## FOREWORD

THIS IS THE EIGHTH EDITION OF THE *KANSAS STATISTICAL ABSTRACT*. AS IN PAST YEARS IT SUMMARIZES DATA ABOUT THE STATE OF KANSAS IN A VARIETY OF CATEGORIES INCLUDING POPULATION, VITAL STATISTICS AND HEALTH, ELECTIONS, EDUCATION, CLIMATE, EMPLOYMENT, INCOME AND EXPENDITURES, BANKING AND FINANCE, STATE AND LOCAL GOVERNMENT FINANCE, CRIME AND LAW ENFORCEMENT, RECREATION, COMMUNICATIONS, POWER, MOTOR VEHICLES, MINERAL PRODUCTS, CONSTRUCTION, MANUFACTURING, AND TRADE SERVICES. THE STATISTICS PROVIDED ARE TAKEN FROM THE MOST RECENT STATE AND FEDERAL CENSUSES AND OTHER SPECIFIC ANNUAL REPORTS FROM STATE AND LOCAL GOVERNMENTS AND THE PRIVATE SECTOR. THE MOST RECENT SOURCES ARE USED IN ALL CASES.

THE 1972 *ABSTRACT* PROVIDES EXPANDED COVERAGE IN SEVERAL AREAS. THESE INCLUDE BROADER ELECTION COVERAGE OF MAJOR STATEWIDE RACES, CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS AND JUDICIAL BALLOTS; A PARTY COMPETITION MAP; ADDITIONAL STATE AND LOCAL GOVERNMENT FINANCE DATA; A NEW ARRAY OF PERSONAL INCOME BY COUNTY; AGE-SEX BREAKDOWNS OF STATE AND COUNTY POPULATIONS; EDUCATIONAL STATISTICS BY COUNTY; AND, STATISTICS ON ABORTION, INFANT MORTALITY, AND MARRIAGES AND DIVORCES. THESE NEW CATEGORIES REFLECT THE CONTINUED EFFORTS OF THE INSTITUTE FOR SOCIAL AND ENVIRONMENTAL STUDIES TO MEET READER INFORMATION NEEDS.

AS ALWAYS WE INVITE READER SUGGESTIONS ON THE FORMAT AND TYPE OF INFORMATION AS WELL AS THE NEED FOR THE ADDITION OR DELETION OF SPECIFIC CATEGORIES OF INFORMATION.

