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STRATEGIC PLANNING

Oversight Team Update | Mary Roach (chair) and Aileen Ball (co-chair):

The Strategic Plan Oversight Team's September 14 meeting was devoted to identifying Strategy Owners for those strategies being advanced in the next 12-18 months. Within the five-year implementation of the Libraries' strategic plan, the role of the Strategy Owner is critical and manifold; some of the responsibilities associated with this role include:

- Assemble Project Teams and appoint team leads/project managers for the implementation of prioritized action items within the assigned strategy
- Recommend refinements of scope for prioritized actions within the assigned strategy
- Request resource allocations to accomplish prioritized action items within the assigned strategy
- Ensure communication and dissemination of appropriate information to Team Leads/Project Managers
- Assess progress to ensure objectives and timelines are met within the assigned strategy
- Report quarterly on progress to the Strategic Plan Oversight Team

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Organizational Review Team Update | Mike Broadwell (chair) and Monica Claassen (co-chair):

The Organizational Review Team (ORT) is continuing to be in an information-gathering phase. Our team is continuing to review the major functions inventory results, and is working to categorize the action items on the Strategic Plan, based on broad categories that developed during our analysis of the unit and department activities inventories.

We are planning unit-level focus groups as part of the organization review process, with the purpose of collecting feedback from units on their core purpose, activities that support the core purpose, activities that do not support that core purpose, and any additional suggestions for optimizing the organization of activities within the libraries. The focus groups will be facilitated by staff within the libraries who have participated in facilitation training. We will be providing additional training to them regarding the framework for these meetings.

All staff in the libraries will receive an email from the ORT co-chairs, Mike Broadwell and Monica Claassen, providing further explanation of the focus group process and a worksheet with the questions we will be asking in the focus groups. Additionally, we will be asking unit leaders to contact one of the co-chairs to schedule meetings for their unit.

This will be a great opportunity for conversation with the ORT members, and we look forward to hearing your thoughts and feedback.

In the meantime, you are welcome to contact any of the members of the ORT with any questions, concerns or feedback you may have.
