TRIFINITY

Dr. Richard Bergen, Salina artist, was commissioned by the City of Salina to create a sculpture representing the past, present and future of Salina as a part of the celebration of the BiCentennial. "Trifinity" is located in the park at the Government Center Complex.

Of the sculpture he writes, "I consider time as being infinite and composed of three segments, hence the name "Trifinity." The symbolism of the faces indicates awareness of the past, uncertainty of the present and incognizance of the future. The sturdy contemporary present figure stands tense and alert and bridges the gap between the serene figure of the past and the massive beckoning figure of the future. There is a fluid continuity incorporated throughout the composition to indicate the flow of time and impart a feeling of movement."
