g. No responsibility for the views expressed by the authors and reviewers in the *Mid-American Review of Sociology* is assumed by the editors or by the sponsoring institutions.

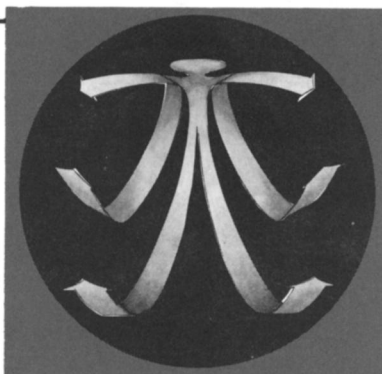
