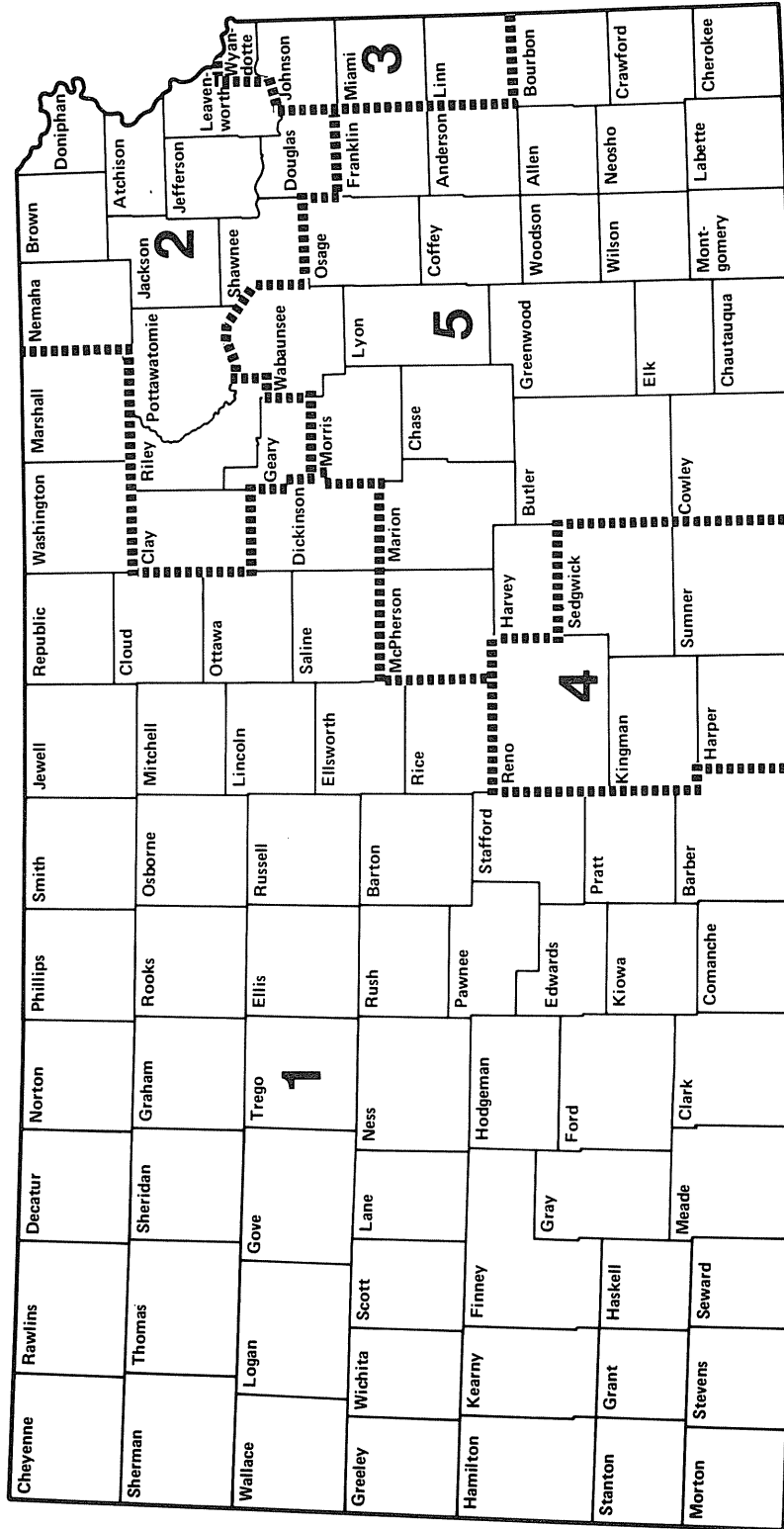

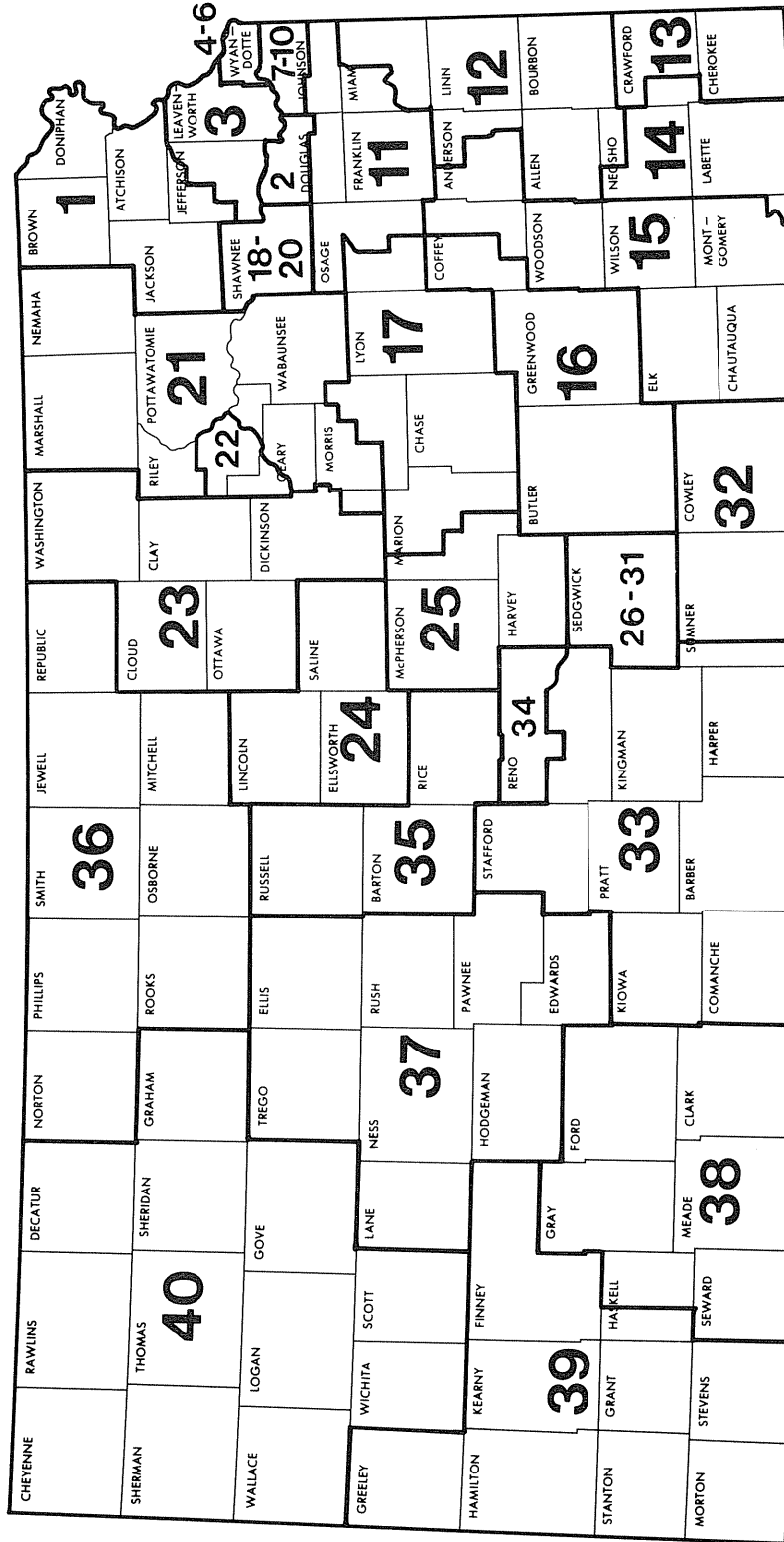

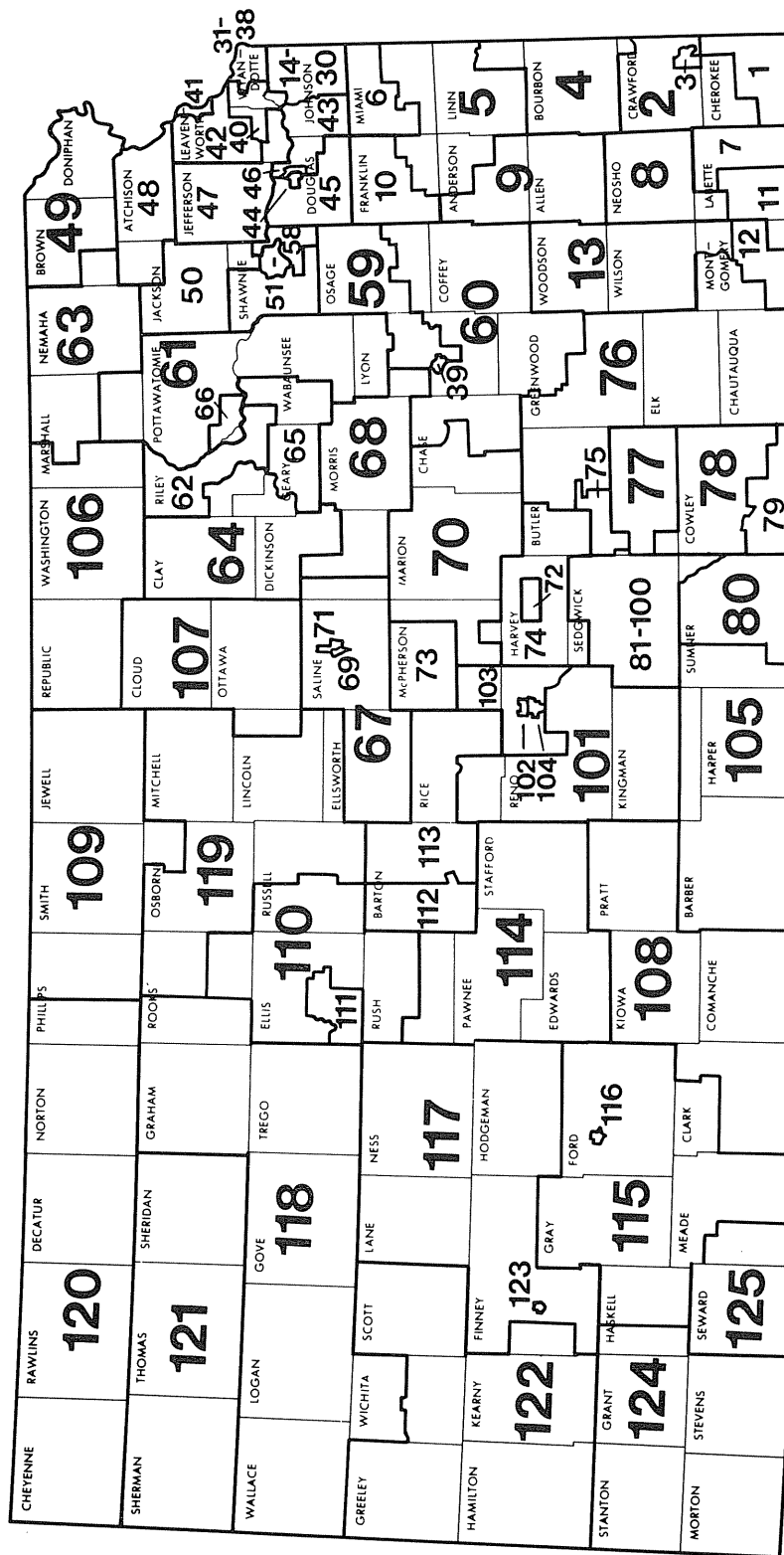

