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## INTRODUCTION

THE INSTITUTE FOR SOCIAL AND ENVIRONMENTAL STUDIES (ISES), FORMERLY THE GOVERNMENTAL RESEARCH CENTER AND THE CENTER FOR REGIONAL STUDIES, WAS ORGANIZED TO PROVIDE INTERDISCIPLINARY RESEARCH IN THE SOCIAL AND ENVIRONMENTAL SCIENCES AS WELL AS TO COLLECT, ANALYZE AND DISSEMINATE INFORMATION ON STATE AND LOCAL GOVERNMENT OPERATIONS IN KANSAS. ALONG WITH THESE ACTIVITIES, THE INSTITUTE SERVES AS A CENSUS SUMMARY TAPE PROCESSING CENTER FOR THE STATE OF KANSAS. IN THIS CAPACITY, ISES OFFERS ANNOTATED LISTINGS OF 1970 CENSUS DATA, DISPLAYS OF THE DATA EITHER IN GRAPHIC OR MAP FORM, AND ANALYSIS OF INFORMATION FOR PLANNING APPLICATIONS. SOME OF THE CENSUS DATA FOR KANSAS AND THE FORMS IN WHICH IT CAN BE PRESENTED ARE CONTAINED IN THIS *ABSTRACT*.

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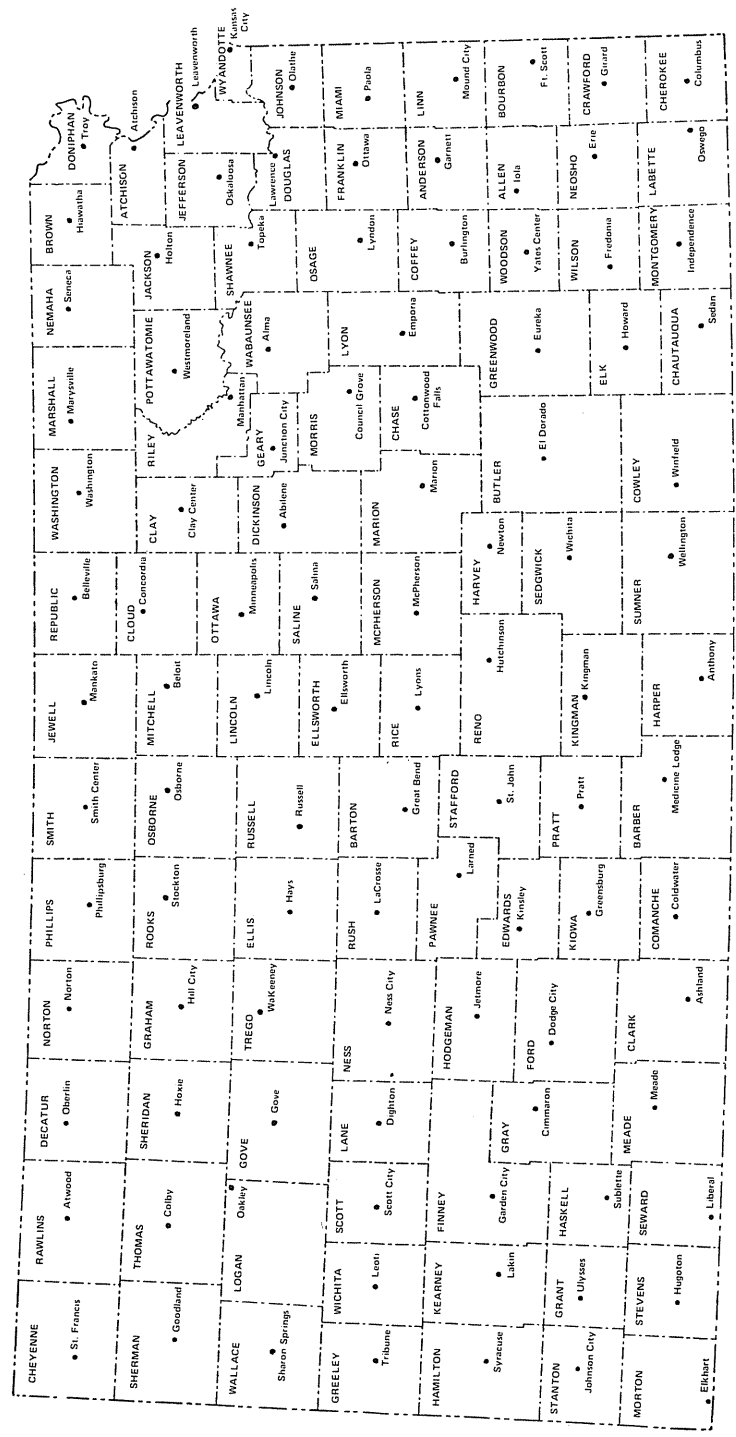