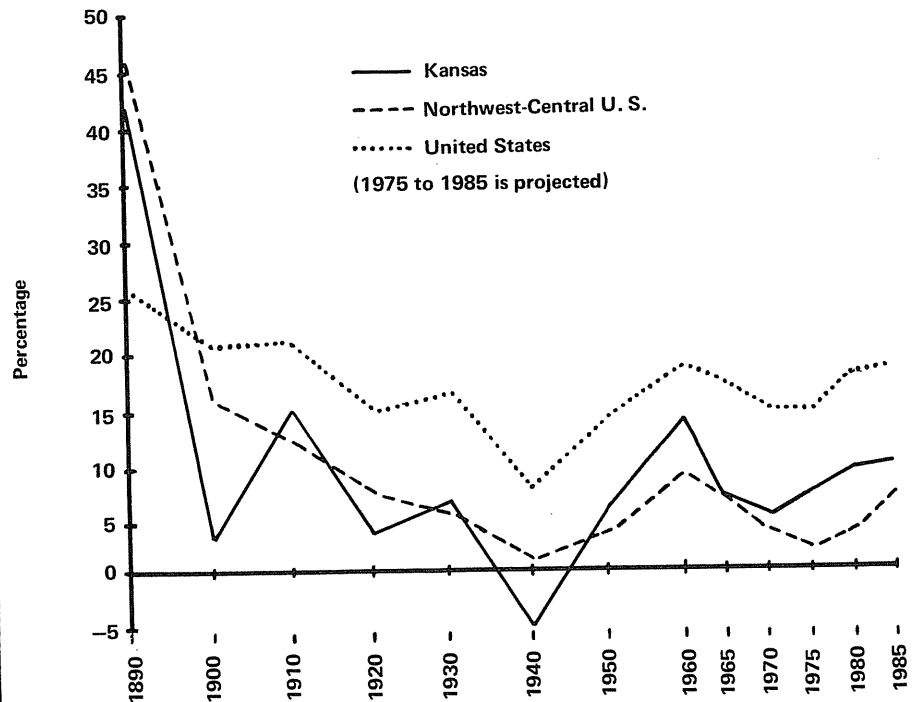

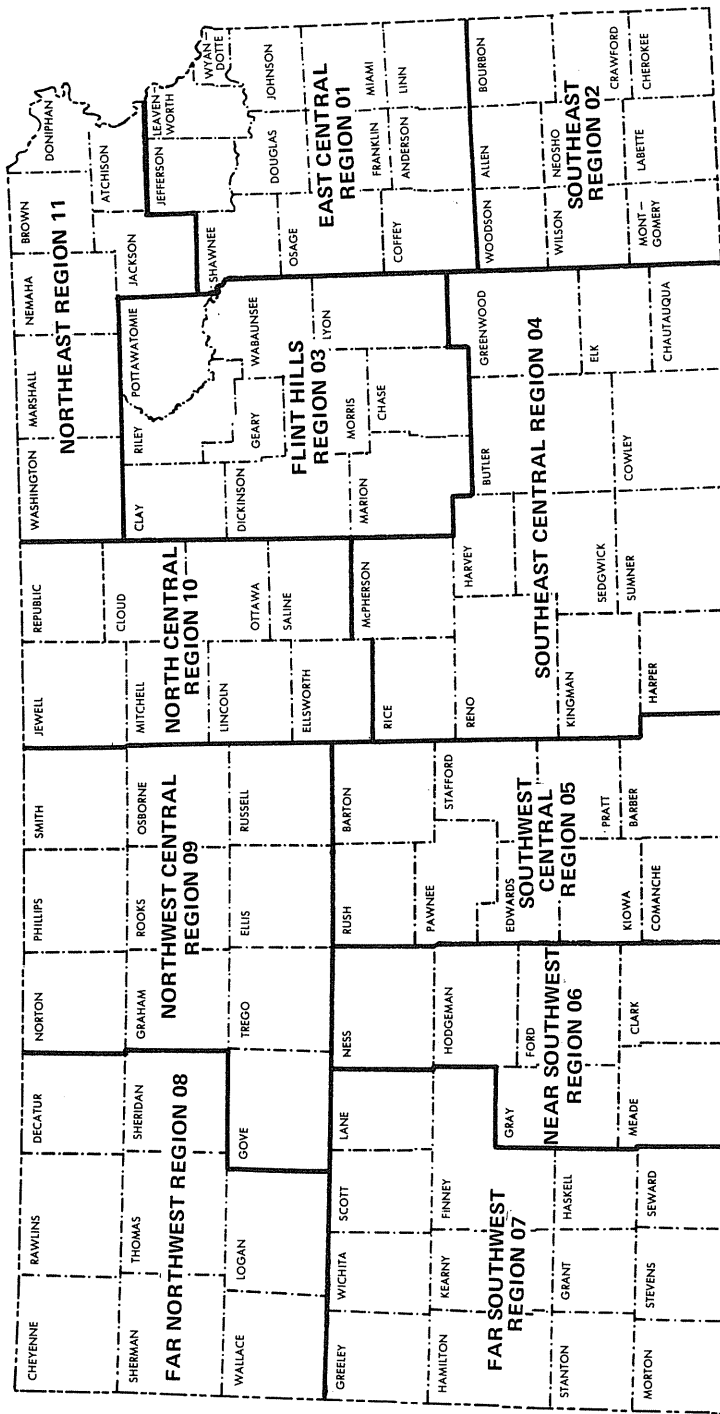

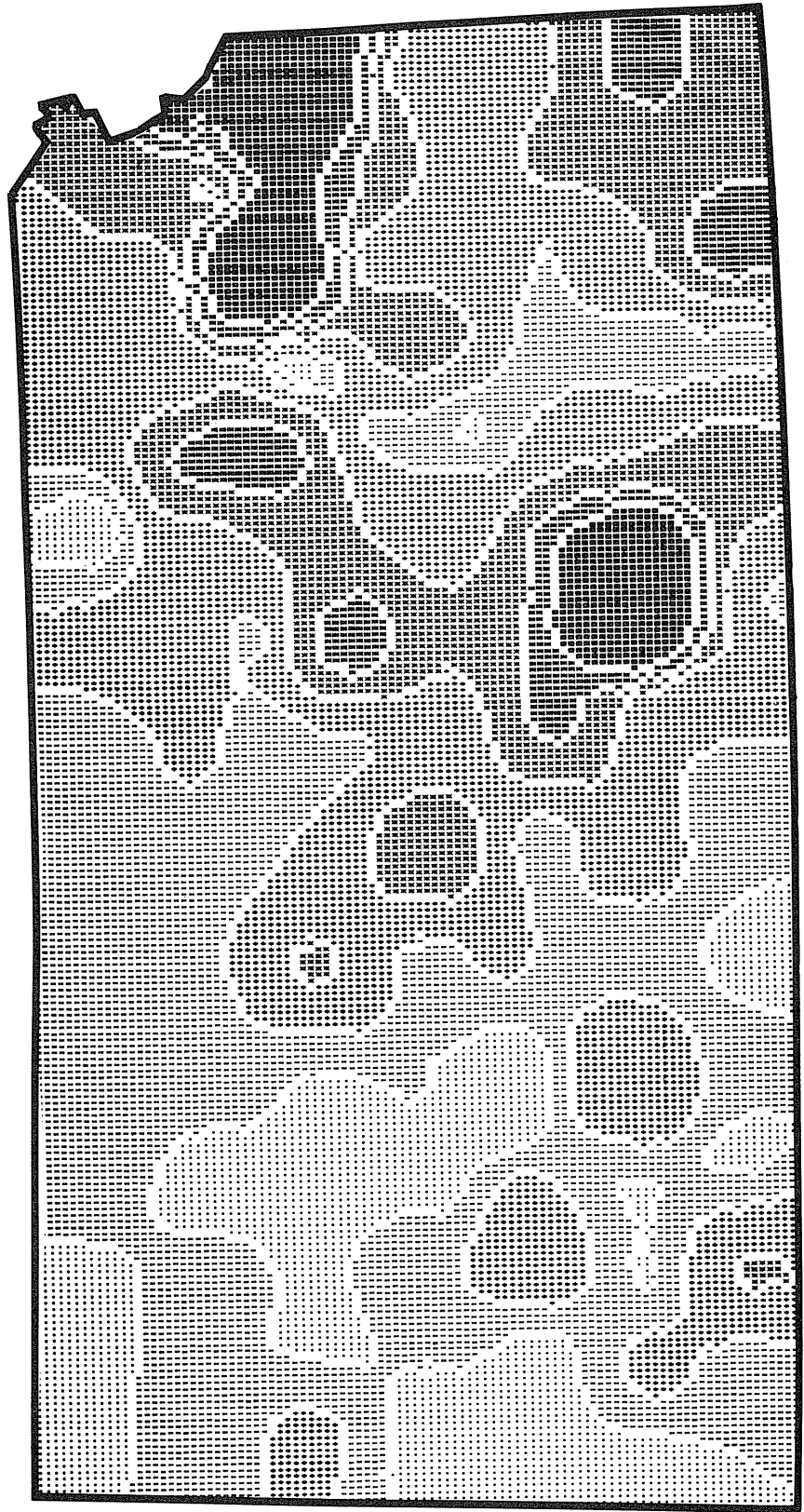

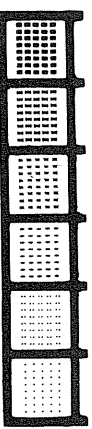
POPULATION DENSITY - 1972

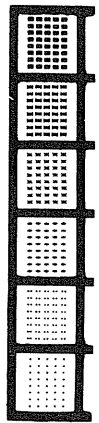

