Description of Chigger Bite Symptoms:

Chigger bites appear as a red dot, and can be flattened, raised, or resemble a blister, welt, or acne. They are commonly found in clusters where the body has had contact with vegetation, and in areas with weak or wrinkled skin (e.g. ankles, the crotch and groin areas, behind the knees, in the armpits, and areas that have been compressed by clothing). This is different from where most other parasitic arthropod bites occur, which are typically on exposed skin. Chigger bites are a seasonal ailment and occur mainly in the summer and fall, and are often associated with walking in grassy or brushy areas.