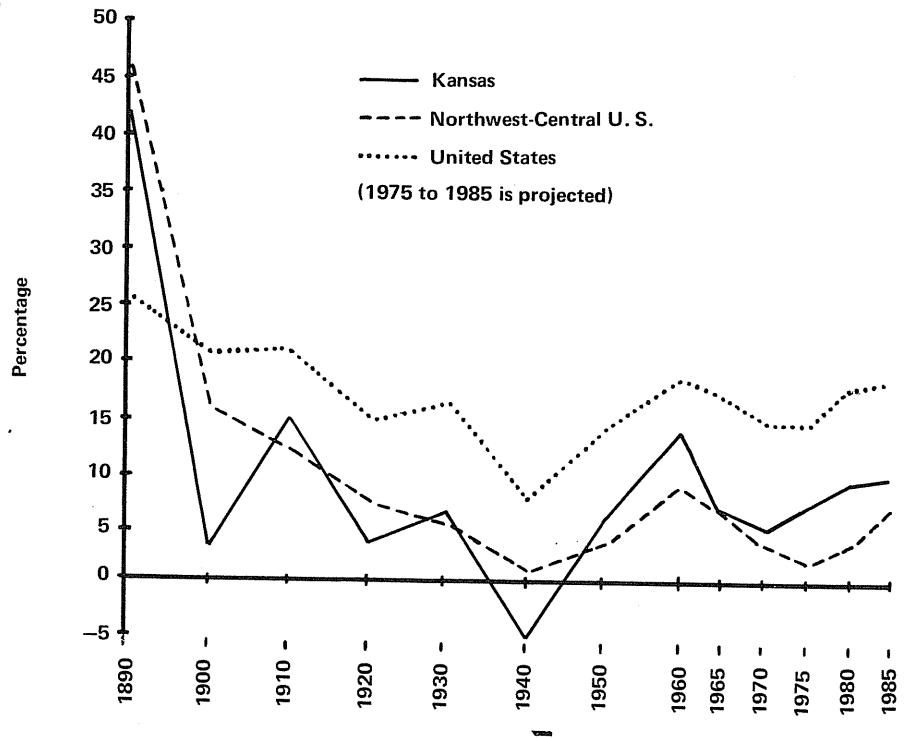

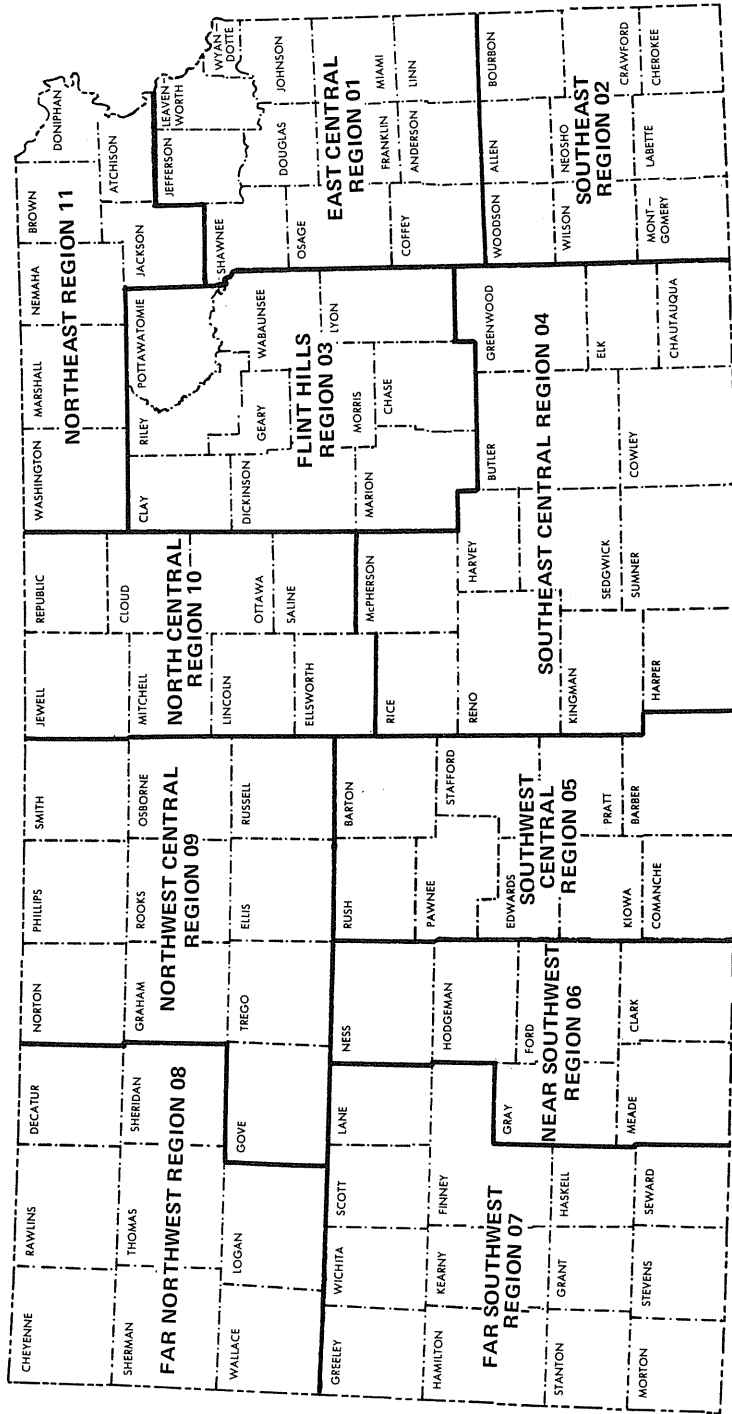

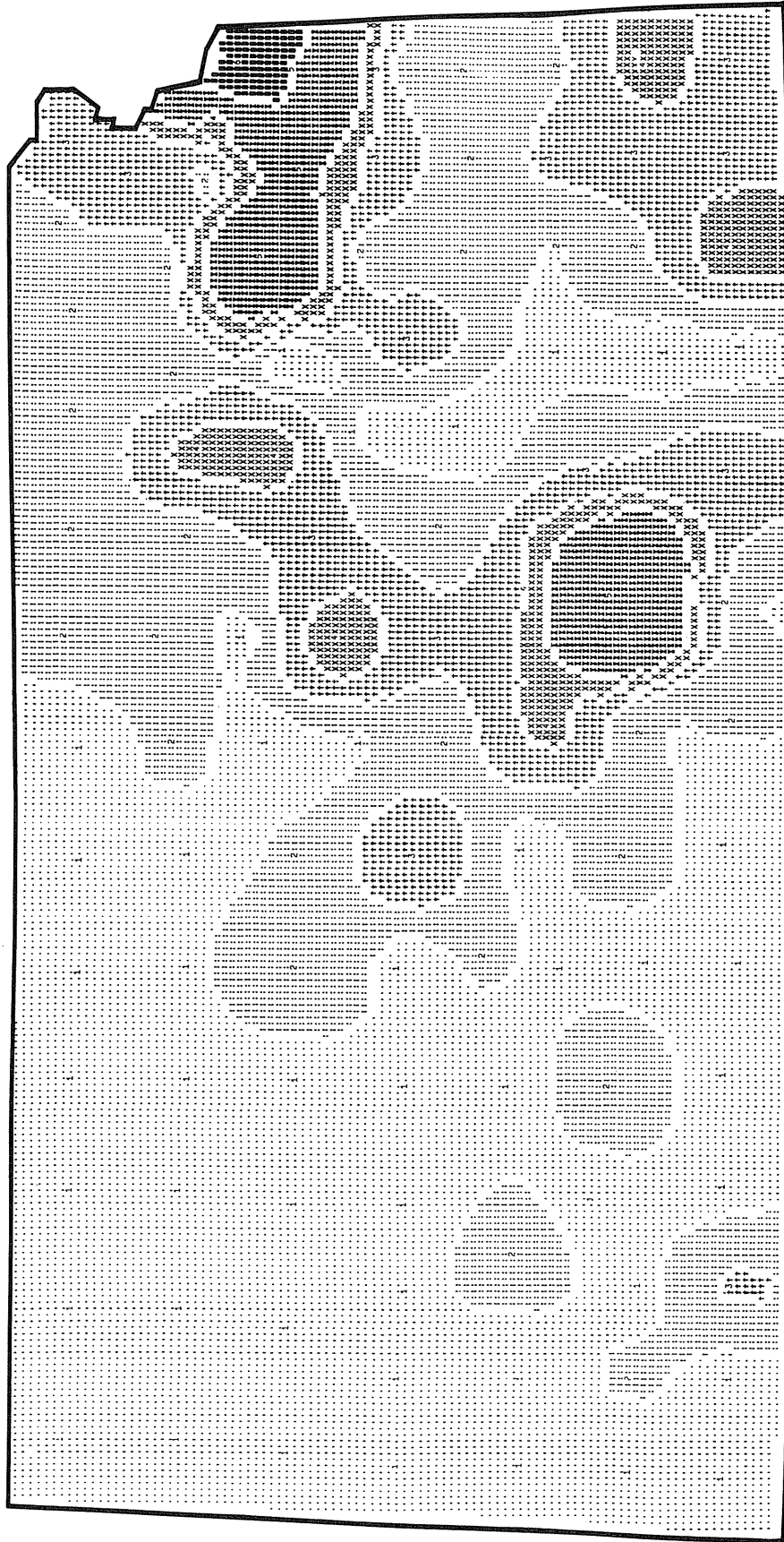

KANSAS POPULATION DENSITY BY COUNTY, 1971

