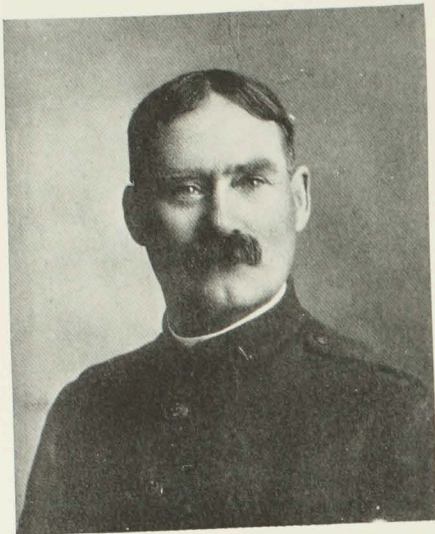


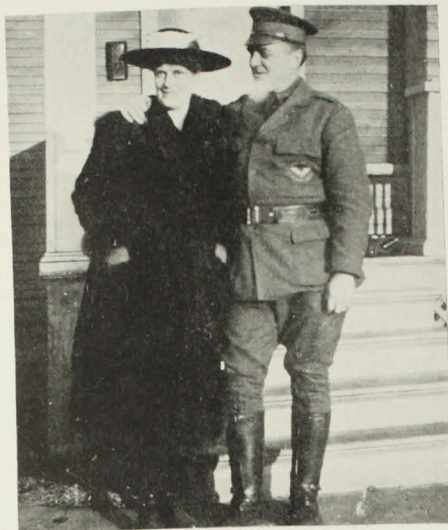

Dr. James Naismith of the department of physical education, who is now in Y. M. C. A. work in France.

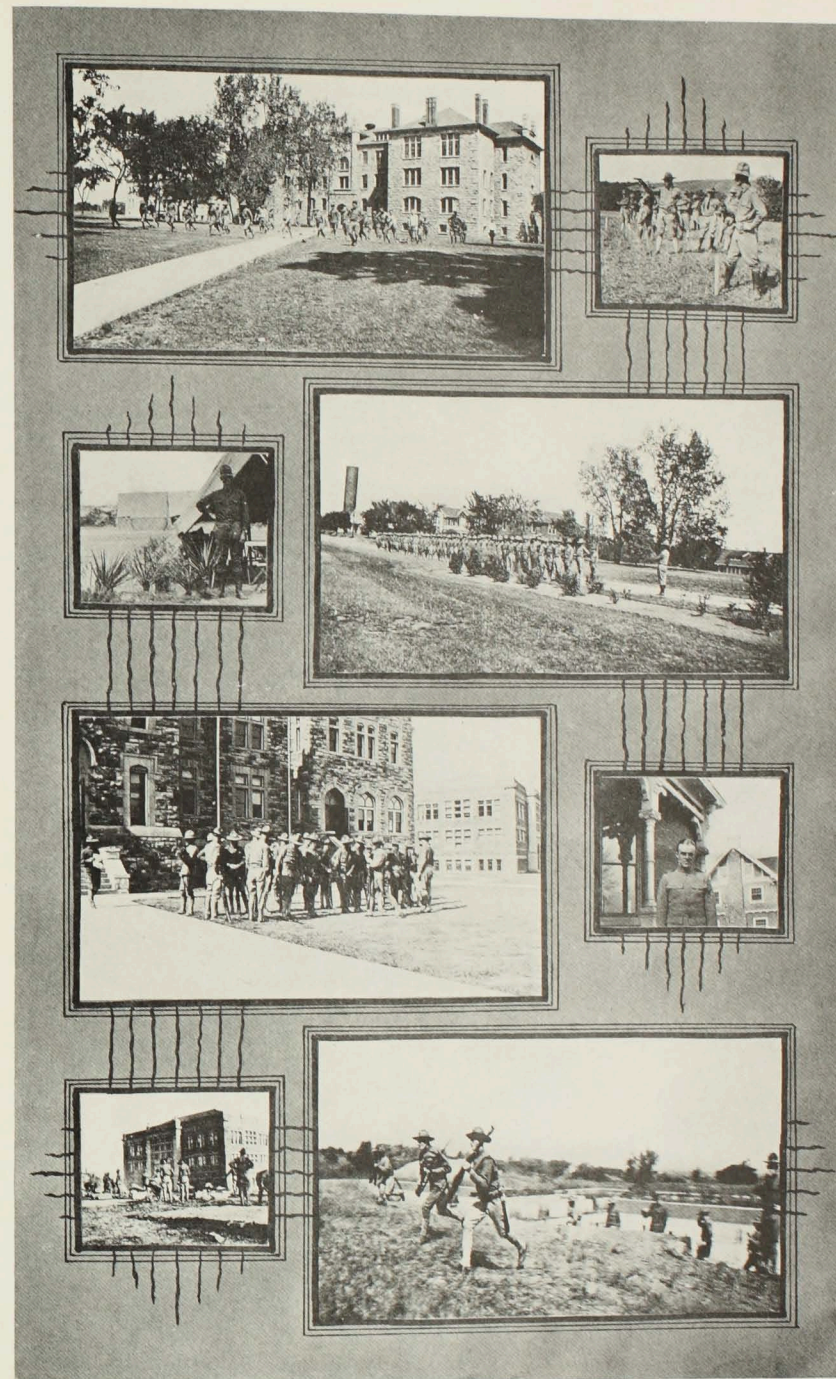


Coach Herman "Beau" Olcott, who left K. U. last fall to take up his new duties as instructor in physical education at the Great Lakes Naval Training Station.

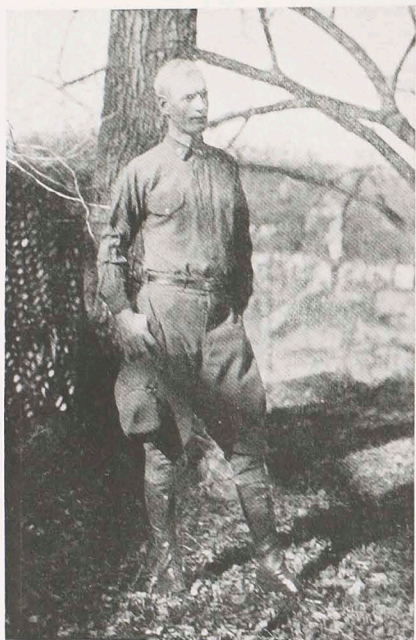

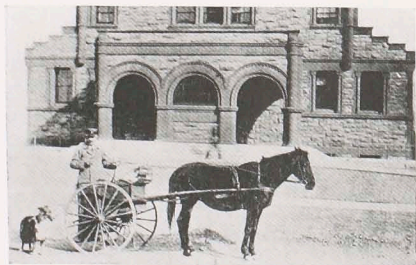

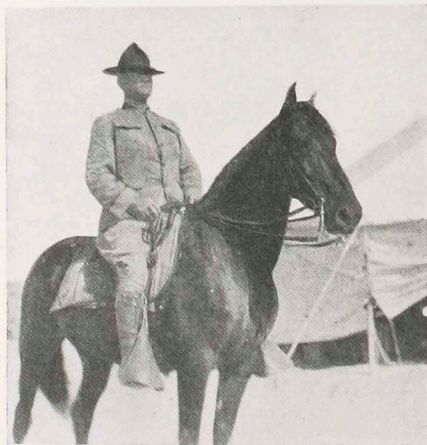
DR. JAMES NAISMITH, now in France, taken the summer of 1916 on the Mexican border.
