APPENDIX A

DEFINITION OF KEY TERMS USED IN TABLES

TABLE 1

1. Holdings refers to all library materials received and accessioned by June 30, 1975.
2. Library refers to East Asian collections either centrally or separately located and administered.
3. Year started refers to the earliest date known for formal organization or systematic collecting of East Asian materials in the library.
4. Language refers to total holdings of materials in vernacular languages only. Other includes Hsi-hsia, Moso, etc. but not those in South or Southeast Asian languages. Western language materials on East Asia are not included.
5. Volume refers to unit of books cataloged or to be cataloged, including bound periodicals. Each unit in modern binding or each fascicle (ts'e, satsu) in traditional format is counted as one volume.
6. Total refers to total units in volumes, reels, sheets, and pieces, excluding pamphlets and separate issues of periodicals and newspapers.
7. Microform refers to microfilm by reels, microfiche by sheets, and others (microprint or micro-opaque) by pieces.
8. Current periodicals refers to publications issued at regular intervals and received during the current academic year, including annuals and dailies, but excluding serials or series published at irregular intervals.

TABLE 2

1. No. of collections refers to the number of reporting libraries included in the surveys.
2. No. of volumes refers to total holdings in vernacular languages, including monographs and microforms. Other refers to Manchu, Mongol, Tibetan, Moso, Hsi-hsia, and materials in other East Asian languages.
3. Total additions refers to the five-year additions of Chinese, Japanese, Korean, and materials in other East Asian languages.
4. Per cent increase refers to new additions in number of volumes in five-year period over those of the previous five-year period.

TABLE 3

1. Regions refers to geographical divisions in the United States only.
2. Number of collections excludes collections with holdings of less than 1,000 volumes.

TABLE 4

1. Materials refers to expenditures for all library materials in all languages, including books, current periodicals and newspapers, and binding cost.
2. Salaries refers to all wages for personnel handling the East Asian materials, including remunerations for student assistants and fringe benefits to professional and non-professional staff members.
3. Other refers to such items as equipment and supplies, postage and telephone, travel and other expenses.
4. Own institution refers to funds allocated to the East Asian field from the institution's own resources.
5. Government refers to NDEA, NEH, or other federal funds.
6. Foundation refers to funds from such granting agencies as EXPO, FORD, JAPAN FOUNDATION, MELLON, etc.
7. Other refers to such sources as endowment, personal gifts, etc.

TABLE 5

1. Holdings refers to the total number of volumes held by the library as of June 30, 1975.
2. Additions refers to acquisitions in total number of volumes/units during the periods indicated.
3. Books cataloged refers to all materials under complete bibliographic control. Ts'ung-shu or sōsho, if cataloged as one individual unit, is counted as one title; if cataloged as separate units, the titles are counted separately. Analytic titles are counted as separate titles cataloged, but not in number of volumes.
4. LC cards used refers to percentage by which Library of Congress catalog cards were adopted.
5. Uncataloged books refers to monographs and microforms received but not cataloged as of June 30, 1975.

TABLE 6

1. Personnel refers to the number of staff members in full-time equivalent by functional procedures and by languages. If one cataloger works 20 hrs/wk for Chinese, 10 hrs/wk for Japanese and 10 hrs/wk for Korean, his/her time would be 0.5, 0.25 and 0.25 for Chinese, Japanese, and Korean respectively. One bibliographer may spend 25 hrs/wk in selection, 10 hrs/wk in cataloging, and 5 hrs/wk in reference, his/her time would be 0.62 for acquisitions, 0.25 for cataloging, and 0.13 for services.
2. Holdings refers to the total number of volumes held by the library as of June 30, 1975.
3. Acquisitions refers to selection, searching, ordering, accessioning, etc.
4. Cataloging refers to descriptive and subject cataloging, card preparation, processing, labeling, filing, and catalog maintenance.
5. Services refers to circulation, inter-library loans, reference, and such general services as management, plant operation and secretarial work.

6. Total refers to staff positions in terms of full-time equivalent (FTE). Professional staff refers to staff in full-time or part-time positions on professional appointment. Non-professional staff refers to all clerical and hourly staff and student assistants.
7. Vacancies refers to new professional members recruited in 1974/75 and vacancies open in 1975/76.