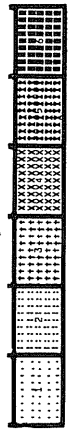


PERSONS PER SQUARE MILE

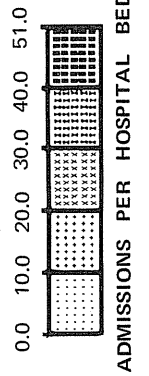
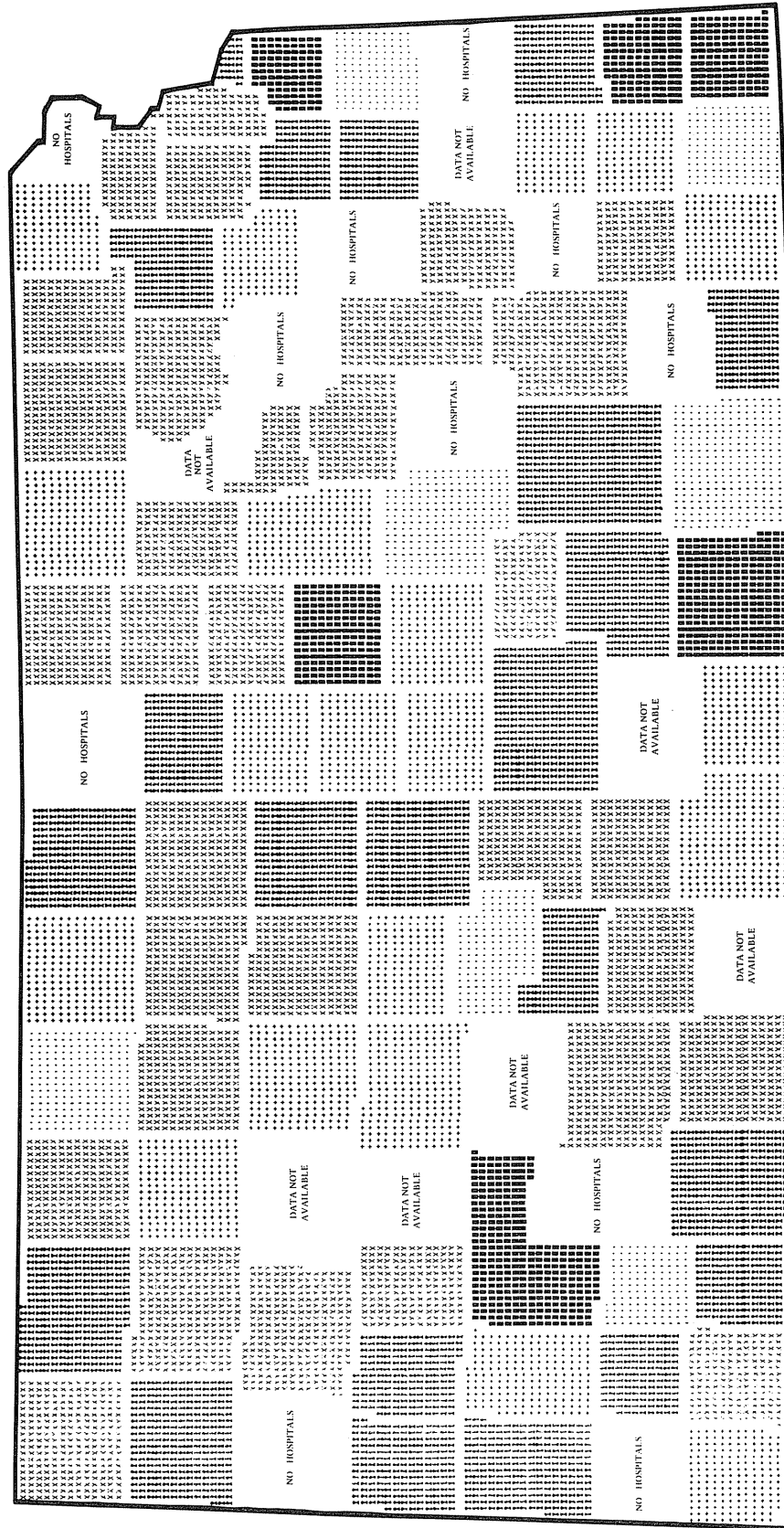