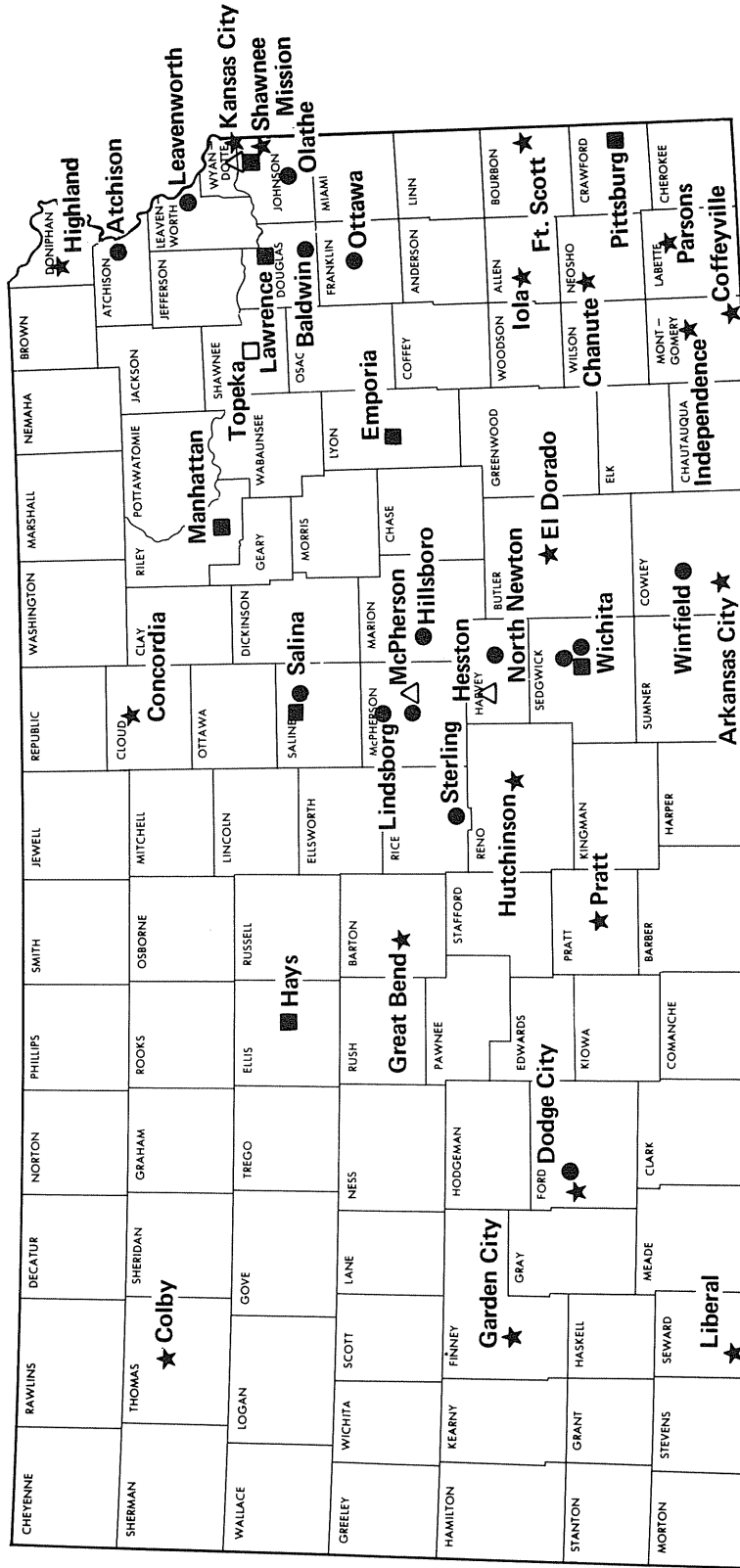

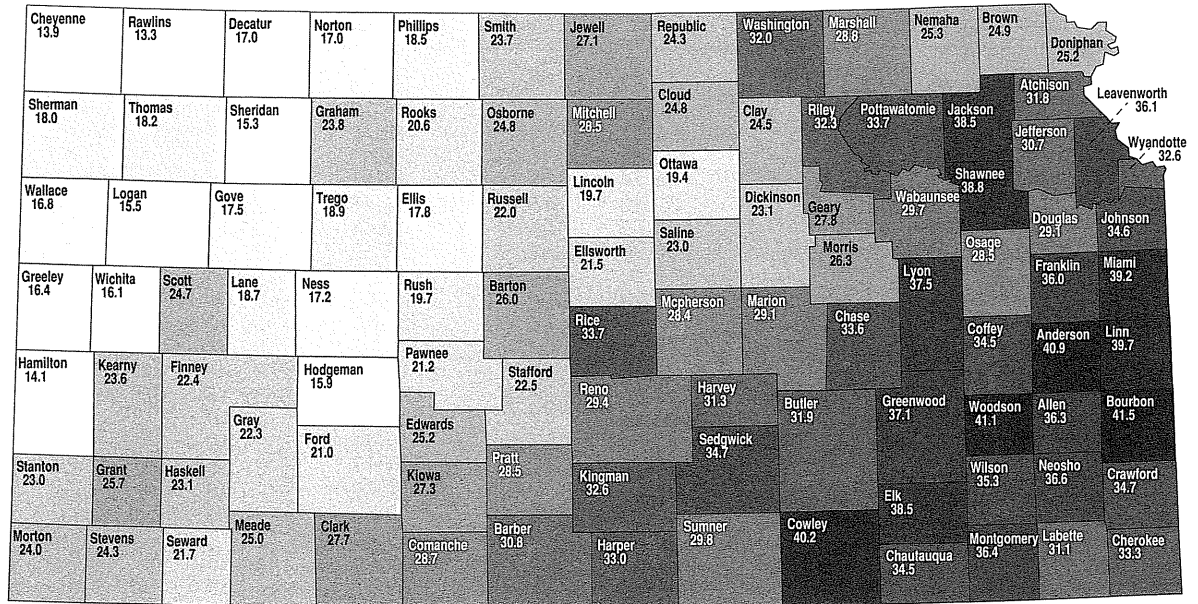

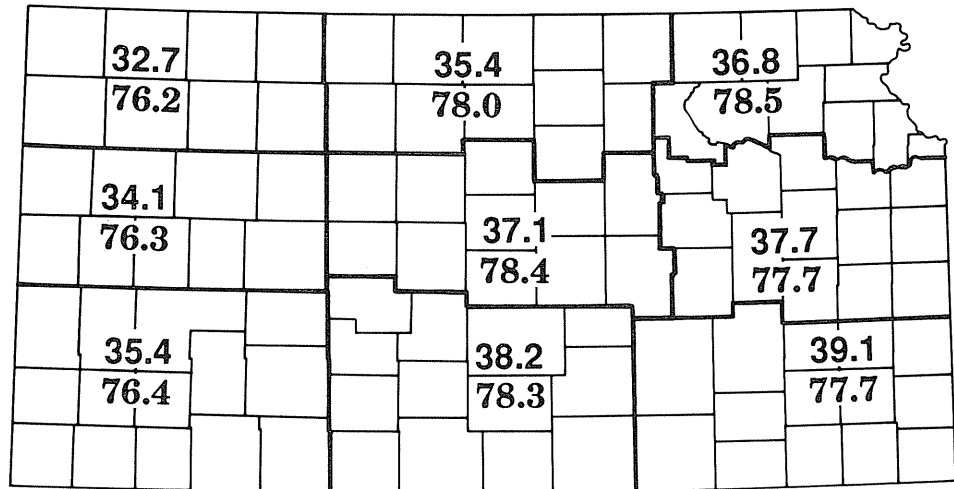

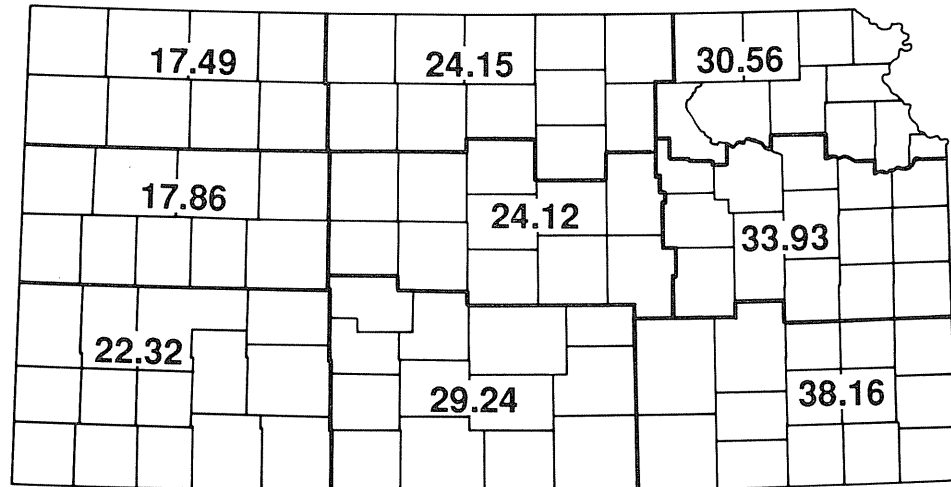
