INTRODUCTION

The purpose of the following study is to make a slight contribution to the inquiry into the vocabulary that students may be expected to have after the first unit of work in French.

It has seemed therefore that those classes of words which are inevitably used and thus constitute a constant element in the language, need not be taken into account, but only those whose frequency of use varies, that is, the verbs¹, adverbs², nouns³, and adjectives⁴, since these classes of words determine the richness of a vocabulary.

The material chosen was three readers⁵ which were considered representative of the reading material given students in the first unit of French. The words, reduced to a dictionary basis, number 3021, and are tabulated in list A, where a column has been allowed for the material from each book. From this list has been drawn a second list, B, in which only the words found to be common to all three books are tabulated.

List B has been checked against Henmon's "A French Word Book"⁶ and against the first five hundred words contained in Fard's "Minimum French Vocabulary Test Book"⁷, thus forming List C, and further

checked against Henmen's book and against the second five hundred words in Ward's book, thus forming List D. Lists C and D ^{thus} show the correlation between these books and List B.

This checking has been exceedingly difficult, since both Prof. Ward and Prof. Henmen count every word in the texts used, whereas the present study considers the frequent use of certain classes of words as sufficiently well established and attempts only to aid in determining those whose frequency is not clearly known.

For the translations, a word has been sought which would give the most common meaning and at the same time convey the idea expressed in the context.

CONCLUSION