UTILIZATION OF HOSPITALS IN KANSAS BY COUNTY, 1970





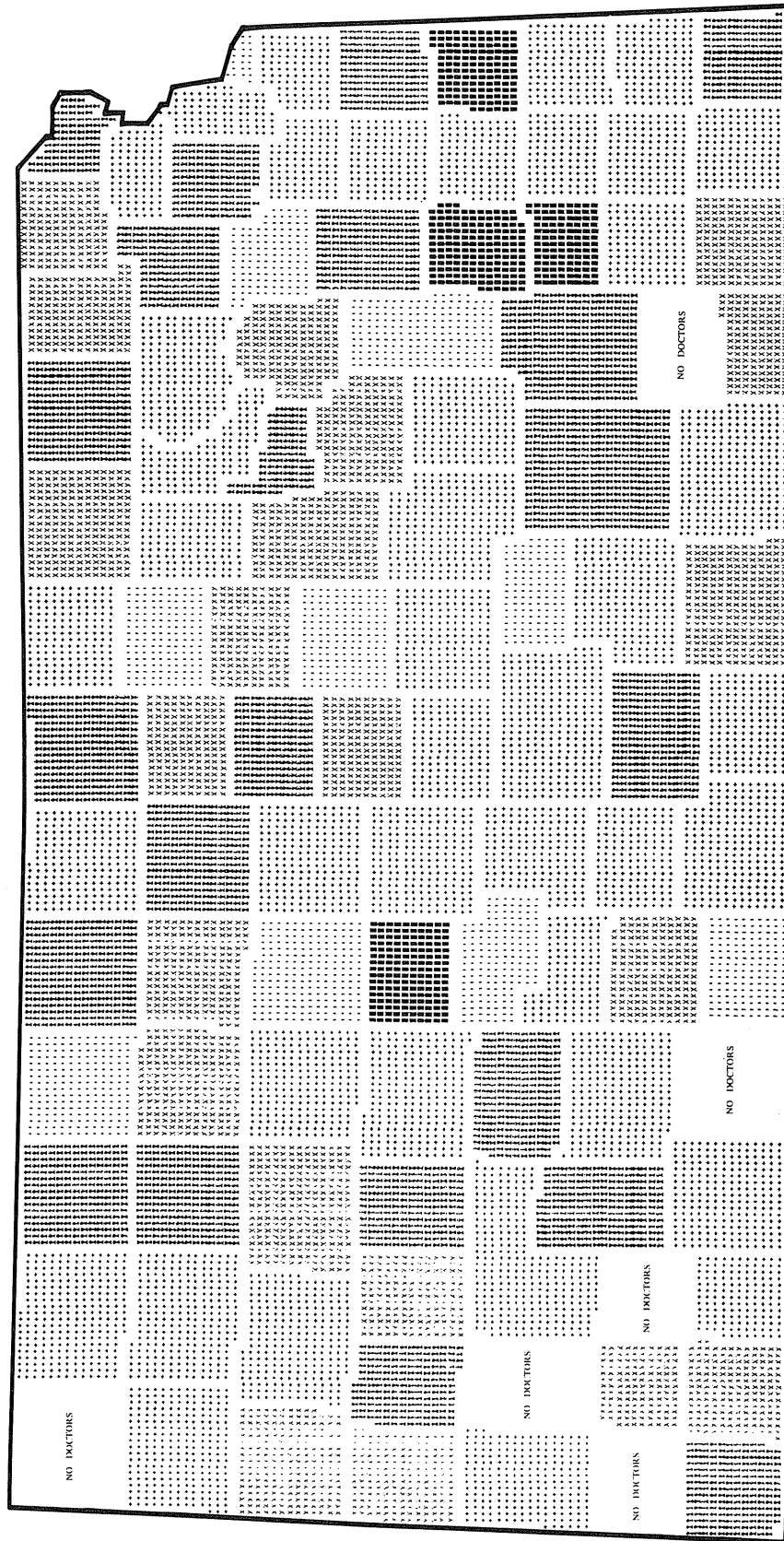

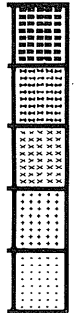

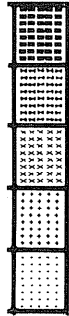

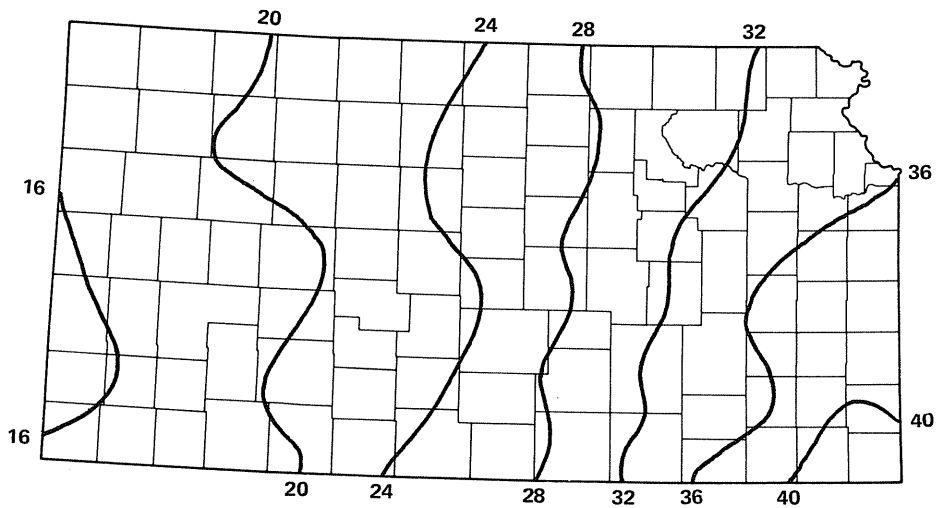

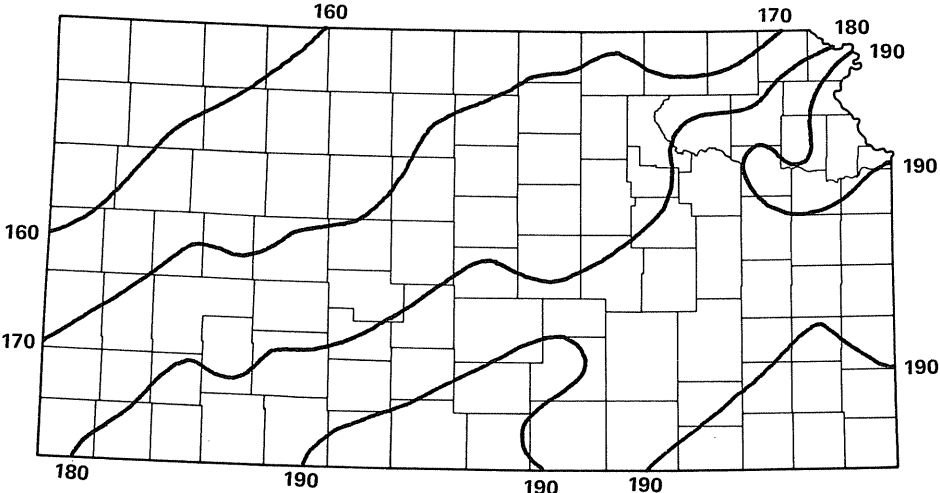
### KANSAS AVERAGE DAILY TEMPERATURES, (°F)



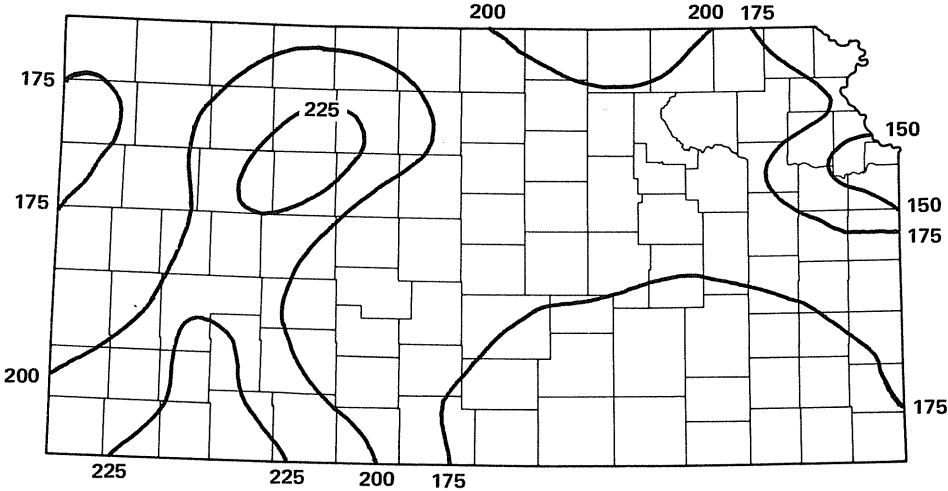
### KANSAS AVERAGE ANNUAL PRECIPITATION, (INCHES)