# HOSPITAL UTILIZATION — 1972

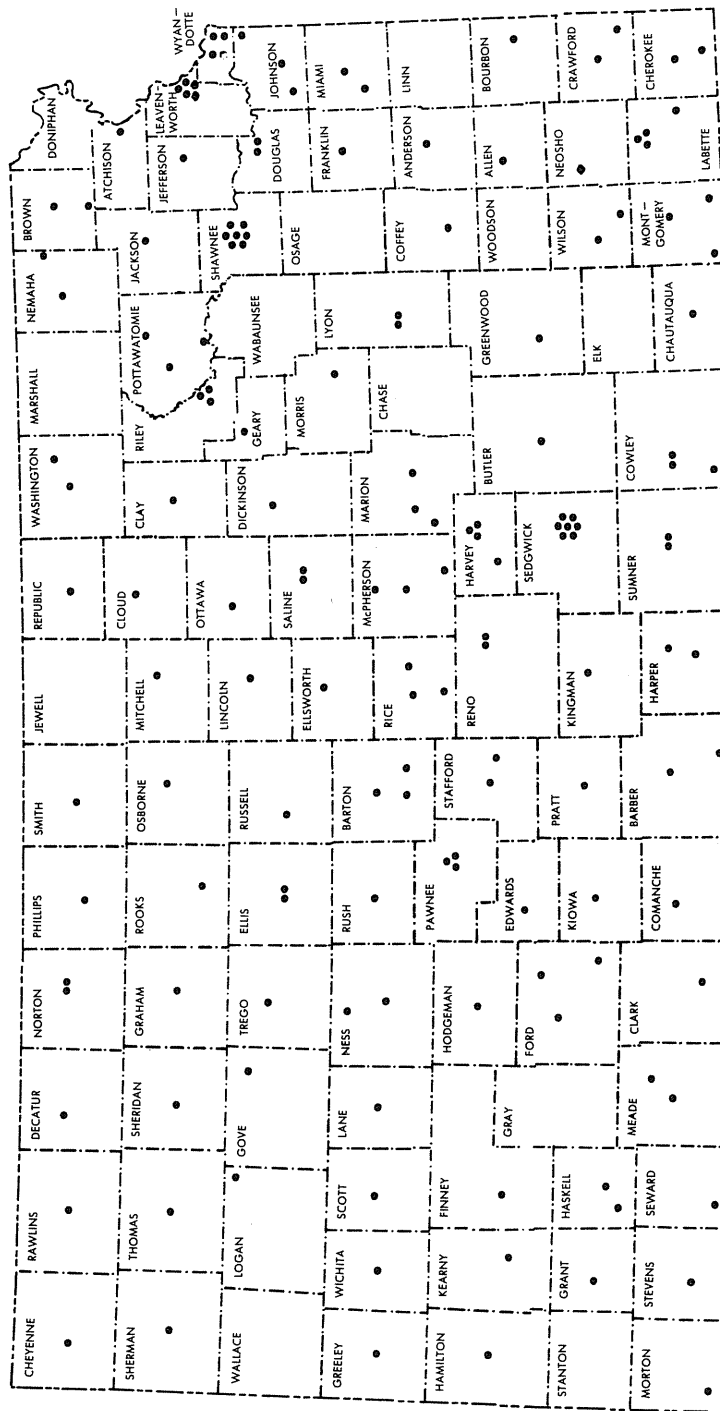

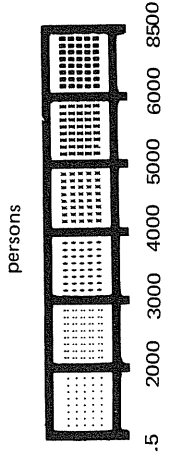

PERSONS PER DOCTOR — 1972



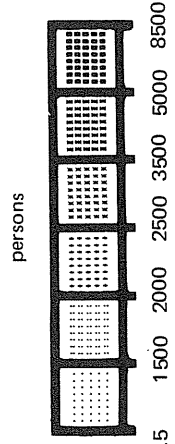

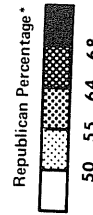
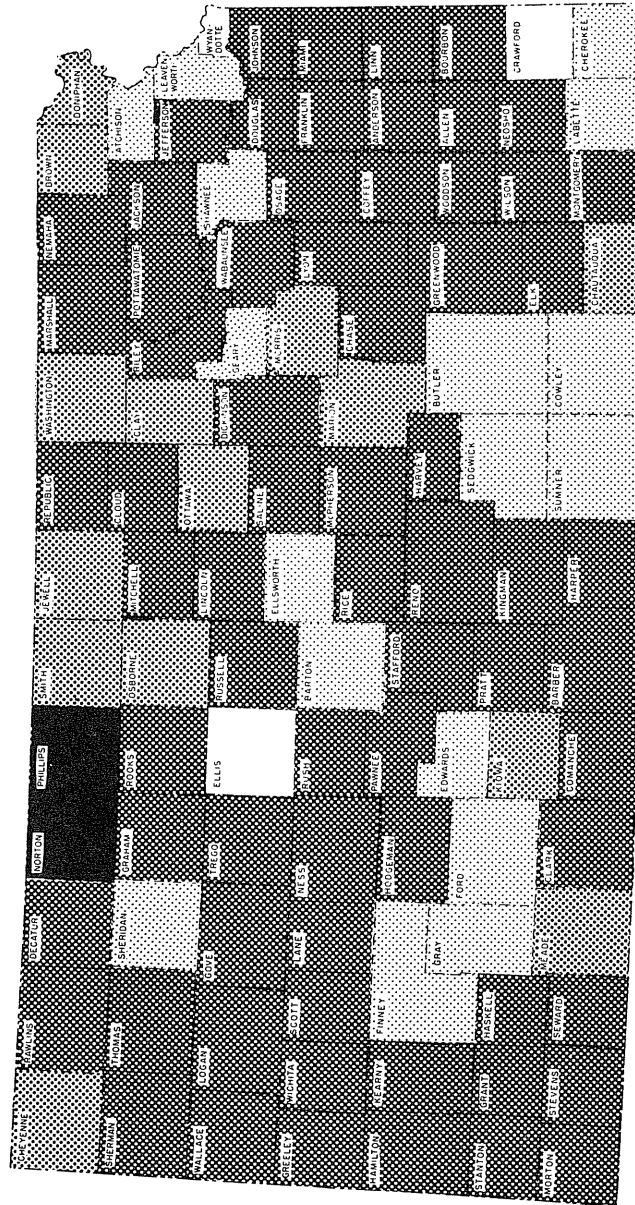

