Executive Summary

ADMINISTRATION & PERSONNEL

Budget

NLM sent Option Year 1 budget questions to the MCR in early March. Staff responded to questions and the budget was resubmitted two weeks later with changes. In mid-March, the RML sent in a request to extend the Base Year subcontracts for Creighton University, University of Nebraska and University of Kansas. At the end of March, the MCR responded to a call from NLM for a budget should additional funds become available. In mid-April, NLM called for the final budget submission. Claire Hamasu, Associate Director, and Robert Millsap, Financial Analyst, developed the budget scenario using unexpended non-severable funds to extend the Base Year for selected Resource Libraries. They also added items using additional funds that that NLM had added to the Option Year 1 budget.

Personnel

The Kansas/Technology Coordinator position was re-advertised. RML staff participated in the recruitment process. Rachel Vukas was recruited and began working on March 19/2012. MCR staff provided Ms. Vukas with orientation sessions.

Recruitment for the Financial Analyst position was successful. Robert Millsap was hired and began February 13, 2012.

The RML is finally fully staffed!

The MCR proposed a .5 fte web developer for the additional funding from NLM for Option Year 1.

EDUCATION

Jean Shipman, Director, was contacted by MLA about submitting two members to attend the half-day disaster workshops following the annual meeting. Ms. Hamasu opened up the opportunity to the region and offered to cover travel expenses. Two Network members applied and were approved.

By the end of the year, twenty-three members in the region had received Professional Development Awards to attend conferences and take workshops. Webinars were scheduled late in April for recipients to share what they had learned at these events.

LIBRARY ADVOCACY

Jim Honour, Wyoming/Member Services Coordinator, was notified by the librarian at AORN in Colorado that the library was being affected by the organization's restructuring and new business plan. As a result the library is putting its DOCLINE account on hold. In further conversation, Barb Jones, Missouri/Library Advocacy Coordinator, learned that the organization's new management is not a library supporter. The library is being physically downsized and the collection is, too. Permission to offer holdings to other libraries was denied. The MCR wrote a letter of support in the guise of a thank you letter to the librarian for serving on the Regional Advisory Board. The librarian responded that the letter was appreciated and very timely.

The librarian of the Campbell County Memorial Hospital in Wyoming also notified Mr. Honour

that she was downsizing her collection because the library was being moved to a smaller space.

The MCR staff heard that the librarian position at the American Academy of Family Physicians in Kansas was vacant. Mr. Honour followed up and learned that they were recruiting. The new librarian started in April.

HEALTH INFORMATION LITERACY

Ms. Jones met with the Principal Investigator of the University of Missouri's Health Literacy Certificate program funded by the Missouri Foundation for Health. He was enthusiastic about the resources available and the support the library could provide.

Refugee Support Outreach

Responding to the efforts of Dana Abbey, Colorado/Health Information Literacy Coordinator, the Refugee Health Education Resource Center in Denver submitted a brochure on bed bugs to RHIN in 4 languages. Marty Magee, Nebraska/Education Coordinator, and Monica Rogers, Health Information Literacy Coordinator, met with representatives from the Refugee Resettlement Program and the Refugee Health Coordinator from the Nebraska Department of Health to show them multi-language health resources and begin discussion on reaching the audience that could use these materials. Ms. Magee has met with the Omaha Refugee Task Force and the New Americans Task Force to introduce the different language materials offered by MedlinePlus. Ms. Rogers contacted the co-investigator for the Florence Clinica Project (they serve refugees) about offering training for clinic staff.

BHIC

Ms. Rogers assumed management of the Bringing Health Information to the Community blog for the MCR in February. She rewrote the evaluation plan and changed how new readers are tracked. While her position was vacant management of the blog was assumed by Jacqueline Leskovec (GMR) and then Gail Kouame (PNR). We appreciated the support of our colleagues in keeping the blog operational during this interim. In March, the contributor from the NN/LM Greater Midwest Region resigned. Ms. Rogers put out a call for additional contributors and received three responses. She trained the new contributor from the NN/LM Middle Atlantic Region.

Health Literacy Nebraska

Ms. Magee and Ms. Rogers participated in meetings of the newly formed Health Literacy Nebraska to develop a proposal for funding from the Great Plains Public Health Training Institute and to design the organization's web site. The group is also developing a survey and a strategic plan. One of their goals is to organize a health literacy summit in 2013. The organization has become an Affiliate member.

Parish Nurses

As a result of the input from parish nurses attending the Westburg Symposium, the MCR set as an activity the publication of articles responding to identified information needs. We were unable to get the articles published due to new leadership in the international organization and received no response from national organizations. To address this challenge, Ms. Abbey added posts to each organization's Facebook page. The posts notified and linked visitors to the International Parish Nurse Resource Center, the Wyoming Faith Community and Parish Nursing Program, the

Parish Nurse Ministry, and the Evangelical Lutheran Parish Nurse Association Facebook pages, to articles on the results of the questionnaire distributed at the Westburg Symposium and on health information topics they identified. Our reach has been over 500 readers and the International Parish Nurse Association “liked” our article on complementary and alternative medicine.

Health Literacy Advisor Offering

Ms. Hamasu, Ms. Jones, Betsy Kelly, Assessment & Evaluation Coordinator, and Christy Jarvis, Collections Librarian at Eccles Health Sciences Library, formed a committee to offer Health Literacy Advisor to the region. This is a software program that identifies complex language, replaces it with plain language that is grade appropriate for the reader, and supports both English and Spanish language materials. They developed the application form, announced it the region, reviewed the applications, and approved the applications of sixteen members. Members will be sent instructions on downloading the software at the beginning of May.