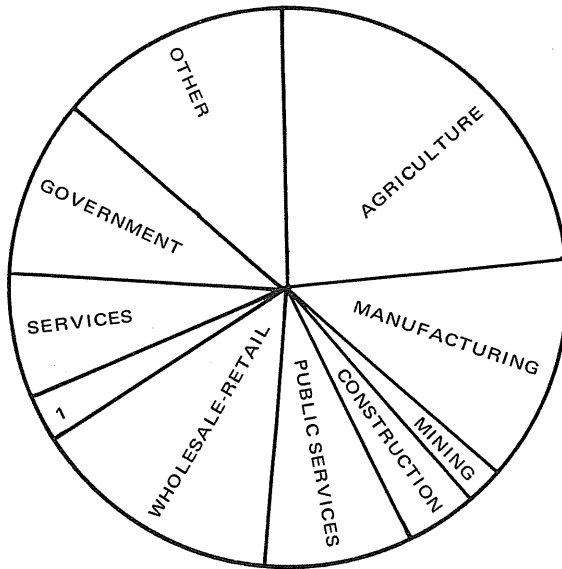

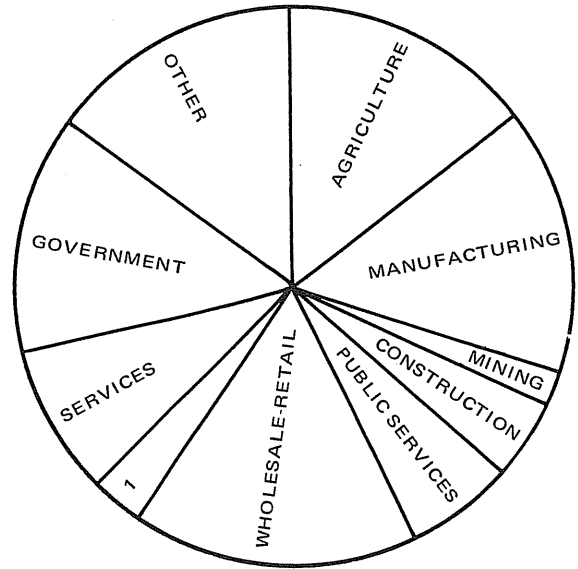

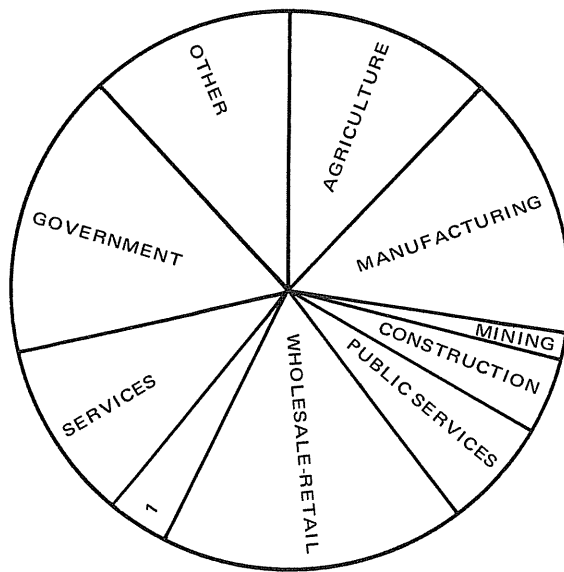
### EMPLOYMENT IN KANSAS BY SECTORS 1950-1970