TABLE 7

1. Cost of materials refers to the unit cost per volume as computed from the expenditures for materials and the total additions for each language.
2. Acquisitions per person refers to the average number of titles and volumes handled by one professional or non-professional acquisitions staff member per year.
3. Acquisitions cost refers to the unit cost per title or volume handled by one acquisitions staff member as computed against his/her average annual salary.
4. Cataloging per person refers to the average number of titles or volumes handled by one cataloger per year.
5. Cataloging cost refers to the unit cost per title or volume handled by one professional or non-professional cataloger as computed against his/her average annual salary.
6. Total processing cost refers to the combined cost of acquisitions and cataloging per title or volume.

TABLES 8-10

1. Holdings includes both monographic volumes and microforms, the total of which should be added together.
2. Titles refers to the total number of titles of both monographic volumes and microforms.

TABLE 11

1. Circulation refers to library materials removed from and returned to the book stacks or reserve shelves through formal registration.
2. Inter-library loans refers to number of volumes by actual counting or estimate in parentheses if no separate record was kept.
3. Borrowed refers to number of volumes borrowed from other institutions by the reporting library through inter-library loan.
4. Lent refers to number of volumes lent to other institutions by the reporting library through inter-library loan.
5. Photoduplication refers to number of items requested by users outside of the reporting library.
6. Fees refers to the annual charges to outside users for reference or borrowing privileges.

TABLE 12

1. Patrons refers to authorized users who have records in the library indicating their use of East Asian materials. Estimated figures are given in parentheses.
2. Patrons from own institution refers to campus users of reporting institutions.
3. Visitors refers to patrons who are not members of the institution but use the library for reference or research purposes. For public libraries, all patrons are considered visitors. If visitors cannot be identified, they are entered in the total only.

APPENDIX B

RARITIES AND SPECIALTIES OF EAST ASIAN MATERIALS
IN AMERICAN LIBRARIES

The following is a brief identification of rare and special collections in East Asian languages or on East Asia in Western languages in American collections as reported by individual libraries. "Rarities" refer to such unique or rare items as old manuscripts and inscriptions, early imprints, collated texts, rubbings, and fine printing. "Specialties" refer to certain large subject concentrations in individual collections that are not likely to be duplicated elsewhere in American libraries. For descriptions and catalogs of these collections, see Publications in Appendix C.

UNIVERSITY OF BRITISH COLUMBIA LIBRARY. ASIAN STUDIES DIVISION

P'u-pan Collection: 3,226 titles in 43,320 volumes, including 86 Kwangtung gazetteers and 300 rare items of Sung, Yüan, Ming printing and mss.

UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA, BERKELEY. EAST ASIATIC LIBRARY

Rare book collection: 335 titles in 2,801 volumes, primarily Chinese imprints before 1644 and Japanese imprints before 1600.

Chinese rubbings: 2,104 items of rubbings from steles, monuments, statutes, bronzes, tiles, etc.

Ho-Chiang Collection of Buddhist literature: 110 titles in 146 volumes, including early Chinese, Japanese and Korean woodblock editions and mss. written in gold or silver.

John Fryer Collection of Chinese translations of Western scientific and technical works by the Kiangnan Arsenal in 1867-1902: over 100 titles in about 1,500 volumes.

Japanese manuscripts: about 7,000 pieces with only a few having been published.

Japanese woodblock printed maps: 1,963 titles in 2,049 items of 17th-19th century woodblock printed maps with some in color.

Murakami Library of Meiji literature: about 8,000 titles in 8,850 volumes of Japanese belles lettres and works on philosophy, society and politics of Meiji period, mostly first editions.

Asami Library of Korean literature: about 1,000 titles in 4,000 volumes of classical Korean imprints and mss. from 16th to 19th centuries.

Tibetan Xylographs: 1,406 fascicles, including Tantric texts of Nying-ma-pa Sect and Narthang editions of Kanjur.

UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA, LOS ANGELES. ORIENTAL LIBRARY

Chinese archaeology: ca. 1,000 titles in 3,000 volumes, including reproductions, reports and studies of various fields of Chinese archaeology.

Ch'en's Collection on Chinese literature and poetry of the Ch'ing dynasty: 240 titles in 1,261 volumes.

Togano Collection on Buddhism: 342 titles in 968 volumes.

CENTER FOR RESEARCH LIBRARIES, CHICAGO

Edward Hunter Collection: Seven shelves of uncataloged Chinese communist publications, including news releases pertaining to "confessions" by Americans, newspaper clippings on alleged American germ warfare, text books, propaganda periodicals and picture books. Most of the materials are in Chinese, while some are accompanied with manuscript translations in English.

Union Research Institute files: about 2,000 reels of microfilm of newspapers, periodicals, and classified files published in Mainland China between 1949 and 1966.

UNIVERSITY OF CHICAGO. FAR EASTERN LIBRARY

Chinese rare book collection: 394 titles in 14,059 volumes, including 3 chuan of Tun-huang mss., one Dharani published in 975, one complete set of the northern edition of Ming Tripitaka, multi-color and other early printing before 1644. Fine and early Ch'ing editions are not included.

Li Tsung-t'ung Collection of Ming printing and mss.: 331 titles in 2,231 volumes of Chinese rare books and mss., mostly copied or printed during the Ming dynasty.

Sealing clay inscriptions: 11 impressions on 10 pieces, representing official titles of central and local administrations of the Han dynasty around the beginning of the Christian era.

Berthold Laufer Collection: 21,403 volumes in Chinese, Japanese, Manchu, Mongol, and Tibetan acquired during Dr. Laufer's expedition to the Far East in 1907-1910.

Confucian classics: 1,568 titles in 16,000 volumes, including 66 rare editions in 720 volumes printed in the 15th-17th centuries, or formerly in the collection of T'ien I Ko and Hsü Nai-ch'ang, or with critical notes by eminent Ch'ing scholars.

Chinese local histories: over 2,700 titles in 17,000 volumes, mostly in original editions with a few photoreproduced copies of rare editions from Chinese and Japanese libraries. Especially strong on Kiangsu, Chekiang, Honan, Hopei, Shantung, and Shensi.

Chinese local administration: 2,185 titles in 3,240 volumes, including reports and gazettes of local governments, statistics, and descriptions of local conditions on provincial, municipal and county levels. Not included in the collection on local histories.

Documents from Wartime Shanghai, 1941-1945: 296 items of leaflets, posters, photographs, maps, ID cards, ration coupons, flags, postage and tax stamps, paper currencies and underground newspapers issued under Japanese occupation, and first editions and extras of papers published on the V-J day, collected by T. H. Tsien.

Chinese student demonstration handbills: 72 original handbills issued by student groups in Peking and Tientsin during mass demonstrations in 1947 and 1948.

Rare Japanese materials: 52 titles in 150 volumes published during the Tokugawa period on Japanese arts; and 23 titles in 71 volumes on Japanese calligraphy and paintings.

CLAREMONT COLLEGES. THE HONNOLD LIBRARY. ASIAN STUDIES COLLECTION

Frederick McCormick Collection: 118 titles in 773 volumes of movable-type editions of Korean printed books from 15th to 19th centuries.

CLEVELAND MUSEUM OF ART. LIBRARY

Oriental fine arts: 3,560 titles in 7,172 volumes in Oriental and Western languages.

COLUMBIA UNIVERSITY. EAST ASIAN LIBRARY

Chinese genealogy: 994 titles in 10,507 volumes of chia-p'u, forming the largest collection of these materials in the Western world (See Akigorō Taga. Sōfu no Kenkyū shiryō hen. [Tokyo, 1966], pp.370-450).

Chinese local histories: 1,622 titles in 16,794 volumes (See Chu Shih-chia. "Chinese local histories at Columbia University," Harvard Journal of Asiatic Studies 8 [1944-45], 187-95).

Yi Sōng-ui Collection of Korean movable-type editions: 586 titles in 2,041 volumes.