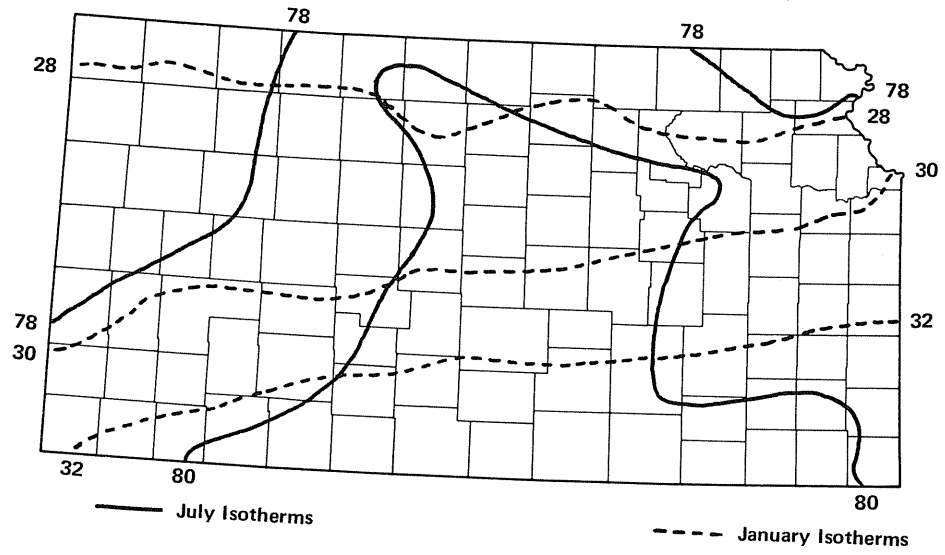

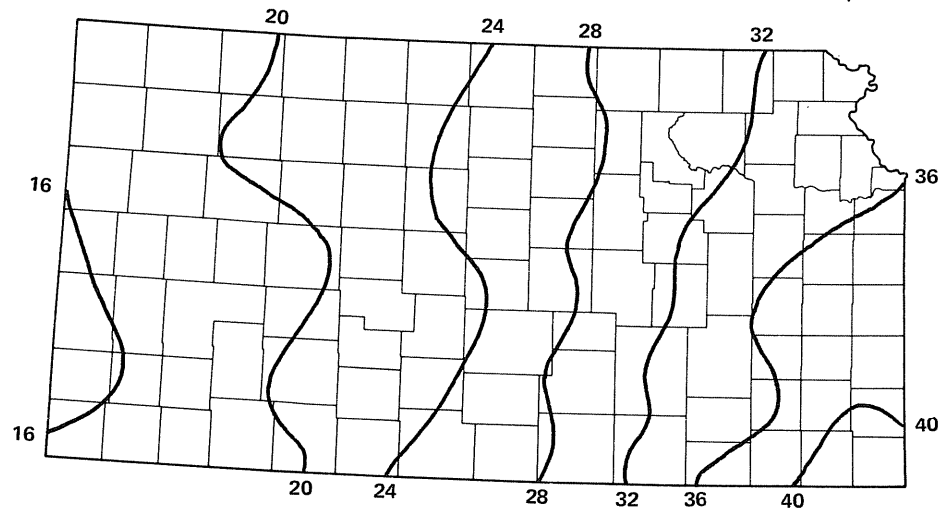

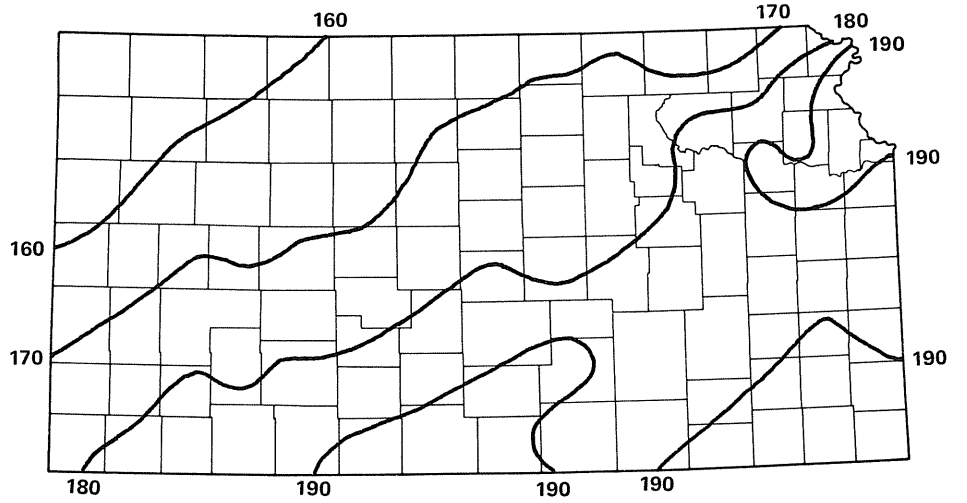
### KANSAS AVERAGE DAILY TEMPERATURES, (°F)



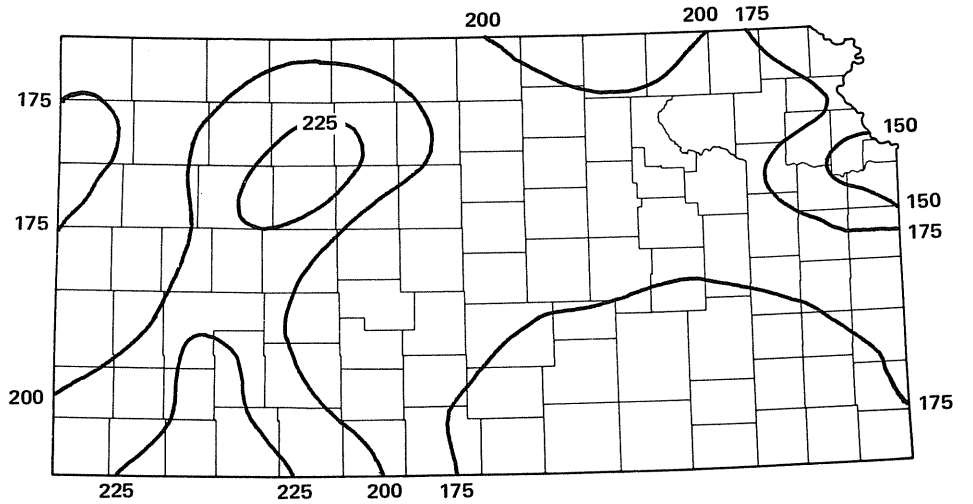
### KANSAS AVERAGE ANNUAL PRECIPITATION, (INCHES)