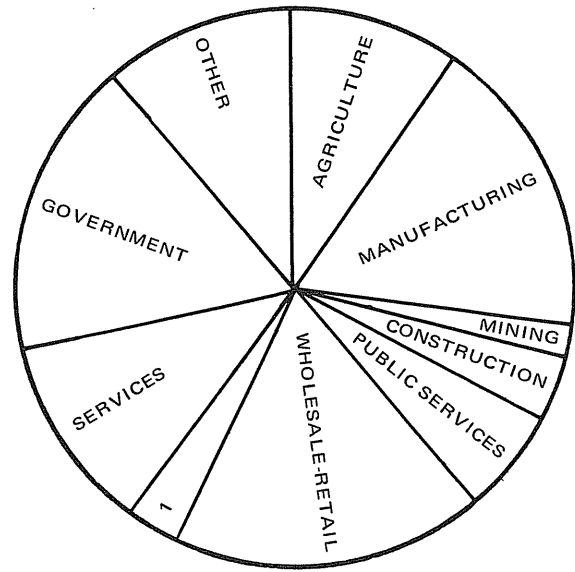

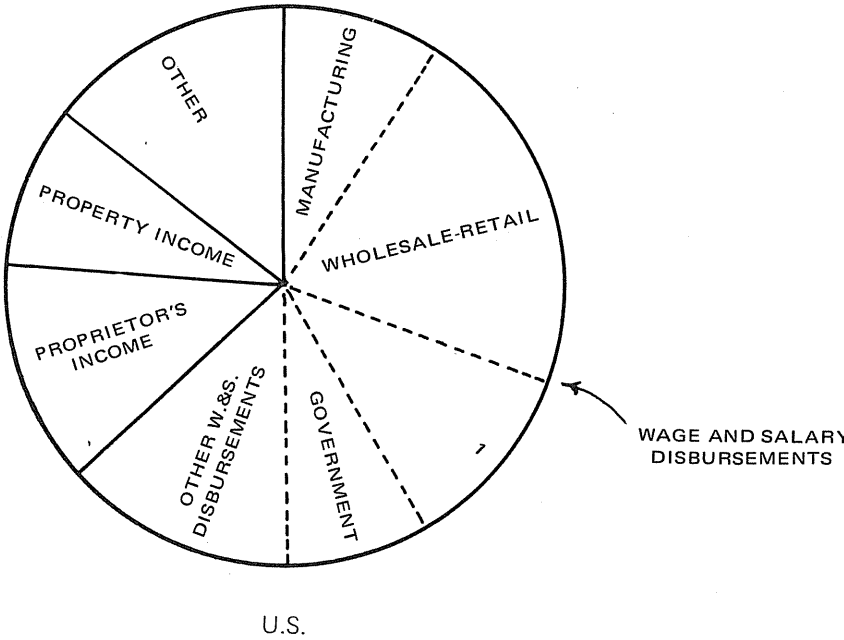
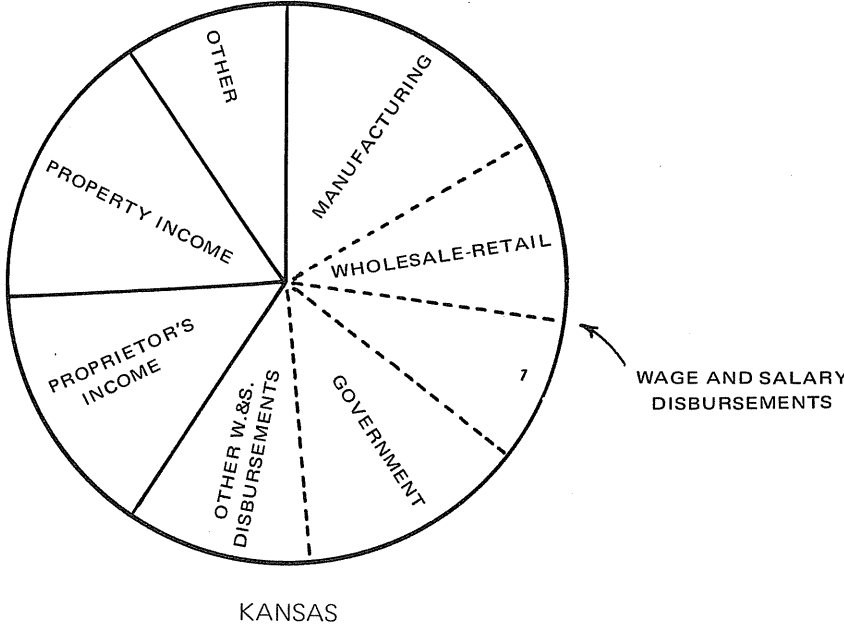

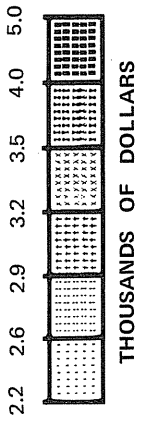

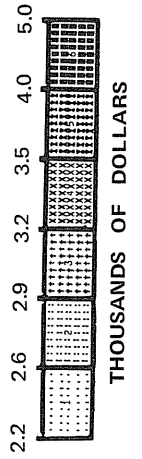
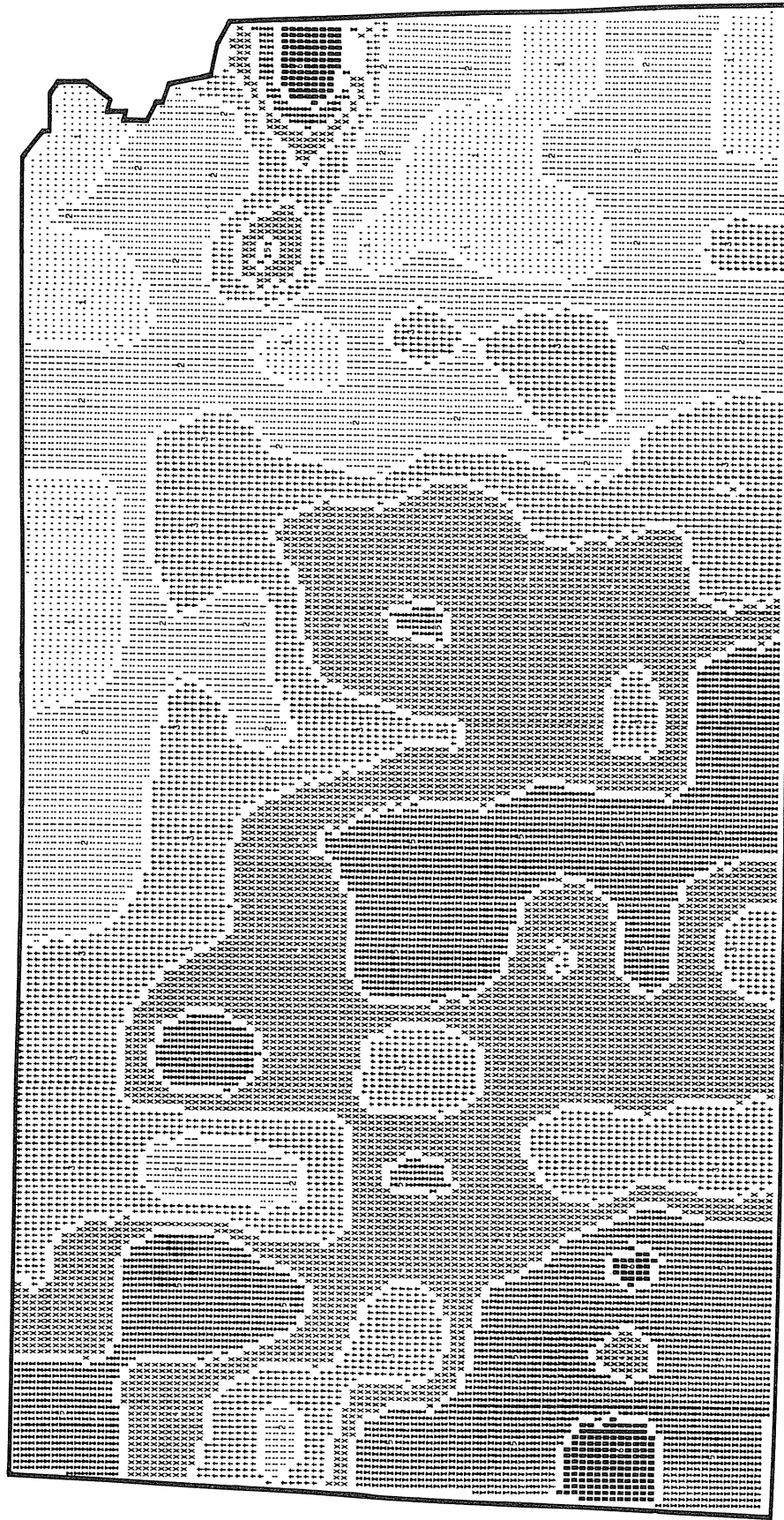
KANSAS NET DOLLARS OF BUYING INCOME BY COUNTY, 1970