Ten Network members were certified as exhibitors for the MCR in November. They are eligible to help in the MCR exhibit booth and apply for the Training Health Professionals Stipend.

The RML continued its membership renewal by individually contacting non-responding members. Four of the fifteen affiliate members assigned to Ms. Hamasu renewed. Ms. Jones renewed eight members, including four Full members.

Resource Library Directors Meetings

Resource Library Directors meetings are held bi-monthly. The February Resource Library Directors meeting was held with Ms. Kelly presenting the results of the Resource Library questionnaire that was distributed to the directors and library staff. At the April Resource Library Directors meeting, Ms. Hamasu provided an update on the RML budget and encouraged applications for the Health Literacy Advisor. Karen Cole, Director of the Dykes Library, announced the hiring of the Kansas/Technology Coordinator. Everyone shared the status of their budget from their legislature and their institution. While attending the UK Serials Group meeting, Ms. Shipman learned how much further along the United Kingdom is with institutional repositories and data management because activities are more centrally coordinated.

Utah disaster management organizations planned the Great Utah Shakeout, an earthquake drill for the state. Ms. Hamasu and Mr. Honour took advantage of this drill to plan a drill for the MCR staff. Ms. Hamasu initiated the call to the Missouri/Library Advocacy Coordinator letting her know that an earthquake had occurred affecting the library. The drill lasted an hour and revealed that the evaluation plan required updating due to changes in our communication mechanisms and in personnel.

TECHNOLOGY

Participants of the iTest iPad program received their iPads at the beginning of February. There are forty-eight members who successfully applied for an iPad. Postings on Facebook about receiving the iPad, exploring its capabilities, and

using it reflect the members' excitement. State coordinators and the Technology Coordinator have been called on to assist with using Facebook. The MCR put up a web page of helpful links to anyone getting started with the iPad and looking for useful apps.

Network Infrastructure

Regional Advisory Committee (RAC) activities

RML Coordinators and Ms. Hamasu identified potential board members.

Evidence Based Health:

The RML collaborated with Eccles Health Sciences Library to expand the Priscilla M. Maiden lecture into a day-long event focusing on e-Science. The library broadcast the lecture and the panel discussion following it. The RML sponsored a workshop, "Developing Data Services to Support e-Science/e-Research" taught by Dr. Jian Qin from Syracuse University. On February 29, the RML facilitated an online discussion for participants to react to the presenters and share their thoughts on what they heard and learned.

Assessment and evaluation activities/data:

Ms. Kelly modified the Activity Reporting System (ARS) based on decisions made at the November planning meeting. She completed preparations of the ARS for the 2012-2013 logic model. She migrated the system to the

staff.nlm.gov server and began testing and fixing problems with ARS functions.

Three new NN/LM initiatives were added to the contract that had not been discussed when the MCR held its planning meeting. In April, staff met on Adobe Connect, discussed what we wanted to do in the next year to start implementing these initiatives, and revised the logic model for 2012-2013.

Questionnaires

Ms. Kelly developed and tested the Spring 2012 questionnaire gathering feedback from Network members on our communication tools and on indicators set by the technology, library advocacy, and education projects. Responses were accepted from April 2-19, 2012.

Ms. Hamasu and John Bramble, Technology Coordinator, developed an end of project questionnaire to be sent to the participants of the iTest iPad Project. The questionnaire was reviewed by MCR and OERC staff and tested by Eccles Health Sciences Library faculty. Mr. Bramble prepared the IRB documentation for an exemption.

Ms. Hamasu proposed a feedback questionnaire for NNO staff with Angela Ruffin, Head of NNO.

Ms. Ruffin had consulted with Alex Navas, Contracting Officer and they agreed that the questionnaire would be in conflict with the evaluation process developed by NIH. Ms. Hamasu and Ms. Ruffin agreed that an informal feedback mechanism could be established instead.

The MCR wanted to assess how well we are collaborating with our state libraries. Each coordinator submitted at least one contact for the state library. Kansas was not queried because the state coordinator position had been vacant for most of the year. The contacts were asked to rate how strongly they agreed with the statement that the state coordinator's work with the State Library provided support to libraries and citizens in their state in accessing health information resources. All of the contacts responded that they agreed or strongly agreed with this statement.

Feedback

Mr. Honour found an anomaly in DOCLINE with the matching of LIBIDs and the Institution name in the M/A/N/ Map when the M/A/N/ Map is full. When he reported this bug to NLM, the

DOCLINE team verified that it was truly a bug, thanked him for the documentation and the notification.

Mr. Bramble was asked to review Web-STOC's web migration tool. He provided comments and questions that Web-STOC will be using to improve the tool. He ran usage analysis on the PowerPoint and pdf documents that accompany the MCR's "Spotlight on NLM Resources" recordings. From the data he learned that the documents were not being used and recommended that the MCR stop posting these documents. His recommendation was accepted and a statement was added to the web site indicating that requests for PowerPoints or pdfs be sent to the Education Coordinator.

Ms. Hamasu responded to the question from Barbara Nicholson, Network Librarian, about primary care clinics located in libraries. There are no examples in this region. The closest we have is the AIDS/HIV testing clinics in the Omaha Public Library and the reading room in the South Main Clinic in Utah. Ms. Nicholson was gathering this information for Betsy Humphreys, Deputy Director.