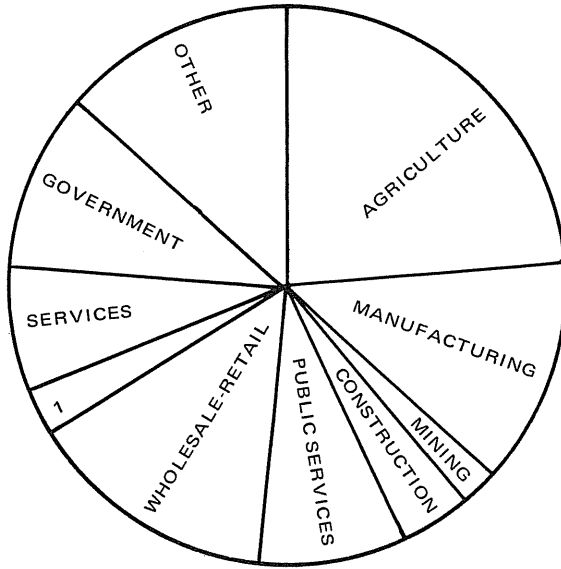

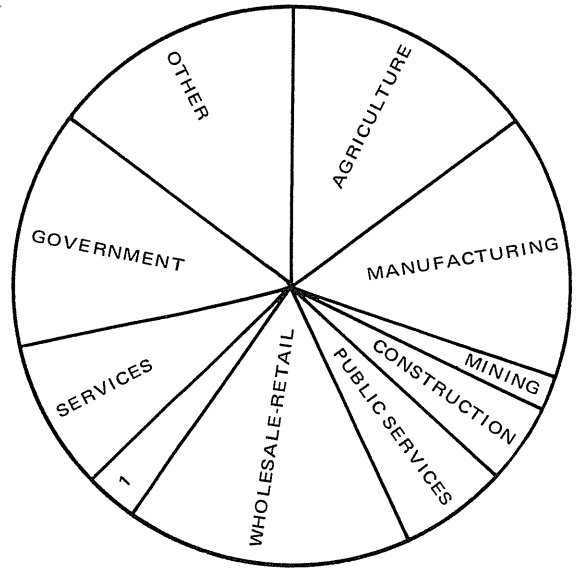

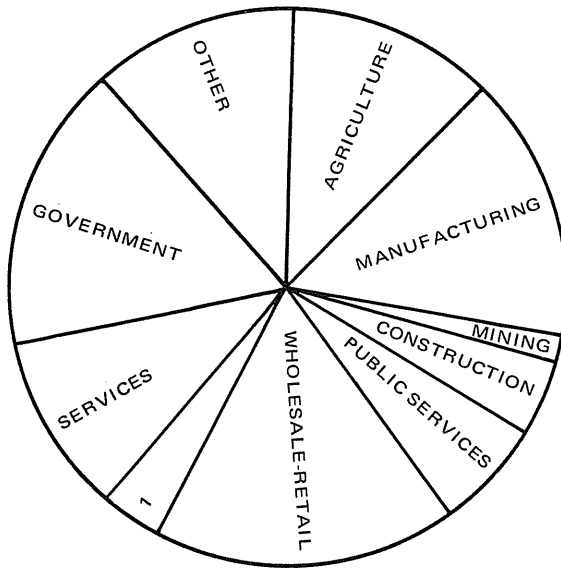
### EMPLOYMENT IN KANSAS BY SECTORS 1950-1970