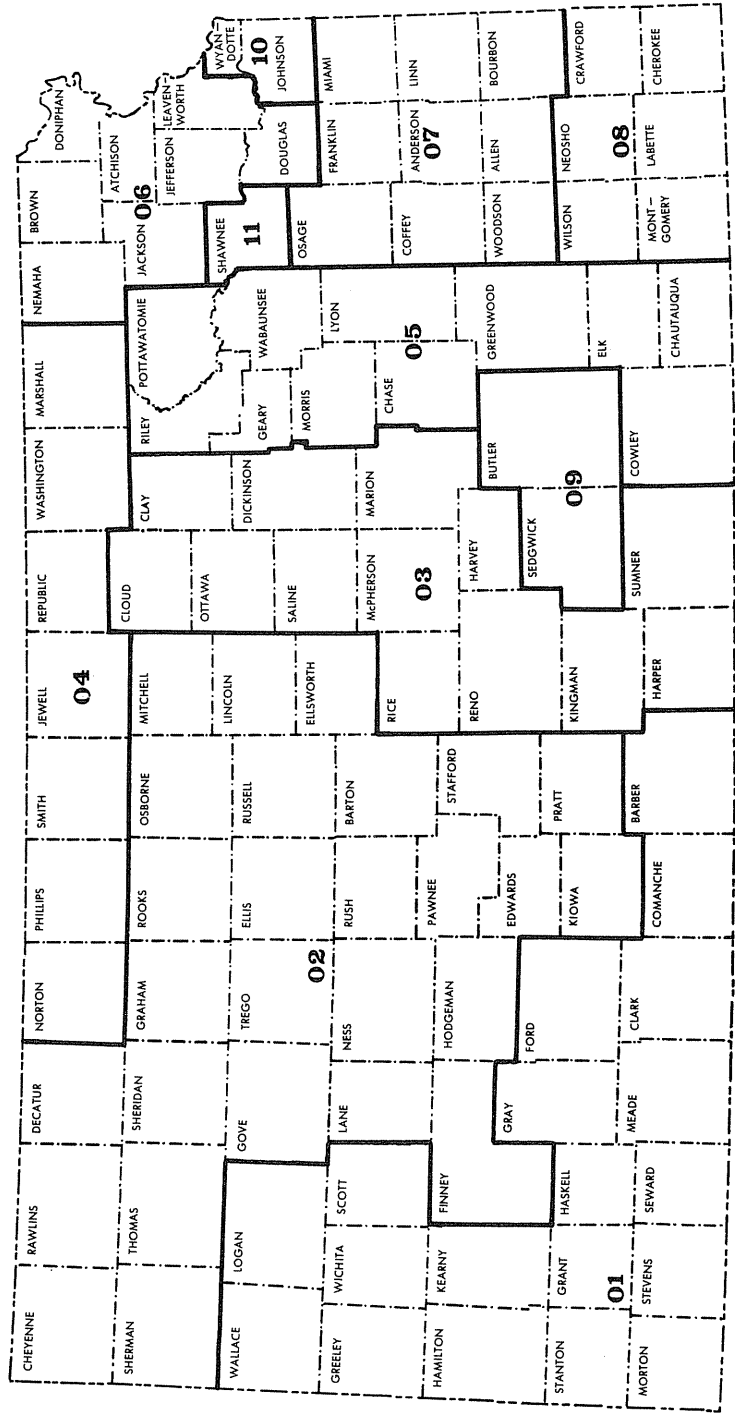

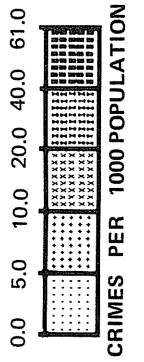