**Kansas Regional Temperatures, 1989

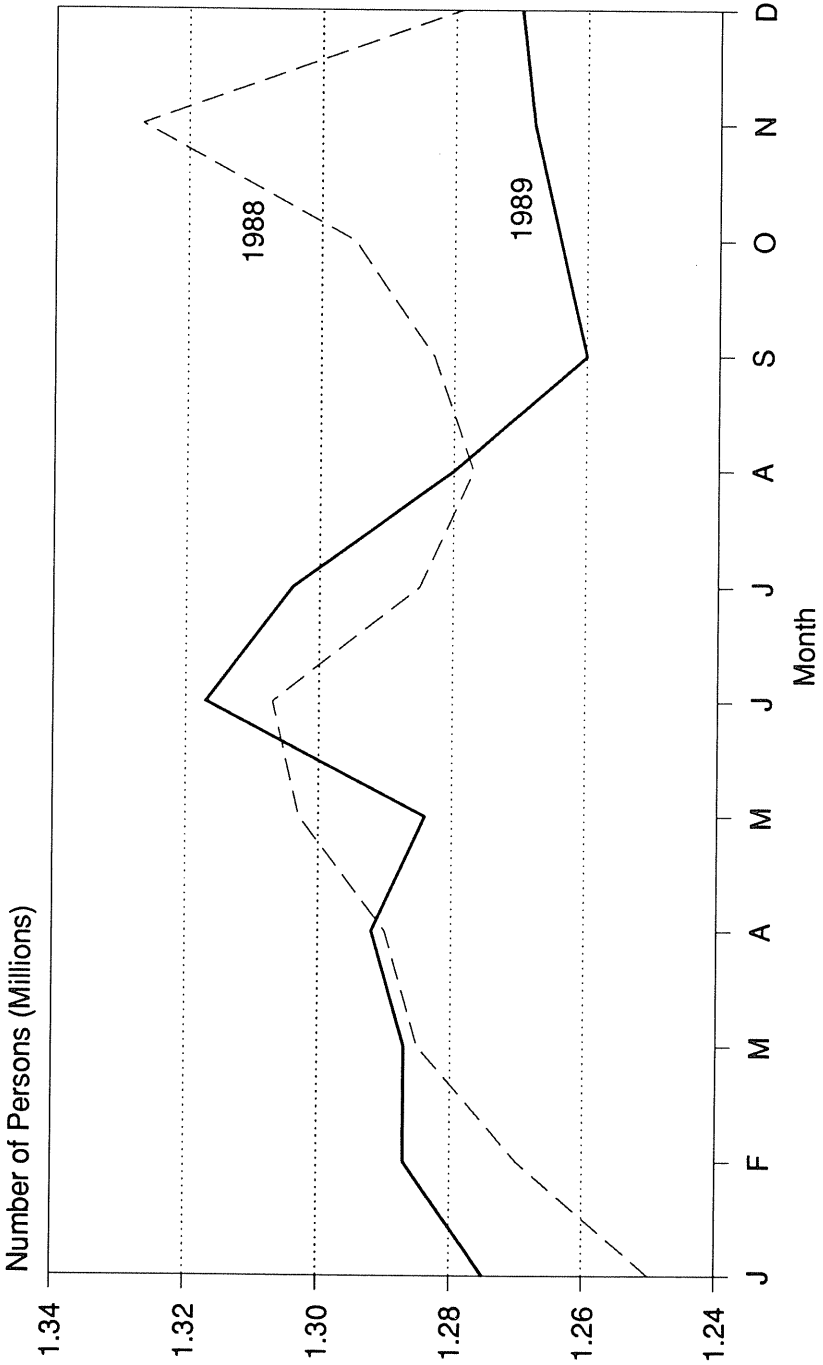

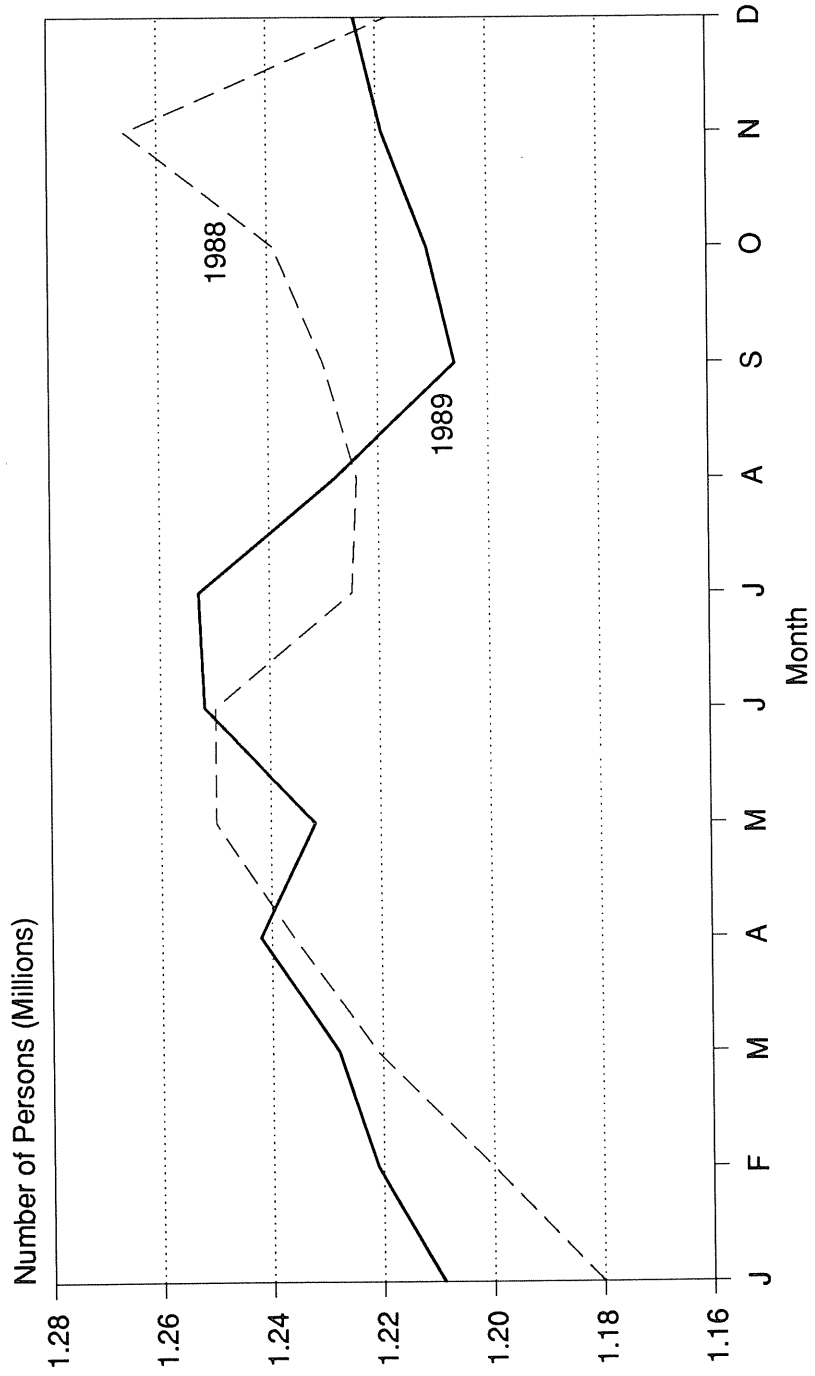