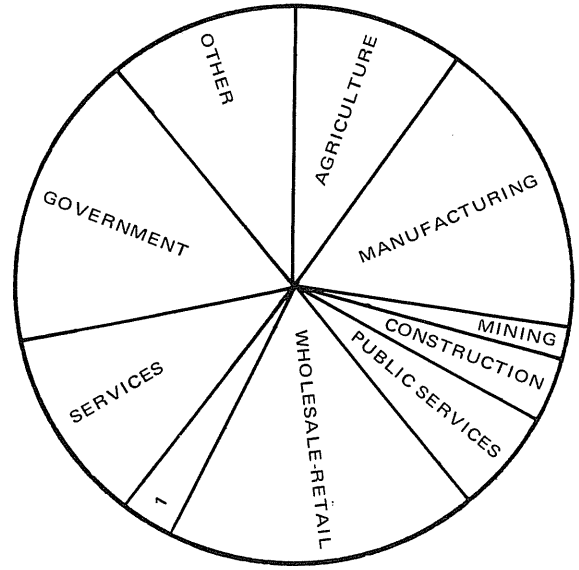

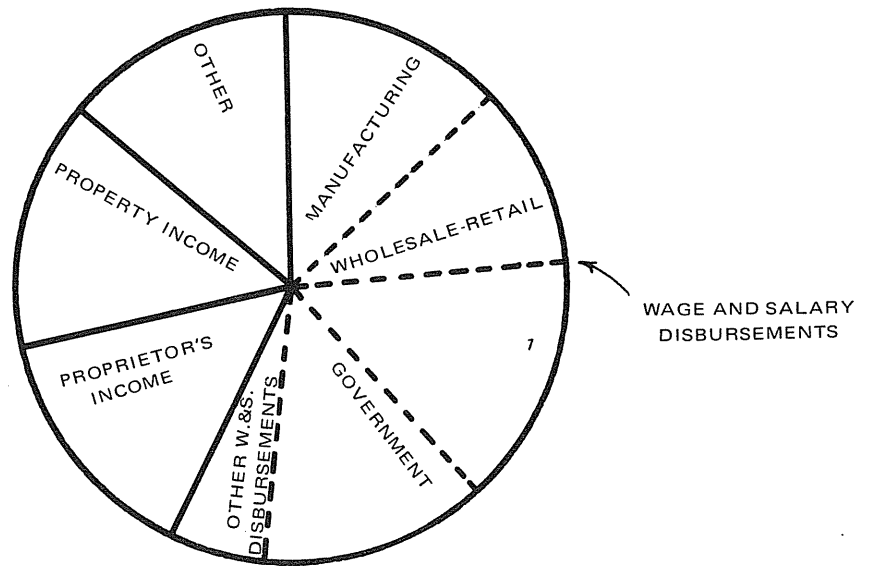

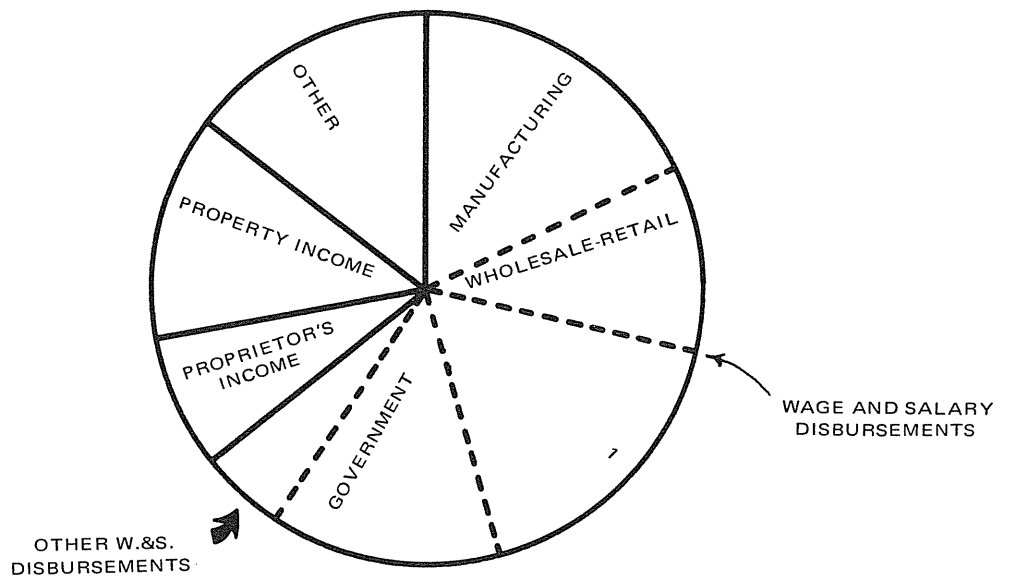

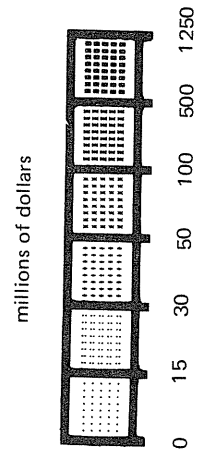

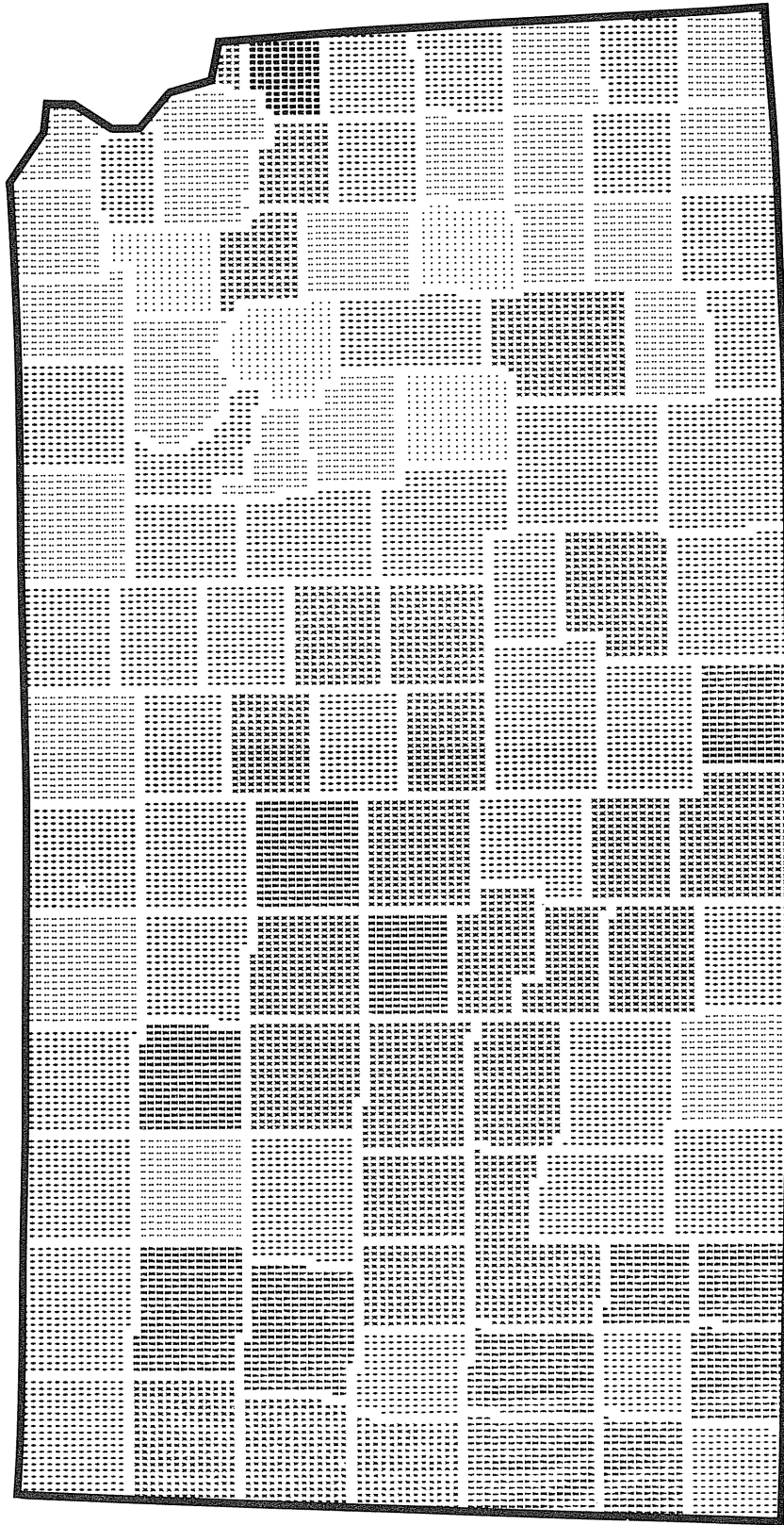