CORNELL UNIVERSITY. WASON COLLECTION

Early Western-language works on East Asia: the largest group of such works on China published in 15th-18th centuries, consisting of correspondence and private documents relating to Lord Macartney's embassy to China.

FIELD MUSEUM OF NATURAL HISTORY, CHICAGO

Chinese rubbings: about 2,013 titles of Chinese rubbings and albums, including groups of individual rubbings for one title. Also includes a complete collection of Jesuit tomb inscriptions.

FREER GALLERY OF ART. SMITHSONIAN INSTITUTION

Far Eastern art collection: works on Far Eastern art, with a number of rare items in Chinese and Japanese.

GENEALOGICAL SOCIETY LIBRARY

Chinese clan genealogies: 1,200 titles in 900 reels of microfilm reproduced from collections in the U. S., Japan, Hong Kong and Taiwan, including over 400 titles of local Taiwan genealogy.

Japanese clan genealogies: 800 reels of microfilm reproduced from the Miyogi and Yamaguchi prefectural archives.

Korean clan genealogies: 2,000 titles in 1,500 reels of microfilm reproduced from Korean and U. S. collections.

Korean local histories: 100 reels of microfilm reproduced from collections in Korea.

HARVARD UNIVERSITY. HARVARD-YENCHING LIBRARY

Chinese rare book collection: including 14 titles in 66 volumes and 13 folders of Sung editions; 36 titles in 653 volumes, 1 roll, 3 folders and 1 leaf of Yuan editions; 1,219 titles in 18,013 volumes of Ming editions; 1,065 titles in 11,739 volumes published in early Ch'ing; 1,128 titles in 4,074 mss. written in 14th-19th centuries, of which 1,103 volumes are original mss. of local government and music books.

Ming multi-color printed books: 72 titles in about 220 volumes issued by the Min and Ling families in 1580-1644, when a total of 144 titles are known to have been printed.

Chinese rubbings: 300 titles in 400 folded volumes and sheets.

Chinese local histories: 3,525 titles in ca. 35,000 volumes, especially strong in those printed in K'ang-hsi, Yung-cheng, and Ch'ien-lung periods of early Ch'ing.

Ch'i Ju-shan Collection of Chinese drama and novels: 72 titles in 328 volumes, forming one of the three noted collections, which include a few rare items of erotic nature that were proscribed.

Chinese classified encyclopedias: 1,300 works in about 26,000 volumes, including the movable copper-type edition of the T'u shu chi ch'eng printed in 1726.

Chinese collectanea: 1,400 works in 60,000 individual titles, including 98 original editions of the 100 Ts'ung shu chi ch'eng.

Bruno Petzold Collection of Japanese Buddhist materials: 1,209 titles in 4,385 volumes, including about 200 mss. dating from the 13th or 14th century.

Korean rare book collection: including 190 titles in 635 volumes.

Korean genealogy: 523 titles in 2,064 volumes.

Korean biography: 416 titles in 540 volumes on persons died before 1910.

Korean geography: 145 titles in 278 volumes, mostly local gazetteers.

Korean government examination rosters: 233 titles in 269 volumes covering the Yi Dynasty from 1392 to 1894.

UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII. ASIA COLLECTION

Collection on Hokkaido, Sakhalin and the Kurile Islands: 1978 titles of source materials.

Collection on Ryukyu and Satsuma: about 5,000 titles of source materials at the Ryukuan Center.

Korean local histories: 176 titles in 475 volumes, published 1850-1900, in Xerox and microfilm.

Korean civil service examination materials of the Yi Dynasty: 30 reels of microfilm.

HINOMOTO LIBRARY

Collection of original ukiyoe: 200 items of color prints.

HOOVER INSTITUTION. EAST ASIAN COLLECTION

Materials on Chinese economy: 800 titles in 1,400 volumes on agriculture, banking and industry in China between the 1920's and 1949.

Left-wing publications: 1,200 titles in 1,800 volumes, including pamphlets, serials and monographs published between the 1920's and 1949.

Chinese student movement collection: 90 titles in 150 volumes, including pamphlets, serials and monographs published between 1920 and 1949.

