





























1989-1991**















--**Class B** motor vehicles shall include trucks of a type required to be registered in this state for a gross weight of more than twenty-four thousand (24,000) pounds, except those registered as a farm truck; and buses other than those designed for carrying fifteen (15) or fewer passengers which are owned or leased by nonprofit youth organizations and are operated by drivers who receive no compensation therefor;

--**Class C** motor vehicles shall include trucks of a type required to be registered in this state for a gross weight of not more than twenty-four thousand (24,000) pounds; passenger cars; all lawful combinations of vehicles having a combined gross weight of not more than twenty-four thousand (24,000) pounds; and trucks or truck and trailer or semi-trailer combinations registered for a gross weight of more than twenty-four thousand (24,000) pounds, when such truck has been registered as a farm truck; and

--**Class D** motor vehicles shall include all motorcycles. These licenses are typically issued in combination with another class of license (ex. Class CD). These combination licenses are reflected in Class D totals beginning in 1987.





Total Acres of Land in Farms by District, 1990