Kansas Total Civilian Labor Force 1988-1989



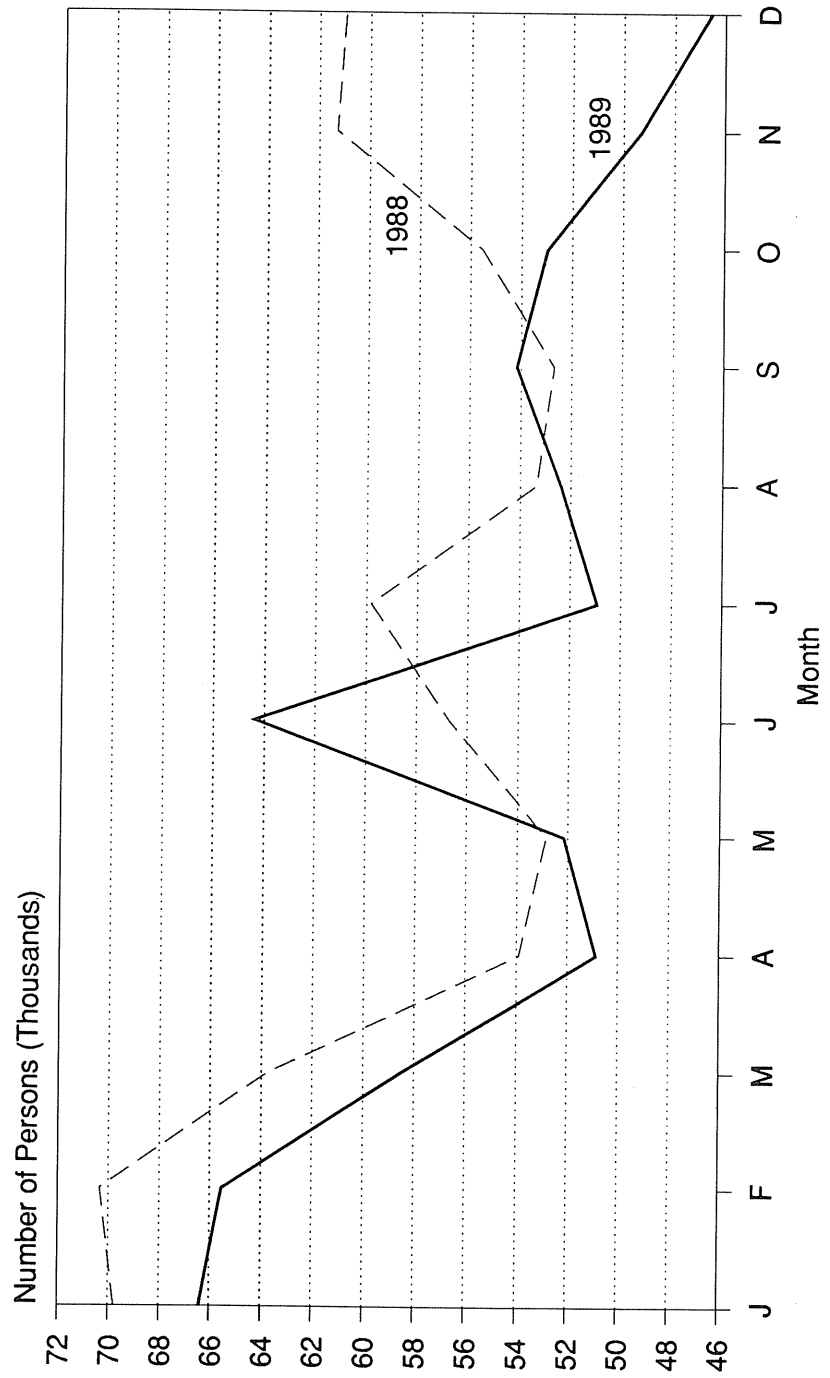

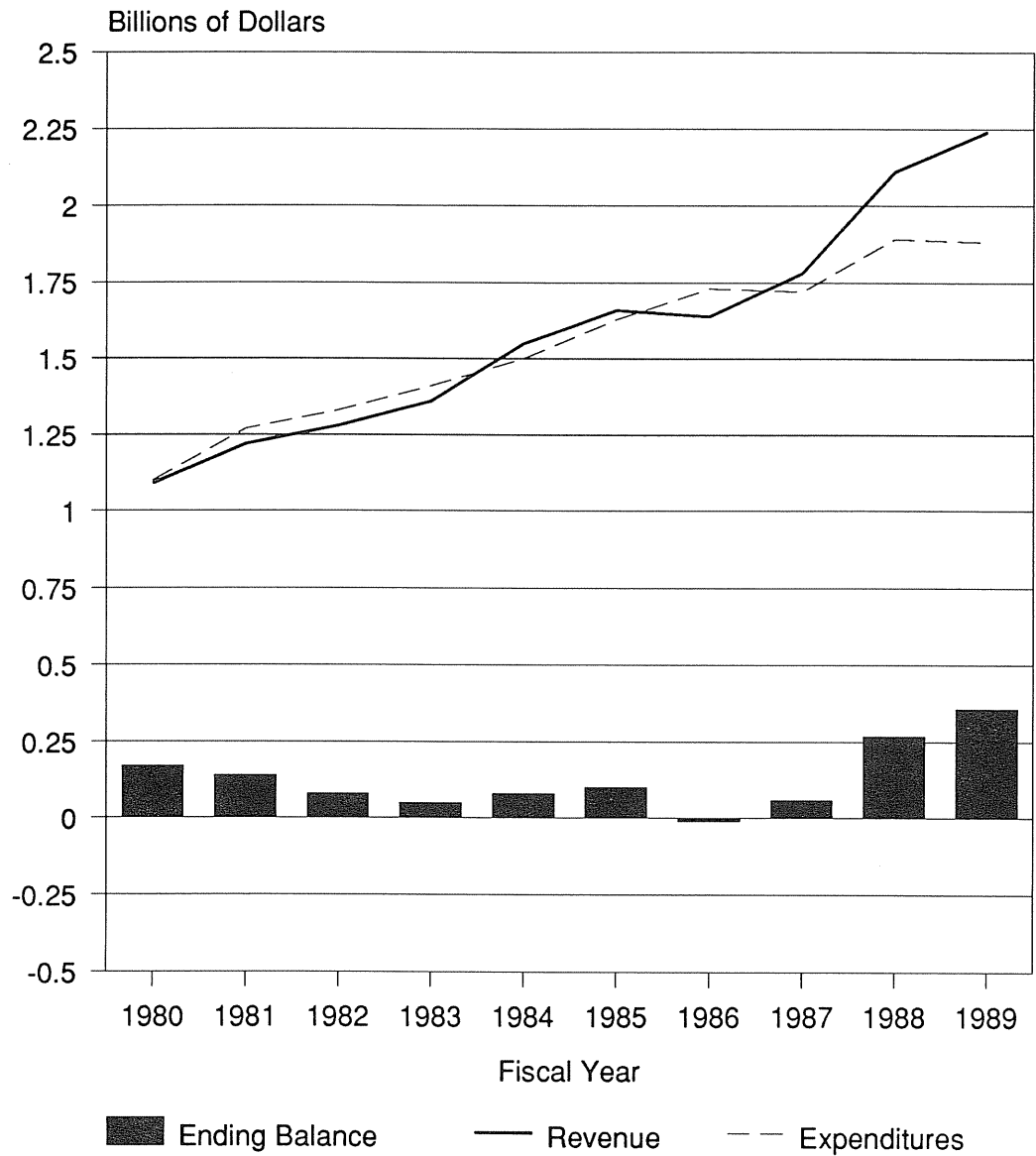

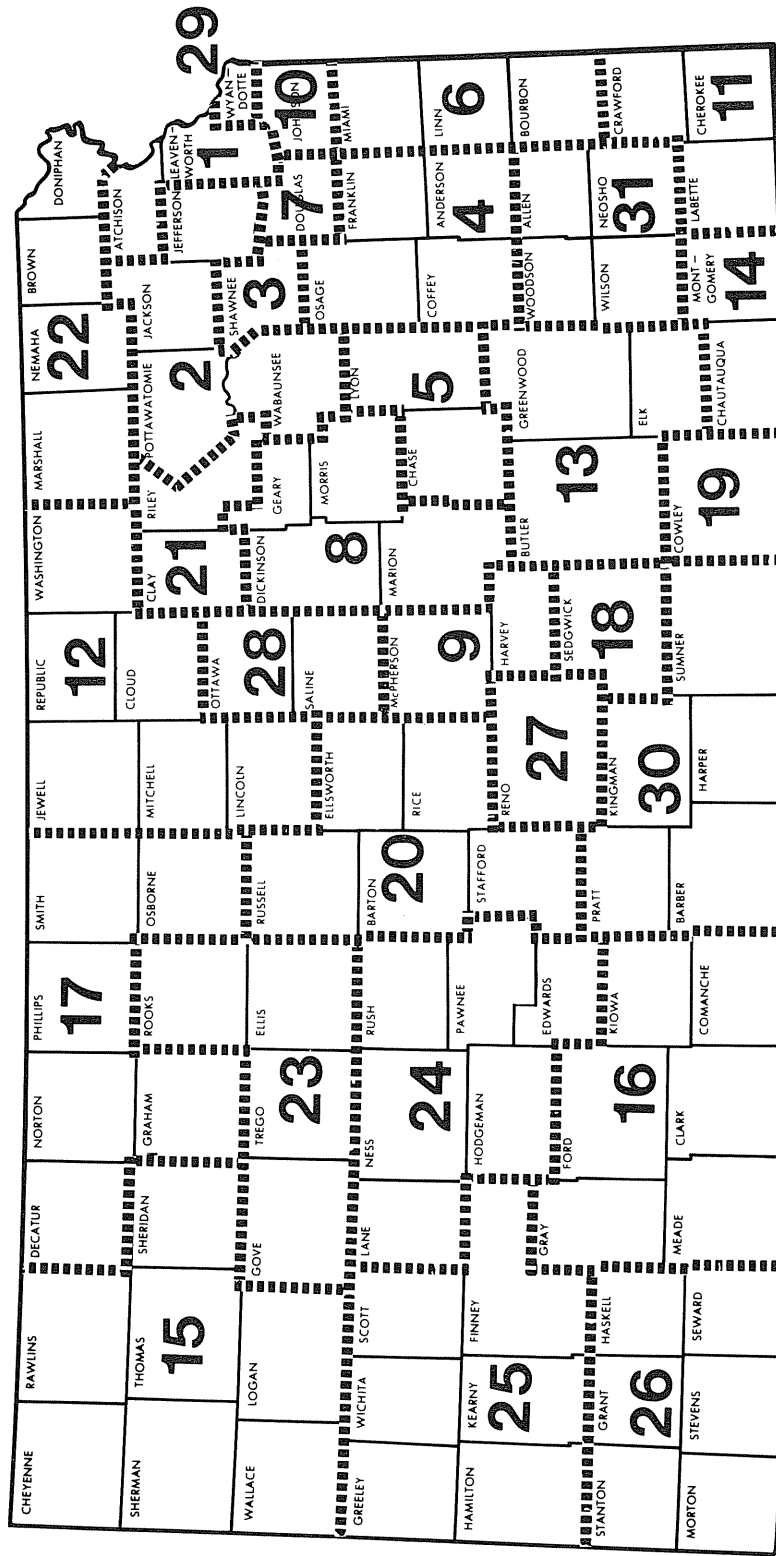