Japanese colonial surveys: 800 titles in 1,600 volumes of administrative surveys, reports, periodicals, special population studies on Taiwan, Manchuria, Korea, and North China during Japanese occupation between 1895 and 1945.

Japanese materials on Chinese Communism: including 40 titles in 60 volumes produced in China on special military and Shin-min-kai studies.

Japanese left-wing materials: 600 titles in 1,200 volumes, including pamphlets, serials, and monographs published during the 1920's and 1930's.

Japanese student movement materials: including 300 titles in about 400 volumes on Japanese university student movement between 1968 and 1970.

UNIVERSITY OF ILLINOIS. FAR EASTERN LIBRARY

Early and fine Japanese printing: 125 titles in 486 volumes.

LIBRARY OF CONGRESS

Chinese rare book collection: ca. 2,000 titles, including 11 of Sung imprint, 1 of Chin, 14 of Yuan, 1,518 of Ming, 70 of early Ch'ing, 140 in mss., and 93 others (See A descriptive catalog of rare Chinese books in the Library of Congress. 1957. 2 v.).

Rare works on Chinese medicine: 303 reels of microfilm of rare medical writings in the former Peking Union Medical College Library.

Chinese local histories: 3,750 titles in ca. 60,000 volumes, especially strong on such provinces as Hopei, Shantung, Kiangsu, Szechuan and Shensi (See A catalog of Chinese local histories in the Library of Congress. 1942).

Old Chinese maps in mss.: 80 items, including an atlas prepared in the Ming dynasty, mostly collected by Warner and Hummel in 1929-30.

Pre-Republican Chinese legal materials: 295 titles in 5,240 volumes, covering all dynastic periods of Chinese history, in the Far Eastern Law Division.

Chinese individual literary collections: 4,700 titles of wen-chi or pieh-chi, especially strong of the Ch'ing period.

Chinese collectanea: 3,000 titles of ts'ung-shu.

Local Chinese newspaper from the People's Republic of China: about 1,200 titles published in the 1950's and 1960's, of which 80 titles have been microfilmed.

Japanese rare book collection: including about 2,000 titles in 5,000 volumes of mss. and 30 titles in 150 volumes of fine printing.

Special collections of Japanese materials: including the Crosby Stuart Noyes Collection of Japanese art, acquired in 1906; the Kanichi Asakawa Collection with strong emphasis on Buddhism, acquired in 1907; the Shio Sakanishi Collection with many pre-Meiji works and popular illustrated books of the late Tokugawa period, acquired in 1930-1942.

Tokugawa legal documents: 1,000 volumes, mostly in mss.

Naimushō thought control materials: including 5,000 items.

South Manchurian Railway publications: about 3,000 volumes (See John Young. The research activities of the South Manchurian Railway Company, 1907-1945: a history and bibliography. 1966).

Japanese mathematical books: 1,000 volumes, mostly published during the late Tokugawa period.

Korean individual literary collections: 40 titles in 200 volumes of Munjip in mss.

Moso manuscript collection: 3,038 volumes written in Moso (Nahsi) script.

UNIVERSITY OF MARYLAND. EAST ASIAN LIBRARY

Prauge Collection of Japanese publications under U. S. occupation: about 13,000 periodical titles, 11,000 newspaper titles, and 50,000 monographs published in Japan between 1945 and 1949 and submitted to the Civil Censorship Detachment, Headquarters for pre- or post-publication censorship.

UNIVERSITY OF MICHIGAN. ASIA LIBRARY

I Ching Collection: 321 titles, including commentaries, expositions, and special studies of the Book of Changes.

Chinese local histories: 2,291 titles in book form, microtext and other photo-reproductions from major collections.

Crump Collection of rare Chinese novels: including 67 rare editions of Chinese popular novels microfilmed from Japanese collections.

British Public Record Office file on China: 3,014 reels of microfilm including General correspondence (1815-1912), Embassy and consular archives (1759-1951), and Confidential print (1848-1957).

Union Research Institute files: 2,045 reels of microfilm, including 1,395 reels of classified files, 716 periodical titles, and 400 newspaper titles published in the People's Republic of China between 1949 and 1966.