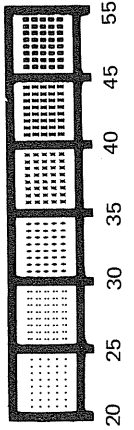
NET DOLLAR INCOME — 1972



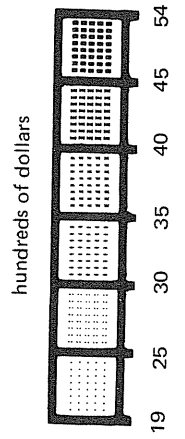
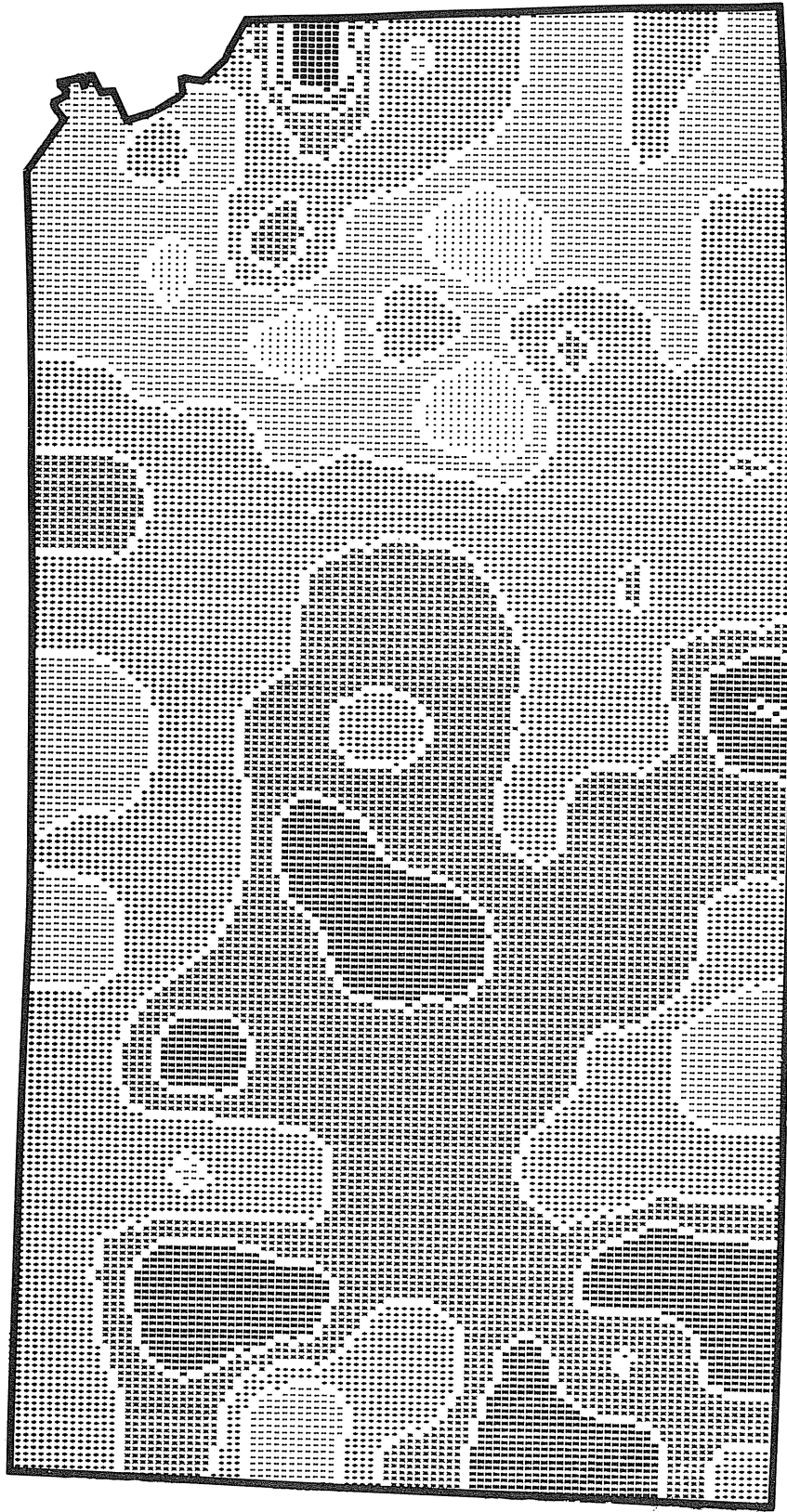
PER CAPITA INCOME — 1972

