ticket to the University dinner. These tickets are not transferable and may be obtained upon application at the Registrar's office on Friday, May 31, or before 3 p. m. Saturday, June 1.

FACULTY.—Each member of the Faculty is entitled to one ticket to the University dinner. These tickets may be obtained by *personal application* at the Registrar's office, Friday, May 31, or before 3 p. m., Saturday, June 1.

Graduating students, alumni, and faculty members may wish to obtain tickets to the University dinner for guests. Such extra tickets—if any remain—may be obtained at the Registrar's office after 3 p. m., Saturday, June 1. There is no waiting list.

Since it is necessary to meet, so far as possible, this demand for guest tickets to the dinner, all tickets set aside for graduating students and the

faculty which are not called for before 3 p. m., Saturday, June 1, will be turned over to the Registrar for sale.

Any tickets not previously disposed of will be on sale in the Gymnasium immediately after the graduation exercises.

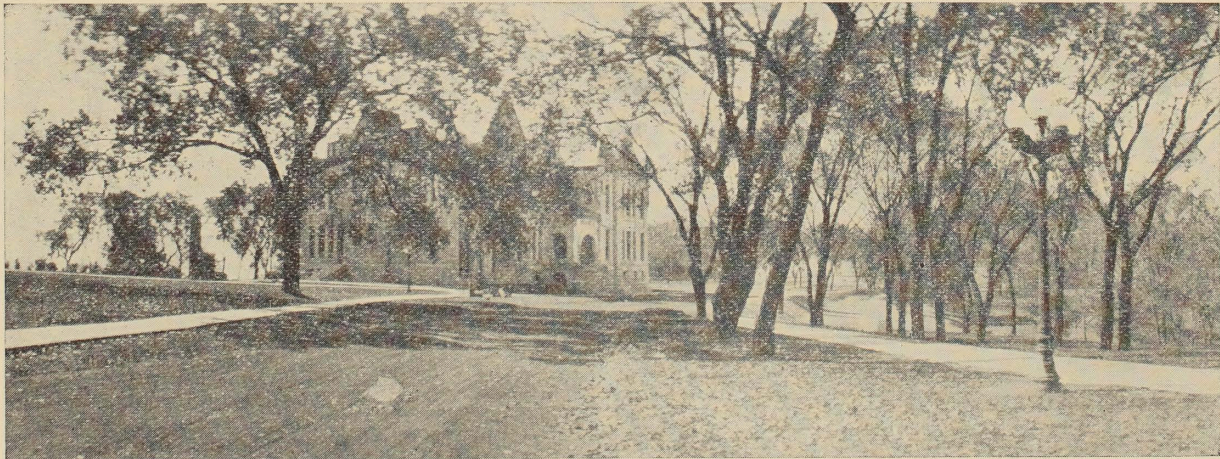

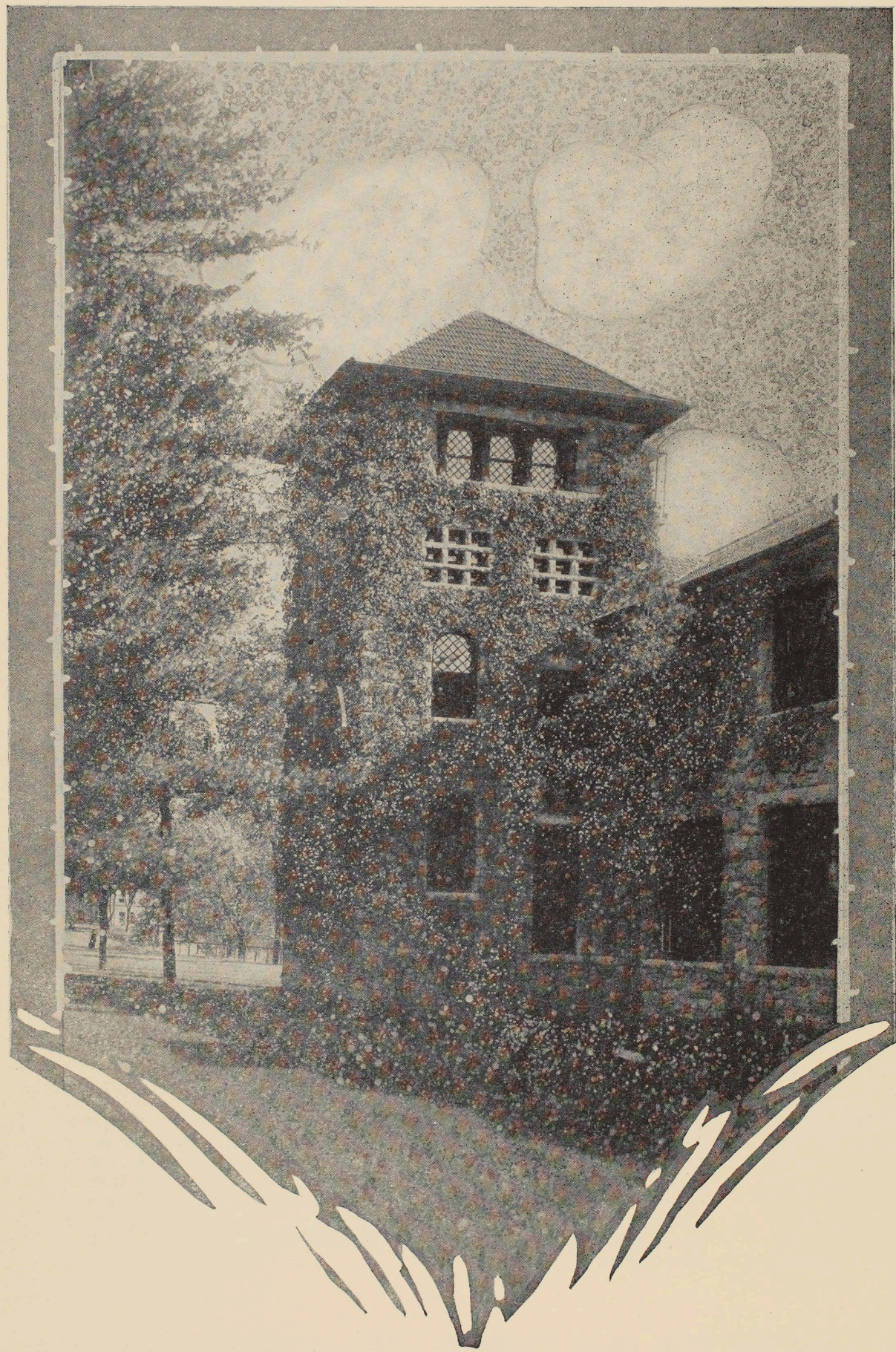

Graduating students, Alumni and Faculty members may wish to obtain tickets to the University Dinner for guests. Such extra tickets, if any remain, may be obtained at the Registrar's office, Monday, June 3, at 8 a. m. There is no waiting list.

Since it is necessary to meet, so far as possible, this demand for guest tickets to the dinner, all tickets set aside for graduating students and Faculty which are not called for before 5 p. m., Saturday, June 1, will be turned over to the Registrar for sale. The price is one dollar each.

Any tickets not previously disposed of will be on sale at the main entrance of the Gymnasium immediately after the graduation exercises.