Classified files on the Cultural Revolution: 218 classified files prepared by the Contemporary China Research Institute of Hong Kong.

Harley Harris Bartlett Collection of Japanese botany during the period of wood-block printing: 157 titles in 576 volumes.

Selected documents from the archives of the Ikeda family of the Okayama domain in 355 volumes of photostats.

Collection of scripts of Japanese drama: 8,242 scripts presented in 1946-1949.

Pacific War and Occupation Collection: including 180 volumes in the SCAP Combat Monograph Series, 76 reels of English translations of the SCAP Series, 200 volumes on International Military Tribunal records, and 10,000 sheets relating to Colonel Hussey's papers on drafting the new Constitution.

MILITARY ACADEMY. LIBRARY

Military history of China from the late Ch'ing to 1950: about 200 volumes in Chinese, some of which are rare.

MISSOURI BOTANICAL GARDEN

Chinese and Japanese botanical works: including about 100 titles on Japanese and Chinese gardens and flower arrangements, 300 titles on botanical explorations in East Asia, and 200 titles on studies of East Asian florals.

NATIONAL AGRICULTURAL LIBRARY

Collection consists of works on agricultural science, biological science, agricultural economics, and rural economy of China, Japan, and Korea.

NATIONAL LIBRARY OF MEDICINE

Works on the history of Chinese and Japanese medicine.

NELSON GALLERY OF ART

East Asian art: 2,348 items of cataloged books and 599 bound periodical volumes in the Oriental Library and about 2,000 extra volumes from the Sickman and Wilson Collections, mostly on Chinese painting, ceramics, sculpture and furniture; Japanese painting, ceramics and prints and Tibetan painting and sculpture.

NEW YORK PUBLIC LIBRARY. REFERENCE DEPT. ORIENTAL COLLECTION

Publications from the Taiping Kingdom: 24 titles printed by the Taiping Kingdom in 1852-61.

Rare Japanese illustrated materials: including 300 mss. and 1,200 books from the 8th to 12th centuries, mostly pre-Meiji, in the Spencer Collection of illustrated books.

Korean mss. at the Horace Allen Collection.

UNIVERSITY OF PITTSBURGH. EAST ASIAN LIBRARY

Collection on Taiwan: 1,250 titles in 2,654 volumes on the historical development of Taiwan since Koxinga, 1624-1662.

PRINCETON UNIVERSITY. GEST ORIENTAL LIBRARY

Rare book collection: including 3 titles in 778 volumes of Sung editions; 4 titles in 2,086 volumes of Yuan editions of Buddhist sutras; 1,084 titles in 24,024 volumes of Ming editions.

Collection on Chinese medicine: 1,160 titles in 1,620 volumes, forming the strongest collection of these materials in the Western world.

Japanese Go Collection: 229 titles in 514 volumes in Japanese from American Go Association.

SAN DIEGO STATE UNIVERSITY LIBRARY. ASIAN COLLECTION

Japanese military history of World War II: 200 titles in 250 volumes of biographies, war records, etc.

SETON HALL UNIVERSITY. MCLAUGHLIN LIBRARY. ASIAN COLLECTION

Chinese bilingual education: 500 titles in 700 volumes, strong in bilingual materials.

UNIVERSITY OF TORONTO. EAST ASIAN LIBRARY

Rare book collection: 3,862 volumes of mss. and printed editions from Sung to early Ch'ing.

UNIVERSITY OF WASHINGTON. FAR EASTERN LIBRARY

Joseph Rock Collection on Southwest China: about 2,000 volumes.

Robert Paine Collection on Japanese painting: 4,097 volumes.

YALE UNIVERSITY. EAST ASIAN COLLECTION

Jen Yu-wen Collection on Taiping Kingdom: over 320 titles in 640 volumes of books, periodical issues, mss., rubbings, maps, coins, seals, and clippings related to the Taiping revolutionary movement.

Yale Association of Japan Collection on Japanese culture: 680 items of books, mss., painting, calligraphy, and objects to illustrate the evolution of Japanese culture from the 8th to the 19th centuries.