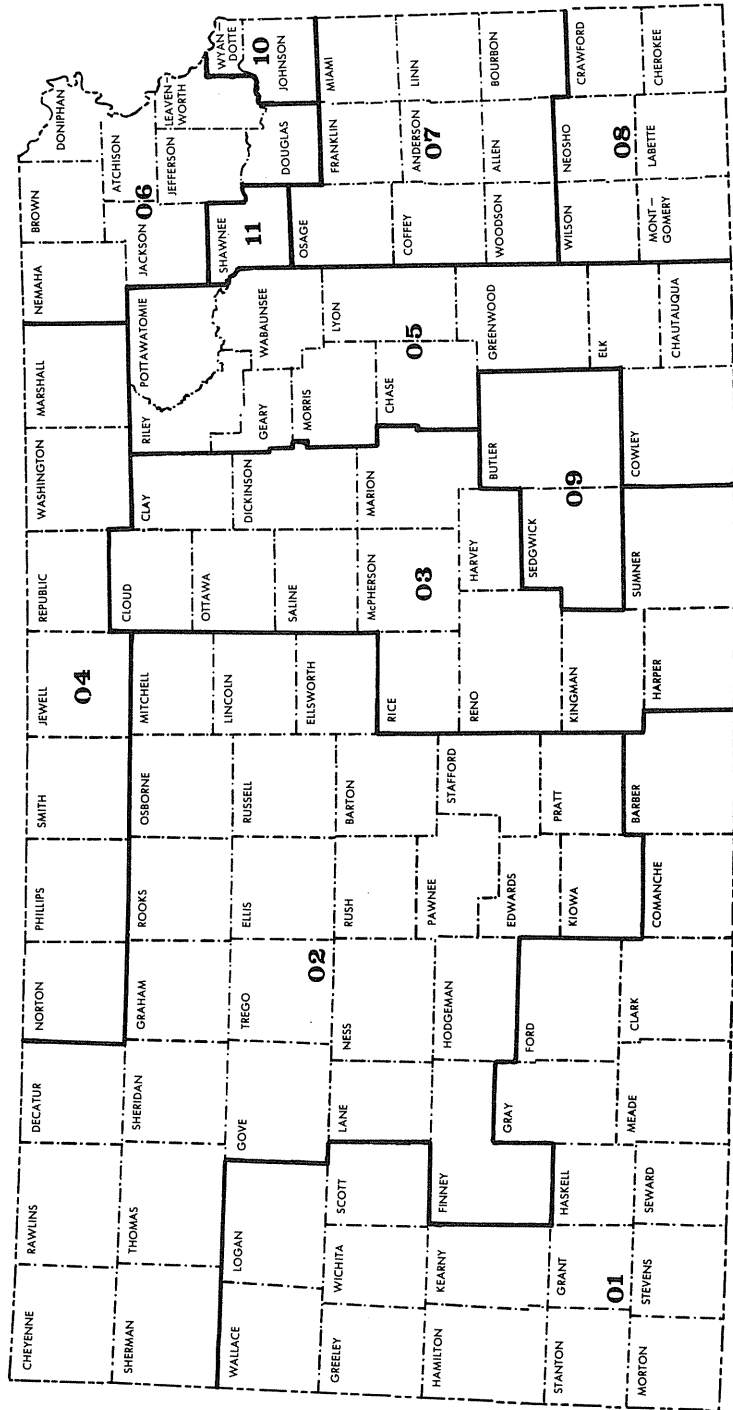

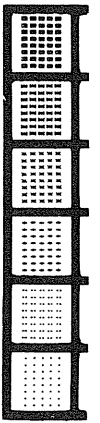

VIOLENT CRIMES — 1972

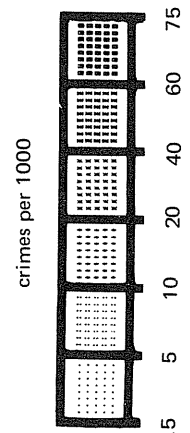

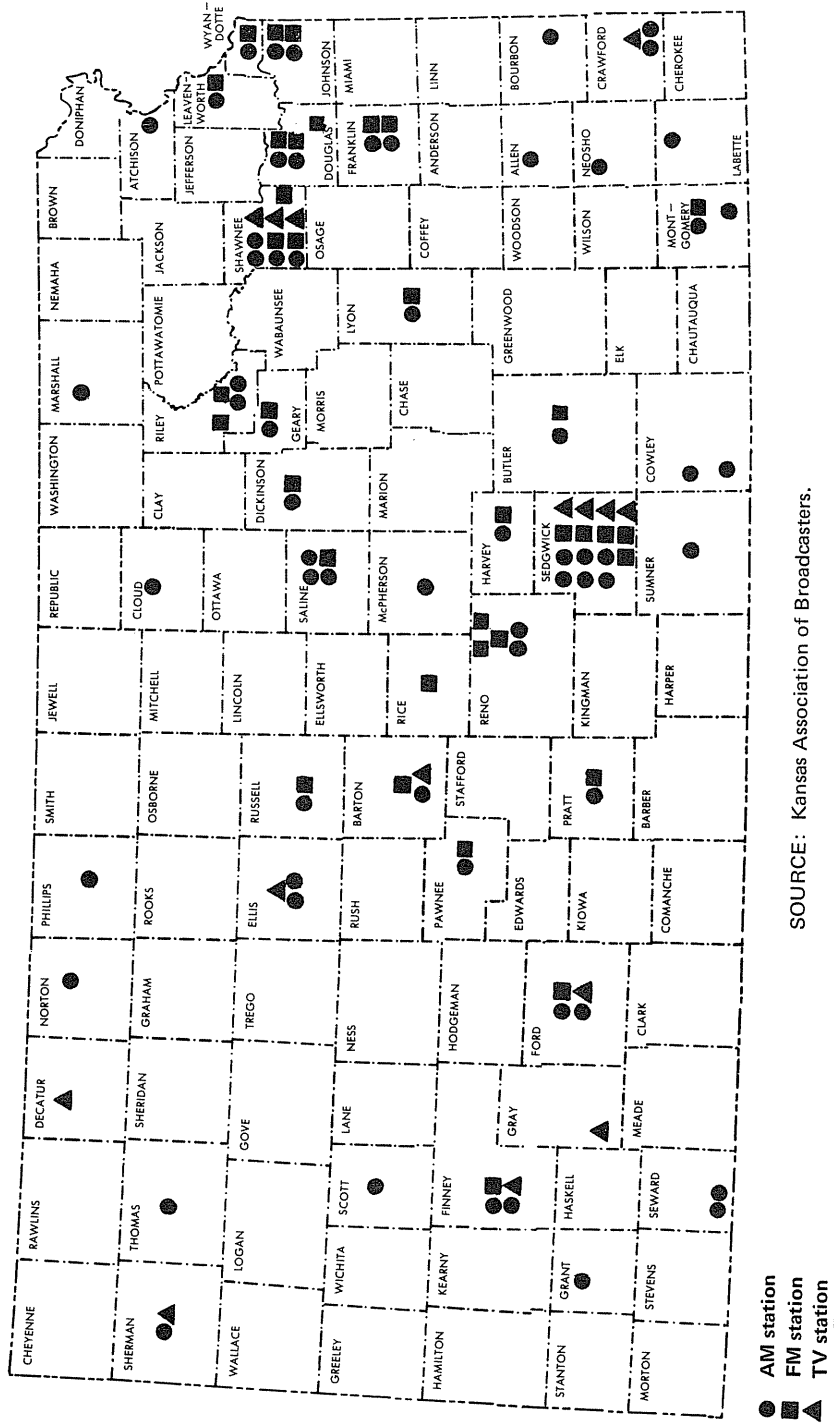

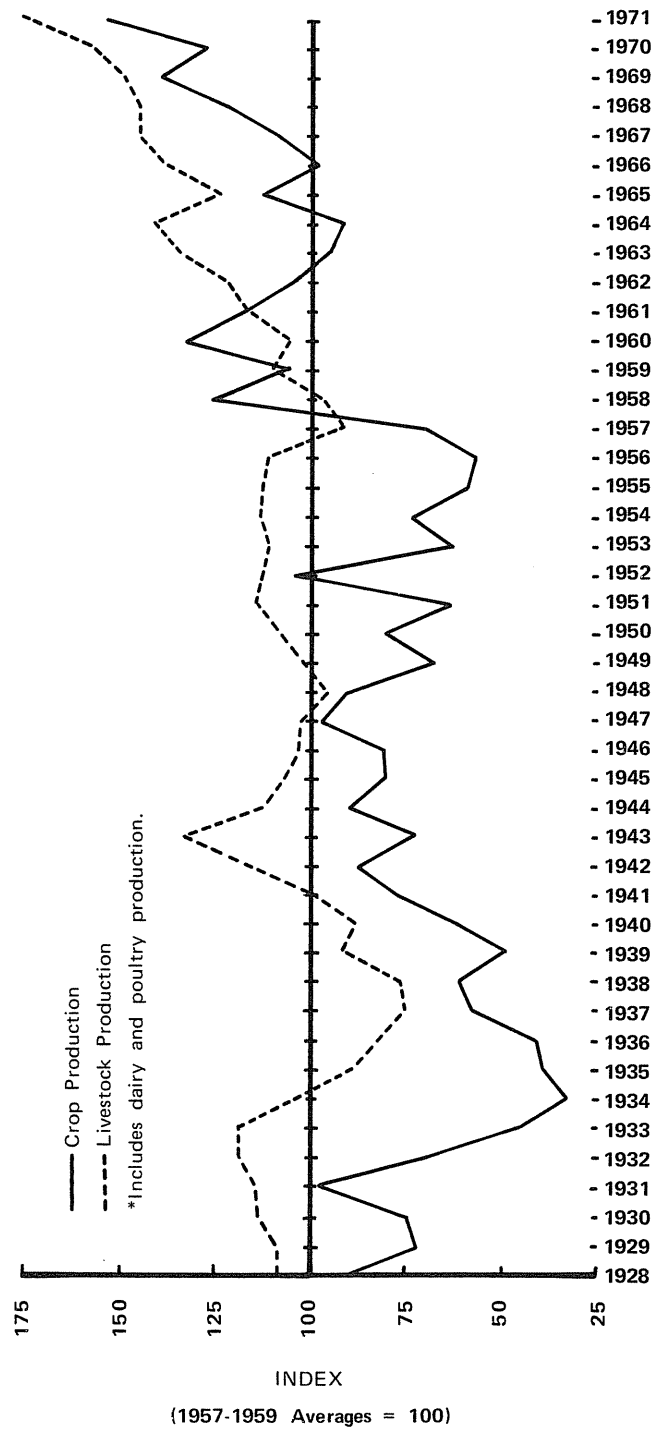