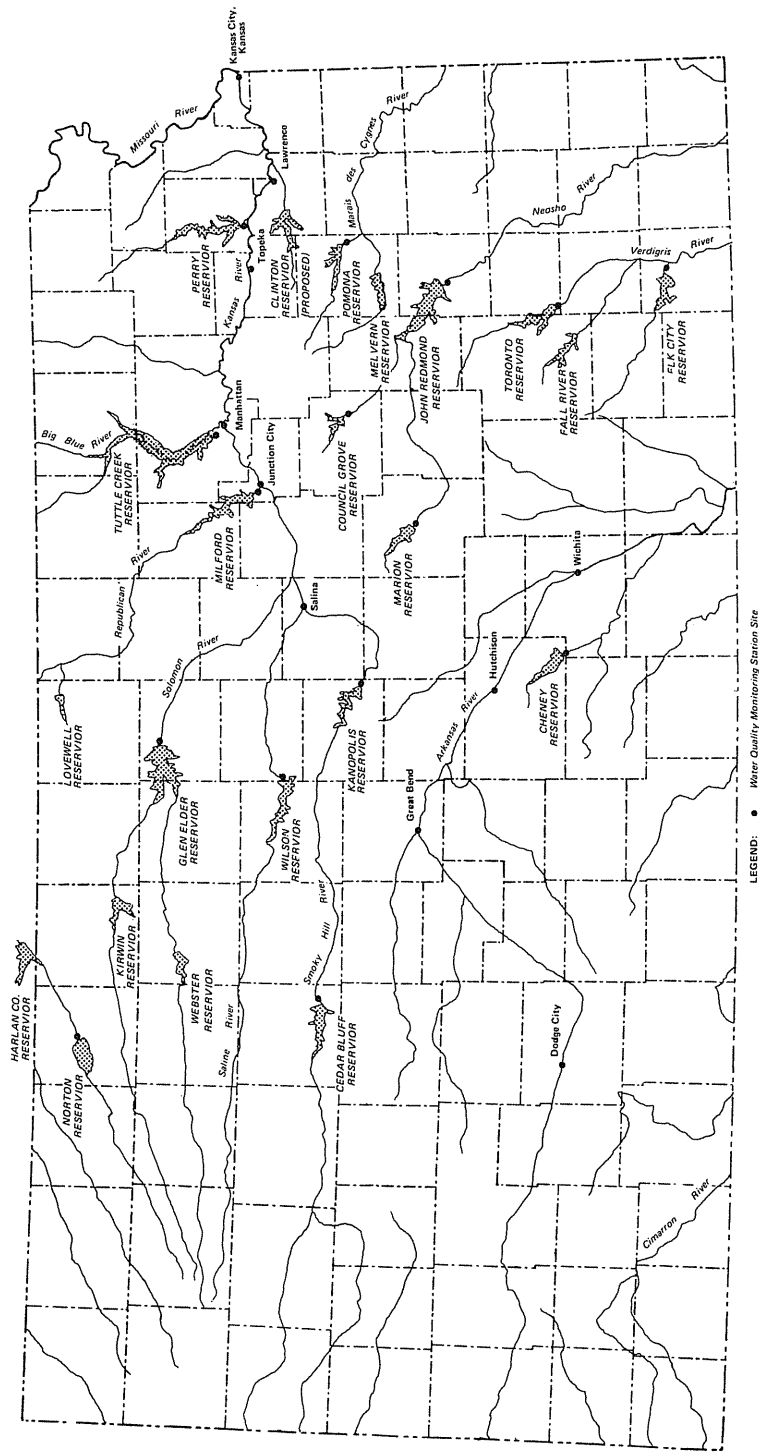

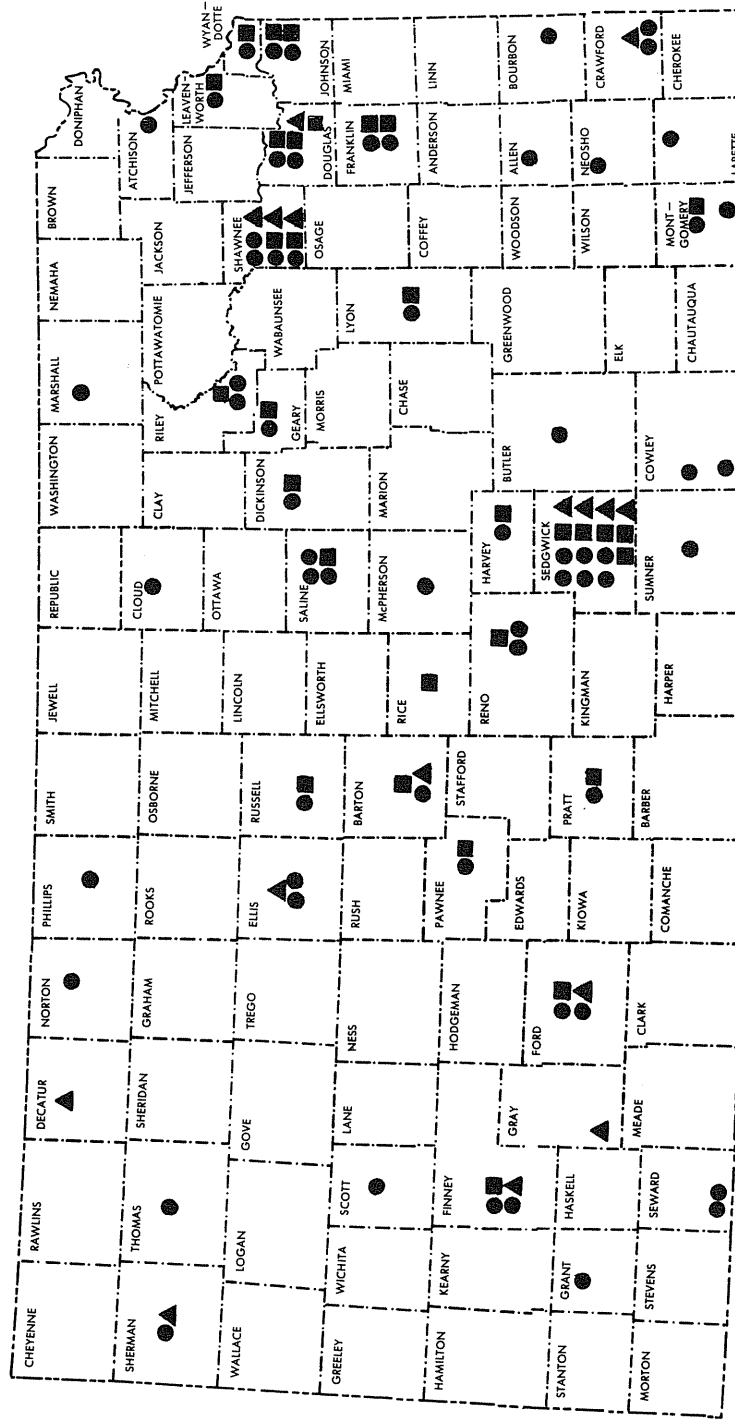

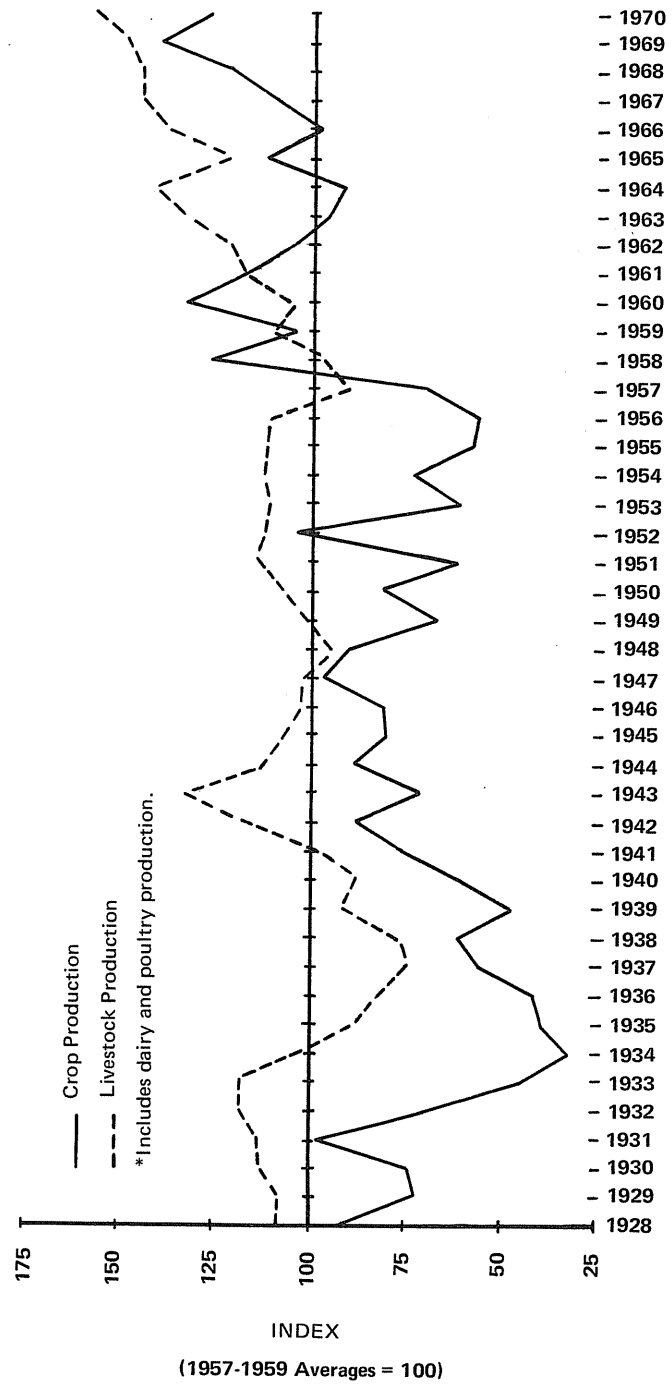