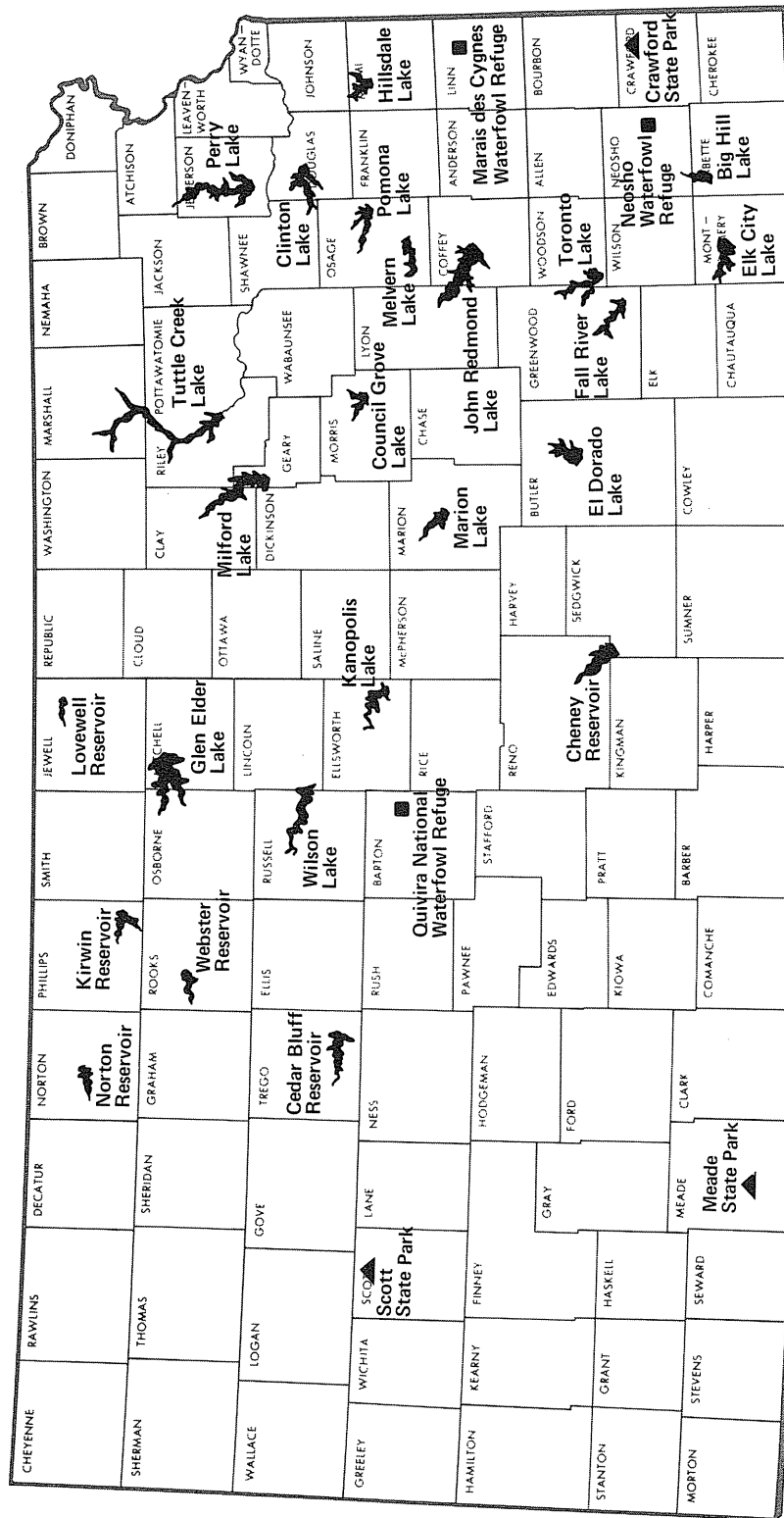

--**Class D** motor vehicles shall include all motorcycles. These licenses are typically issued in combination with another class of license (ex. Class CD). These combination licenses are reflected in Class D totals beginning in 1987.

