Michael Detamore, a KU associate professor of chemical and petroleum engineering and of bioengineering, is developing a synthetic patch made of polycaprolactone for the necessary tracheal surgery that would make the procedure easier and safer.

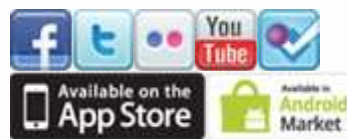