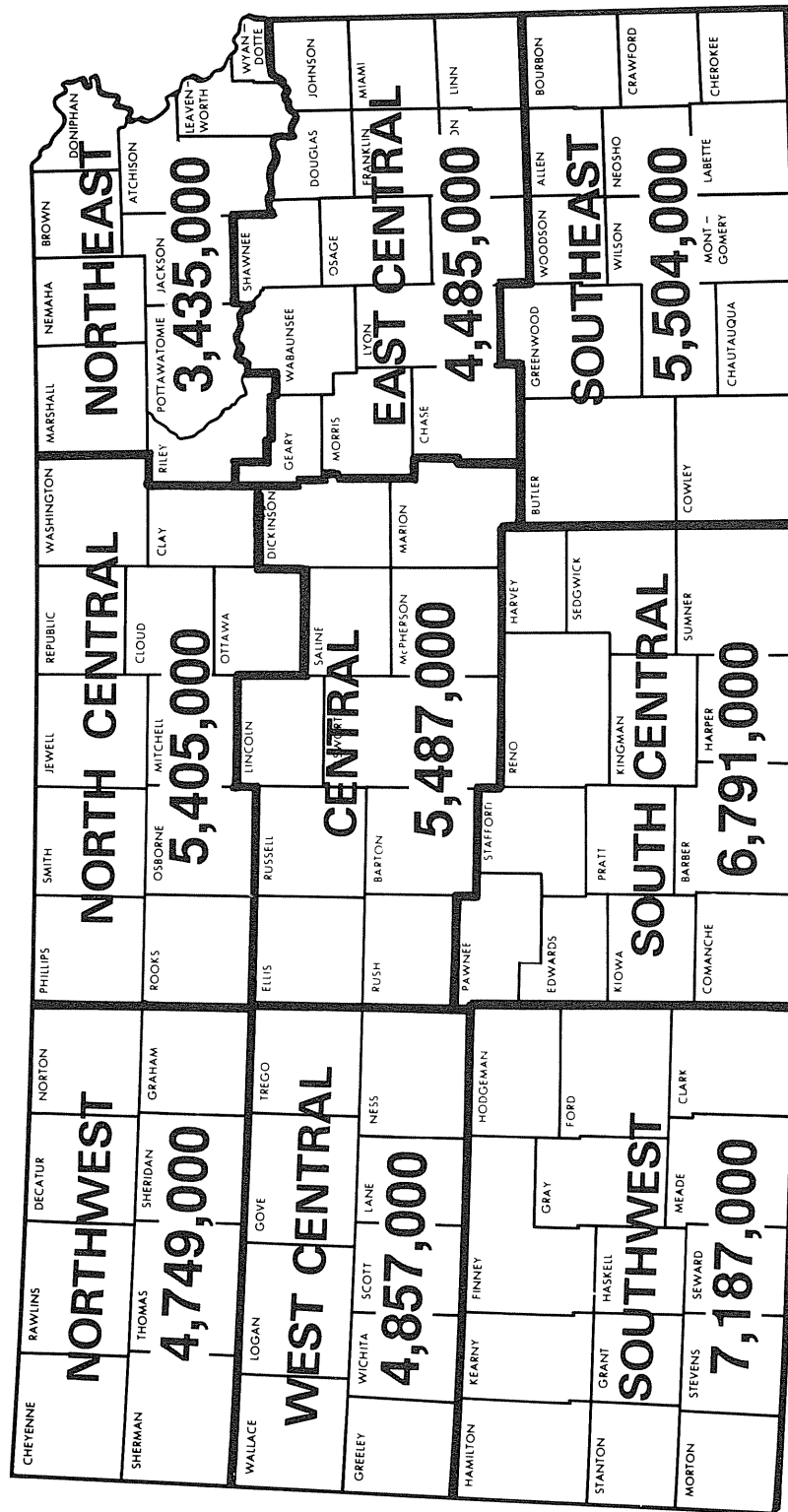

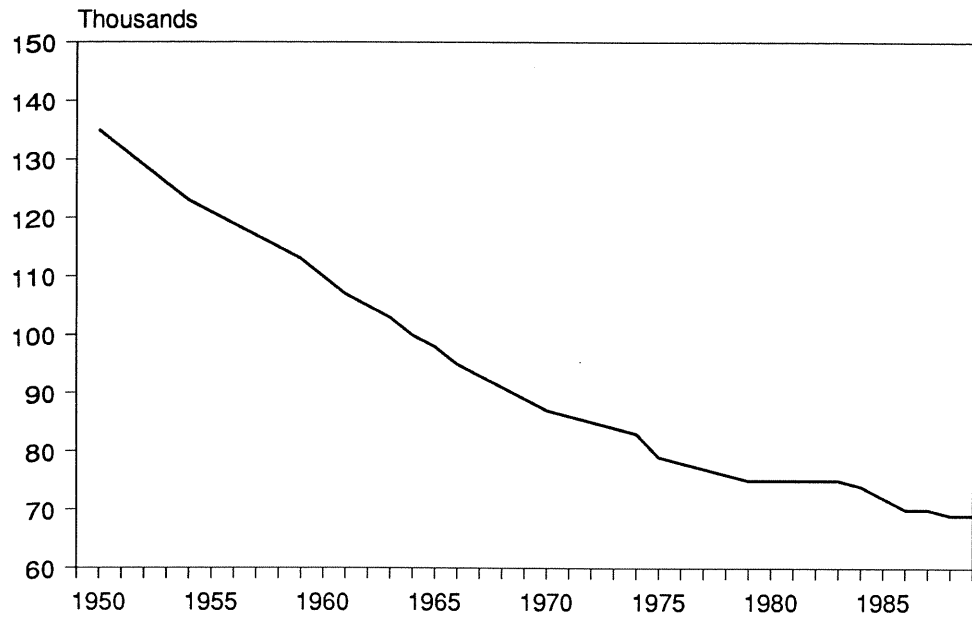

Total Acres of Land in Farms by District, 1989

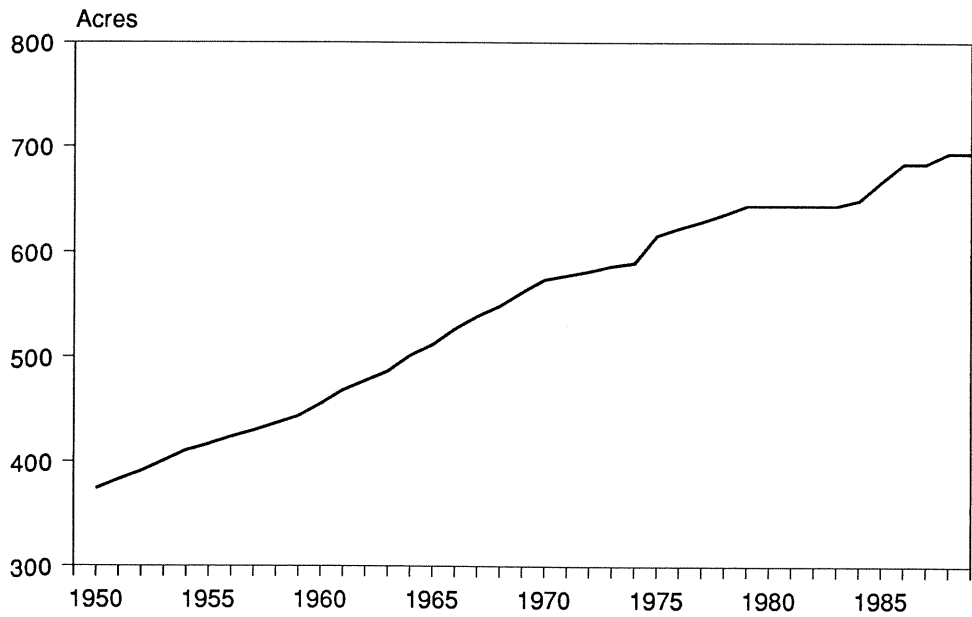

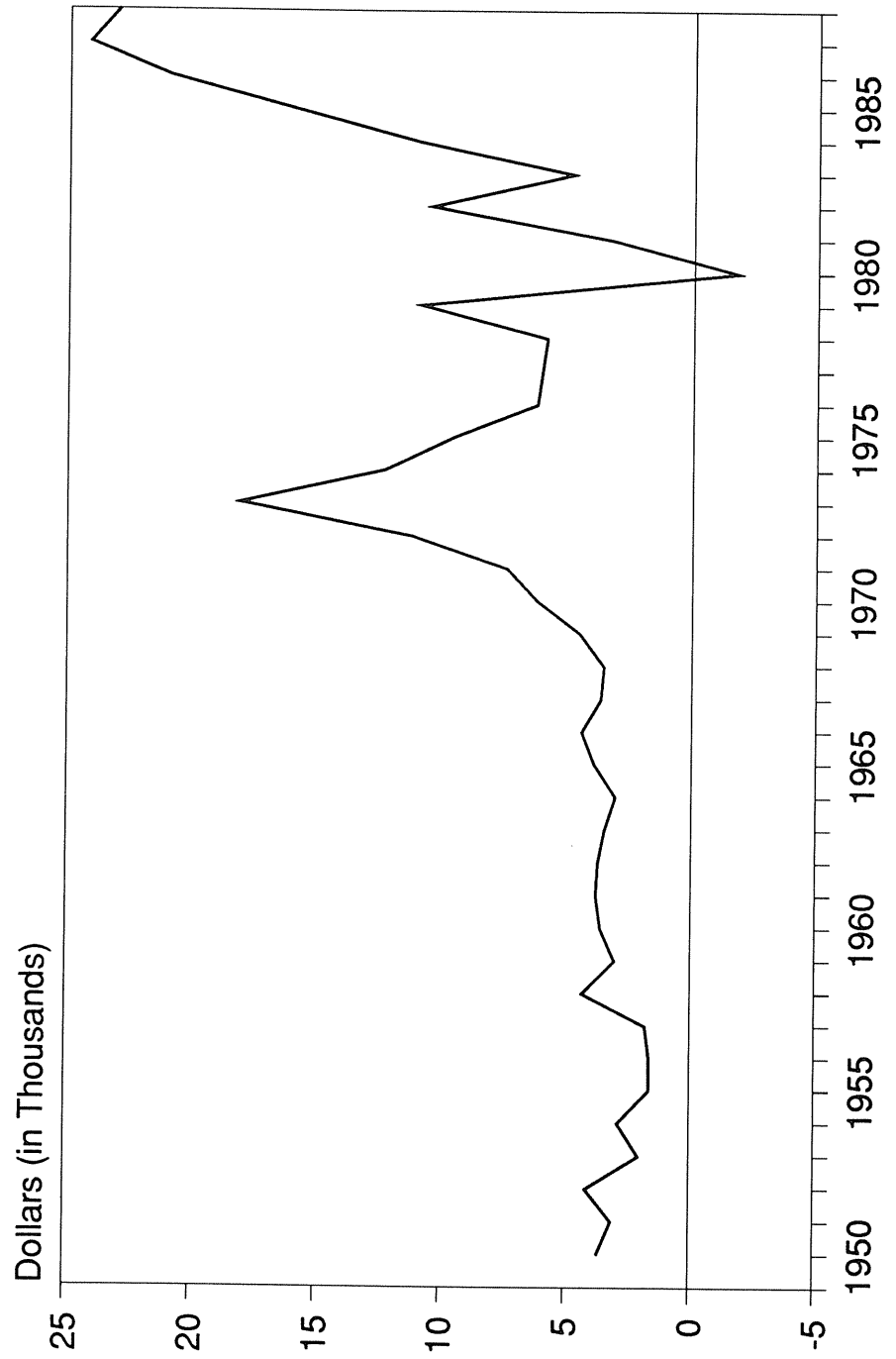

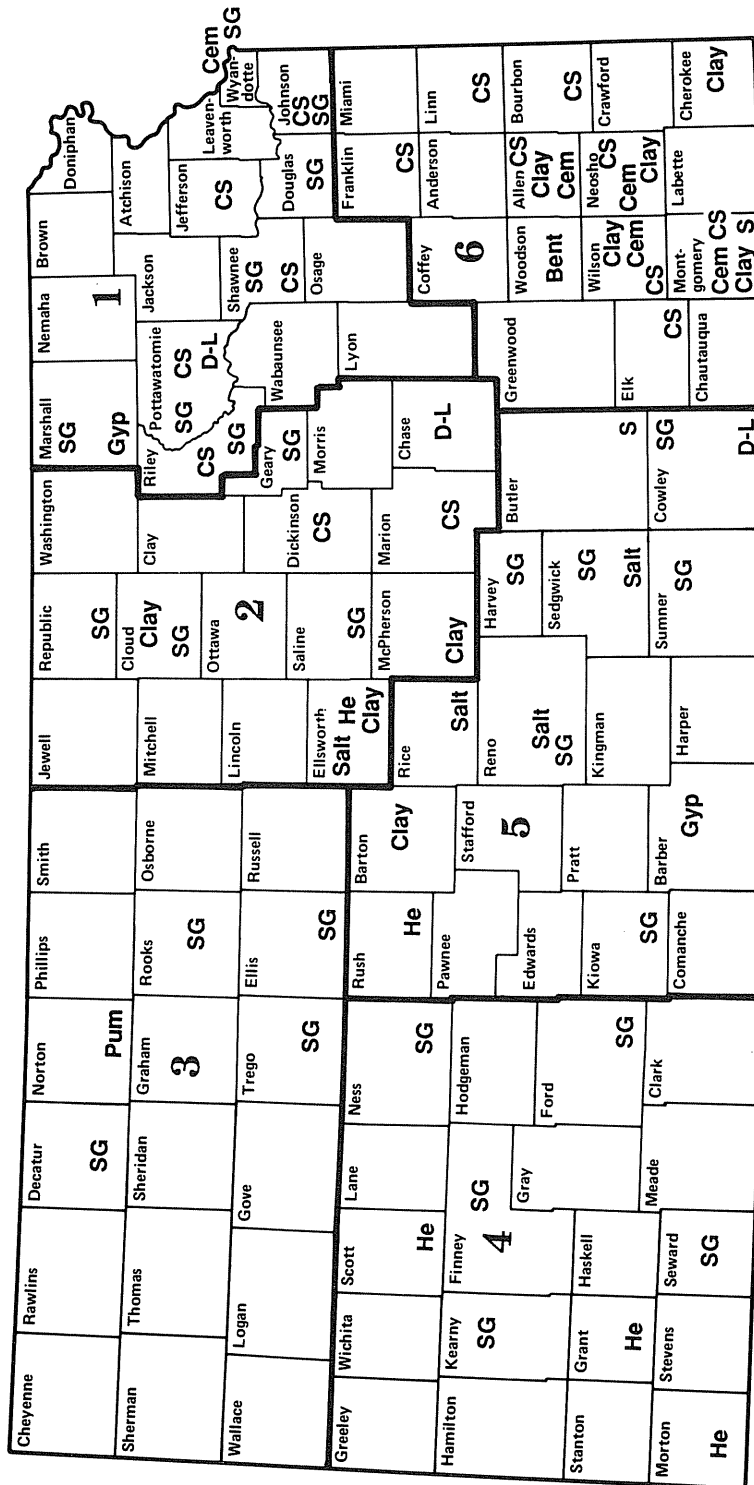
